We are now going into our 7th year of using 4HOnline and the Fair Entry systems. We still have seasoned 4-H families who are not entering their projects in Fair Entry. Fair Entry is for Every 4-H'er planning to exhibit at the fair whether it's building or livestock projects. The fair check-in system would work more smoothly if everyone would do their part. Even though the new online system has presented some challenges, we continue to make great strides in making the 4HOnline Enrollment and Fair Entry process easier.

- May 15th is the deadline to add or drop projects—this is for ALL projects.

- May 17: Fair Entry Opens
- All Projects Non-Animal and Livestock enter in Fair Entry May 17—June 15.
- June 15: Fair Entry Closes
