

POULTRY

This is a State Fair project. Poster Projects will have NO BEST OF SHOW SELECTED. You do not have to qualify at the County Fair to exhibit at the State level (must be enrolled at county level by May 15) State Fair Entry Deadline is July 1.

Poultry will be divided into levels by current grade in school. The level will be determined by the 4-H'ers grade during the current school year (September-August).

NOTE: All poultry must be in member's possession and properly enrolled on the county poultry enrollment form by **May 15**.

POULTRY – Check-in and Judging

Check-in: Saturday, June 17, 4-8 p.m.

Judging: Wednesday, June 21, 9 a.m.

Animals dismissed: Thursday, June 22, after Premier Showmanship

PROJECT REQUIREMENTS:

1. Each year, you are **required to complete YQCA (Youth for the Quality Care of Animals) by June 1**. If not completed by June 1, you will not be eligible to show your animal.
2. Complete the Grant County 4-H Livestock Record Sheet.

The Poultry project has three exhibit options of which you can do one of these options:

1. Live animals
2. An educational poster about Poultry (no Best of Show will be selected). **These posters need to be turned in on Tuesday, June 13, 5-7 p.m. OR Wednesday, June 14, 8 a.m.–4 p.m. (Open judging)**
3. An action demonstration

All posters, notebooks, and display boards must include a reference list including where the information was obtained, giving credit to the original author, to complete the 4-H member's exhibit. This reference list should/might include web site links, people and professionals interviewed, books, magazines, etc. It is recommended this reference list be attached to the back of a poster, display board, be the last page of a notebook, or include as part of the display visible to the public. A judge is not to discredit an exhibit for the manner in which reference are listed.

ALL GRADES: EXHIBIT ONE OR MORE ANIMALS FED AND CARED FOR BY MEMBER SINCE MAY 15 AND SAME CONTINUOUS OWNERSHIP AND CARE UNTIL DATE OF SHOW.

FEEDING AND CARE OF ANIMALS

4-H'ers are responsible for the daily feeding and care of their animals during the 4-H fair week.

LIVE POULTRY EXHIBIT RULES:

1. Poultry exhibitors are required to provide documents that the birds **originate from a National Poultry Improvement Plan (NPIP) official Pullorum-Typhoid Clean flock or have had a negative Pullorum-Typhoid test within ninety (90) days preceding exhibition.**
2. All animals must be in good physical condition before the animal can be unloaded at the fair or be shown, for example, no broken limbs, no serious wounds, no foot rot, sore mouth or ring worm.
3. Poultry will be visually inspected for parasites. If parasites are found, all (or part) of flock will be sent home.

4. All poultry will be judged by American Poultry Association standards of perfection.
5. All exhibited poultry must be of recognized standard breeds.
6. Poultry must be bathed, clean and free of external parasites.
7. No poultry may be exhibited showing signs of infectious or communicable disease.
8. All chickens, turkeys, and game birds must be tested. Waterfowl do not have to be tested.
9. **Refer to the General Livestock Rules and the Rules for 4-H Livestock State Fair Entry.**

SHOW RING DRESS CODE

Every 4-H member must bear in mind the following while showing his/her livestock project through the 4-H program at the Grant County Fair.

- a. Your attire is portraying an image of yourself.
- b. You are representing your club.
- c. You are representing the Grant County 4-H program.

Therefore, you should be as neat and clean as possible. Judges will be directed to consider appropriateness of show ring attire while evaluating placings and showmanship skills. **It is recommended that you wear a shirt with a collar, long pants, or finger tip length shorts while showing. It is suggested that you NOT wear tank tops, T-shirts with writing (other than approved 4-H shirts), midriffs, halter-tops, excessively baggy pants, cut-offs, or baseball caps.**

4-H SHOW

No animals can be loaded until the conclusion of the 4-H Show.

POULTRY CLASSES:

Each bird can only be shown in one class each (example: cannot take a pair of Leghorns, show them in Commercial White Egg Layers and then show them singly in Exhibition Mediterranean).

1. COMMERCIAL:

Description of Birds and Eggs

Pullets – 2 female birds of the same breeding hatched between January 1 and May 1, 2023

Hens – 2 female birds of the same breeding in laying condition hatched before January 1, 2023

Broilers – 2 birds of the same sex, 6-8 weeks of age and 5 1/2 to 10 pounds on show day

Roasters – 2 birds of the same sex, 8-12 weeks of age and 5 1/2 to 10 pound on show day

* Each exhibitor may exhibit one pair of broilers and/or one pair of roasters

Eggs – 6 eggs displayed in a foam carton

*Black sex-link Chickens (also known as Black Stars) and Red sex-link Chickens (also known as Red Stars, Golden comets, and Cinnamon Queen) are only to be shown in pairs in the Commercial Class under Brown Shell Egg Layers and CANNOT BE SHOWN IN ANY OTHER CLASS.

*Male Black sex-link and Male red sex-links will AUTOMATICALLY receive last in your class. They are not used for commercial purposes and CANNOT BE SHOWN IN ANY OTHER CLASS.

A. White Shell Egg Layers

1. 2 Pullets born between Jan. 1, 2023 and May 1, 2023

2. 2 Hens born before Jan. 1, 2023

B. Brown Shell Egg Layers

1. 2 Pullets born between Jan. 1, 2023 and May 1, 2023

2. 2 Hens born before Jan. 1, 2023

C. Broilers

1. 2 birds of the same sex, 6-8 weeks old, not over 5 1/2 lbs on the show day.

D. Roasters

1. 2 birds of the same sex, 8-12 weeks old, 5 1/2 to 10 lbs on the show day.

E. White Shell Chicken Eggs

1. 6 eggs displayed in a foam carton

F. Brown Shell Chicken Eggs

1. 6 eggs displayed in a foam carton

G. All Other Eggs

1. 6 eggs displayed in a foam carton

4. **BARNYARD FOWLIES:**

This is a new class in which an exhibitor can show a limit of two (2) **MIXED BREED CHICKENS**.

RULES FOR BARNYARD FOWLIES

There will be a limit of two (2) **MIXED BREED CHICKENS PER EXHIBITOR**. (No ducks, geese, turkeys, doves, pigeons, etc.) Only **MIXED BREED** Chickens will be shown in this class that cannot be shown in any other class. All chickens shown in this class **MUST HAVE THEIR HEALTH PAPERS OR THEY WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO SHOW**. This will be **JUDGES CHOICE** (they will choose which he likes). Barnyard Fowlies Class only- No trophies will be given out, only rosettes for champion/reserve and ribbons 1-8. Not eligible for Grand Champion of the show.

5. **EXHIBITION DUCK:**

- A. Heavyweights (Pekin, Muscovy, Aylesbury, Rouen, etc.)
- B. Mediumweights (Crested, Buff, Cayuga, Swedish, etc.)
- C. Lightweight (Runner, Campbell, Magpie, etc.)
- D. Bantam (White Call, Gary Call Mallard, East India, etc.)

One young female born after January 1, 2023, one young male born after January 1, 2023, one adult female born before January 1, 2023, and one adult male born before January 1, 2023 can be exhibited for any breed in the above classes.

6. **EXHIBITION GEESE:**

- A. Heavyweights (Toulouse, Embden, African, etc.)
- B. Mediumweights (Sebastapol, Pilgrim, Buff, Pomeranian, etc.)
- C. Lightweights (China, Tufted Roman, Canada, Egyptian, etc.)

One young female born after January 1, 2023, one young male born after January 1, 2023, one adult female born before January 1, 2023, and one adult male born before January 1, 2023 can be exhibited for any breed in the above classes.

7. **TURKEY:**

- A. 2 young birds born after January 1, 2023
- B. 1 adult male born before January 1, 2023
- C. 1 adult female born before January 1, 2023

8. **PIGEON, DOVES AND EXOTIC BIRDS:**

- A. All show together

One young female born after January 1, 2023 male born after January 1, 2023, one adult female born before January 1, 2023, and one adult male born before January 1, 2023 can be exhibited in the above class.

SHOWMANSHIP CLASSES:

4-H'ers will demonstrate their ability to present birds that are clean and healthy, trained and manageable, along with the competitively demonstrate one's knowledge and skill in raising, condition, evaluating and handling poultry.

Class 1 - Senior Showmanship - Grades 9, 10, 11 and 12, during the current school year.
(September - August)

Class 2 - Intermediate Showmanship - Grades 6, 7, and 8 during the current school year.
(September - August)

Class 3 - Junior Showmanship - Grades 3, 4 and 5 during the current school year.
(September - August)

*Winners of Showmanship classes may compete the next year after winning.

AUCTION RULES:

***The 4-H Member must exhibit during the Poultry Show in order to be eligible to sell in the livestock auction.**

4-H animals purchased, sold, or offered for sale after the enrollment deadline and prior to the Indiana State Fair (including animals that have gone through a "Premium only Auction"), shall not be eligible to show in the 4-H Show at the Indiana State Fair.

Each 4-Her is allowed to sell one bird (or pair if exhibited as a pair) in the auction.

A 6% commission of the overage pay per animal sold will be collected by the Auction Committee.

You have until **May 15** to add or drop this project from your current year's enrollment.
