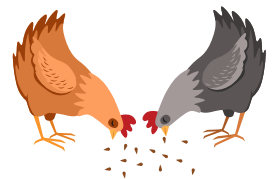
Poultry Blood Testing

All poultry under one year of age must be tested if they did not originate from a National Poultry Improvement Plan (NPIP) Pullorum-Typhoid Certified clean flock per requirements set by the Board of Animal Health.

Mini Horses & Ponies must have the following forms completed and signed to participate in the Horse & Pony Project

(Mini 4-H Members animals included)-

- Vaccination Form (Indiana law requires that rabies vaccinations be administered by a licensed and accredited veterinarian) Negative Coggins for out-of-state horses and in-state horses
- Within 12 months of the date of exhibition,
- Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection for **out-of-state** horses and
- Mini/Exploring 4-H Liability Release Form (Mini Horse & Pony).

These forms must be carried by member to every practice, event, and/or show except Mini/Exploring 4-H Liability Release Form (Mini Horse & Pony) which is held by the H&P Superintendent.

Also, Mini Horses & Ponies members must have the following items enter for each animal enrolled in 4-H Online:

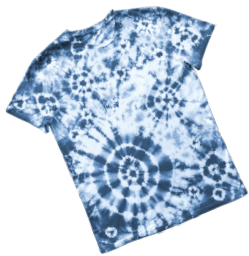
4-H & FFA State Horse Judging

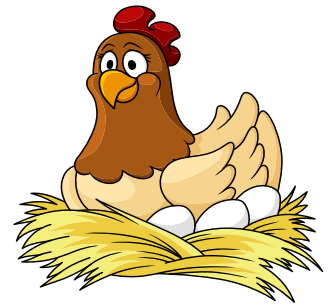

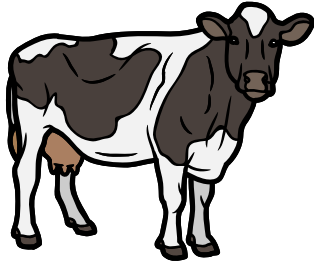

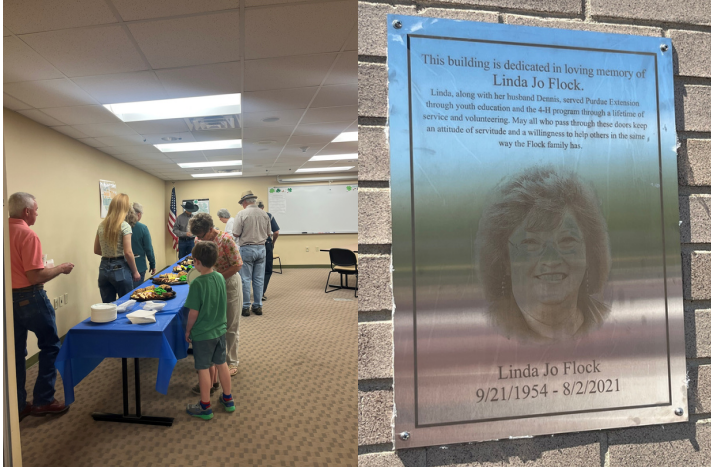
AWARDS & RECOGNITION

Vet Camp

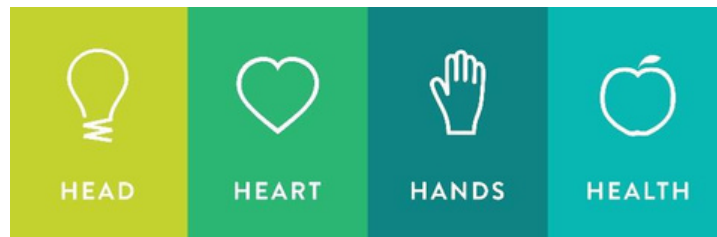
Pottery Workshop
