

Animal ID Enrollment Deadline- May 16th



Reminder to all 4-H Members that all Beef, Dairy, Goat, Horses, Sheep and Swine must be registered by May 16, 2022 on 4-H Online to be eligible to show at the Jefferson County 4-H Fair and the Indiana State Fair.

All animals you plan to show must be registered regardless if they came to tagging or not. If you did not register your animals at tagging do not forget this important step.


Access 4-H Online by May 16th at v2.4honline.com

Please note the deadline falls on May 15th every year. This year May 15th is a Sunday so 4-H online will be open till the 16th. Please contact the office if you do not have access to a computer or need assistance entering your information.

4-H Online Animal Enrollment Instructions

- 1. Login to your family profile at: https://v2.4honline.com using your family email address and password associated with your 4-H enrollment record.
 - a. If you have forgotten your password, please use the 'Reset password' option on the 4-H Online login page, and you will be sent a new temporary password. If you have forgotten your family email address or turned in a paper 4-H enrollment form, please contact your local Purdue Extension Office for assistance.
- 2. Click View next to the Member's record for whom you would like to add an animal
- 3. Click Animals in the navigation pane.
- 4. Click the blue Add an Animal button.
- 5. Click on Add New Animal to start adding a new animal.
- 6. Select the appropriate animal type from the drop-down menu.
- 7. Enter the required Tag, Tattoo, or Animal Name as directed
- 9. Read the on-screen instructions for Animal ID requirements for County Fair and Indiana State Fair Exhibition.

- 10. Click on the button "Show Questions" after reading the instructions
- 11. Required fields are indicated, but be sure to complete all other visible fields as applicable.
- 12. Click next once completed.
- 13. Upload any files if required or necessary for the particular Animal type.
- 14. Click next once completed.
- 15. Review the entered information. Use the Back button at the bottom of the page to return to the previous screen to make corrections if needed.
- 16. Once the entered information is correct and reviewed, click the Submit button.
- 17. The animal information will display on the screen with the status, created, modified, and submitted date and time stamp (local time). You will also receive a confirmation email upon submission.
- 18. To add more animals for the same member repeat steps 3-17. To add animals for another member return to the Member List and View another member.



Note Members are able to edit Animal ID information until the species specific Animal ID deadline of May 15th. Click on the Animals tab from your account at any time to view the status for all of the animals for a member in the family





YQCA Updates



YQCA is a required training for all Indiana 4-H members who exhibit Dairy, Beef, Goat, Poultry, Rabbit, Sheep and Swine. This certification is required for the Jefferson County 4-H Fair and Indiana State Fair.

Last month YQCA transitioned to a new website: yqcaprogram.org.

This website is no longer linked to 4-H Online and will require members to make a new account. The website is set up to allow a parent to enroll multiple children in a family much like 4-H Online.


Registration is required for attendance at in-person YQCA programs.

If you attended the March 22, 2022 Training at the Jefferson County Community Building you are required to register on yqcaprogram.org. Once there sign up for the May 17, 2022 training which is labeled "Completed Members Only." Sign up for this course and pay with the coupon code emailed and mailed to you by the extension office. DO NOT PAY twice.

If you have not gotten your YQCA certification yet there are more in-person trainings listed below. You must register for these trainings using the yqcaprogram.org. If you do not wish to attend an in-person training at the community building you can once again complete the online version for \$12 on the yqcaprogram.org website. In-person YQCA trainings are \$3. Please email a copy of your certificate to copelanb@purdue.edu if you complete YQCA online because it is no longer linked with 4-H Online.

Understanding Adolescent Tobacco Use:


Did you know that smoking is the number one preventable cause of death in the United States?

Every year, smoking kills roughly 480,000 people (American Lung Association, 2022).

So what can we do?

On average, most tobacco users started using tobacco products during adolescence. About 9 out of 10 adults who smoke cigarettes daily first began smoking by age 18 (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, 2022).
