- Needle Craft (knitting, embroidery, crocheting, needlepoint, etc.)
- **Gift Wrapping** (gift wrapped box, decorative gift bag, etc.)

- 1 Flowering Plant in a Pot (exhibit a potted plant and attach a label telling what kind of plant is in the pot.)

All Mini 4-H projects will be entered the Thursday before the start of fair at the Jefferson County 4-H Fairgrounds. Each project should have an attached name tag. After the project has been entered, it will be displayed in a special Mini 4-H section of the Exhibit Hall.

Youth may exhibit a foods project of their choosing. All Mini 4-H Foods projects should be exhibited on a paper plate and covered with plastic wrap. **Examples of Mini 4-H Foods projects include but are not limited to;**

- **Peanut Butter Sandwich** (ex. make a peanut butter sandwich on a paper plate)
- Trail Mix- (ex. make a trail mix snack displayed in a plastic bag)
- 3 No-bake Cookies (ex. make no-bake cookies and display 3 on a plate)
- **3 Marshmallow Treat Squares** (ex. make marshmallow treat squares and display 3 squares on a plate)
- Foods Poster or Notebook (ex. create a poster or notebook with pictures of you preparing food, a description of how to follow a recipe, etc.)

Scholarship Opportunities

4-H Development & Scholarship Fund



FairEntry Exhibit Tag


• The Purdue Extension Office Staff will print a FairEntry Exhibit Tag for each exhibit prior to the county fair. These tags should be picked up by the 4-H member or their family at the Extension Office prior to Project Check-In. Please display the FairEntry Exhibit Tag in the right-hand corner of the front of the poster as shown on the 4-H Poster Example above. This tag should be taped to the **outside of the plastic**. Do **NOT** tape the FairEntry Exhibit Tag to the poster board.

Reference List

- All posters, notebooks, and display boards must include a reference list indicating where information was obtained, giving credit to the original author, to complete the 4-H member's exhibit. This reference list should/might include web site links, people and professional interviews, books, magazines, etc. It is recommended this reference list be attached to the back of a poster or display board, be the last page of a notebook, or included as part of the display visible to the public. A judge is not to discredit an exhibit for the way references are listed.
