

4-H Online Enrollment

Enrollment opened up for the 22-23 4-H year on October 1st 2022. If you are a returning 4-H member or volunteer please log in to your profile at<u>v2.4honline.com</u> and re-enroll for the current year. As of January 15th if you are not enrolled and paid or at least awaiting review you will no longer get communication from our office. Please make sure you are fully paid and approved before May 15th! If you are in "incomplete" status then you have not finished your enrollment and need to fully submit to be approved.

All Adult who are participating or volunteering in 4–H activities, this includes being on a committee, trainer or workshop leader MUST complete the application process and BE in approved status in 4HOnline prior to having interaction with youth. If you have any questions abut your status, do not hesitate to call the Extension Office at 574–935-8545.

If you know of anyone that you think would like to join 4-H please encourage them to join in on the fun. They can contact the office by calling 574-935-8545 or Emailing Lindsay at Istaples@purdue.edu. There are quite a few volunteer enrollments that have only been submitted. This means that not all of the trainings have not been completed. Please take a moment and check your status and if you have by your name, click back into your trainings and make sure that all four have been completed. The state office is reporting that many are not closing out of the training sessions correctly and the trainings are failing to register as complete. You cannot use the X in the upper right corner to close out of the trainings. Please use the arrows on the training slides to complete. You will not be approved until the system is showing that you completed all 4 modules.

Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care or YQCA Requirements

Who has to participate in the Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care program or the YQCA program?

• All 4-H members who are enrolled in the following projects have to complete the program in order to show at the Marshall County Fair and or the Indiana State Fair: Beef, Dairy, Dairy Feeder, Goats, Lambs, Poultry, Rabbits, and Swine.

When does the Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care program or the YQCA program need to be completed by?

- 4-H members in Marshall County need to complete the training by July 1st, 2023. If it is not completed by this date, you will not be able to show at the Marshall County Fair.
- If you are completing YQCA, your certificate must be emailed to Lindsay Schrader Istaples@purdue.edu, or dropped off in the Extension Office by July 1st, 2023.

How do I complete the Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care program and what does it cost?

- 1. You will register through 4HOnline in the events section. More details to come.
- 2. Arrive early and bring your payment for the class when you come that night. a. The cost is \$3.00 per person. This is the same amount as YQCA classes. b.We can take cash or checks made out to "Purdue University". We do not have a credit card option for the Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care program.
- 3. Once you have signed up, actively participated in a class and paid you will be marked complete in the 4-H Online system.

I can't come to an in-person class so I need to take YQCA online, what do I do?

- Registration for online training will need to be completed at <u>http://yqcaprogram.org</u>
- Once you have completed the training you will need to download the certificate or take a photo of the certificate and turn it into the Extension Office. You can do this via email or by dropping it off at the Extension Office.
- If you have questions about the YQCA system you will need to direct them to YQCA. Our staff is no longer teaching those classes or certified by them.
- We will still accept YQCA as completion for the Quality Assurance requirement, however you will need to provide the proof to us as we can no longer get reports from them. If you have tested out, those are good until it expires.

INDIANA 4-H QUALITY LIVESTOCK CARE

To exhibit **BEEF CATTLE, DAIRY CATTLE, SWINE, SHEEP, MEAT GOATS, DAIRY GOATS, POULTRY,** and **RABBITS**, 4-H members must be certified through the Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care training **OR** the online Youth for the Quality Care of Animals program (YQCA).

1. This certification must be done an annual basis

2. Members must be registered **BEFORE** attending a training

3. Members may attend any training dates listed on this flyer

OR a training in another county (if doing this you MUST email lstaples@purdue.edu your certificate)
