Stalls in the Barn

Stalls/pens assignments will be posted in the barns by Wednesday, July 12. You can bring in fair supplies and set up your pens before Friday. This will make unloading go faster

Unloading on Friday (July 14)

Livestock should enter the fairgrounds via the drives off of county road 200 South. Trailers loaded with swine should use the west drive and trailers with all other livestock should use the next (middle) drive. Animals coming across state lines will need health papers. Rabbits, Poultry and Horses can go directly to the barns and do not need vet checked. All other animals must be visually inspected by the veterinarian before unloading. See Map on page 2

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

LIVESTOCK AND HORSE/PONY **MUST ARRIVE** ON FRIDAY (**JULY 14**) FROM 5:00-9:00PM



All Trailers Enter Fairgrounds via 200 South from Hwy 27 (Just like in the past) except pull down to lane 6.

You will travel north on lane 6 and turn around on lane 5 (Swine) OR lane 4 (Cattle/Sheep/Goats).

Truck and trailers will wait in line on 4H grounds. You will then be directed to lane 1 or lane 2 for vet check. Then unload like in past years.

NO LIVESTOCK WILL BE ALLOWED TO UNLOAD UNTIL AFTER VET INSPECTION

WEIGHING & CHECK-IN PROCEDURES

All livestock exhibitors should pick up their weigh-in/entry slips at the time of entry or prior to animal weighing. Slips will be available in the livestock barns and the Extension Office. Please complete all the information on the left hand side of the slip before you weigh or enter your livestock. You will use the slips when you check in your rabbits, poultry, and dairy cattle. These slips will also be used during weigh-in of swine, sheep, beef, dairy beef, and goat.

WEIGH-IN TIMES (ANIMALS MUST ARRIVE ON FRIDAY NIGHT)

- Swine will be weighed as they are unloaded on Friday.
- Beef & Dairy Steers will be weighed from 6-9 PM on Friday.
- Sheep will be weighed at 8AM on Saturday
- ALL Goats will be weighed immediately following Sheep on Saturday

LIVESTOCK AUCTION INFO

- Rabbits, poultry, dairy (milk) will be registered for the sale and appraisal at exhibit check-in.
- Swine, beef, dairy beef, sheep and goats will be registered for sale and appraisal at weigh-in.
- A \$10 fee for each animal entered for sale and appraisal must be paid when animals are registered.
- Each 4-H member may sell one (1) animal unit through the sale. Entry slips/weigh-in slips will also be used by the sale committee to complete the registration process. This is the entry slip that you use at check-in and weigh-in.
- Minimum weights will still be enforced to sell
- If you sign your animal up for the Auction, that animal will become ineligible for the Indiana State Fair.
- Only animals in a market class will be able to enter the Auction.
- Animals entered in the Auction can go home with you and are not required to go on an appraisal truck.

The Annual 4-H Livestock Auction takes place on Friday, July 21 at 1:00 PM. Each year the sale committee works hard to get the most possible money for the livestock projects in this sale. However, as a 4-H'er and a 4-H family, part of the completion of your livestock project is the marketing of your animal to achieve the most profit possible. Should you have businesses or individuals that are interested in contributing to the purchase price of your animal, they can contact the 4-H Livestock Sale Committee and let us know the amount that they would like to contribute toward particular 4-H'ers and their livestock project. We are available at any time and will have office hours (in the Conference Room) during the 4-H Fair. If there are businesses that you think we should send a letter to, let the Extension Office know and we will check our database.

Indiana State Fair



This year's State Fair will take place July 28– Sunday, August 20. To enter into the Indiana State Fair, please go to https://exhibitorscorner.indianastatefair.com/ and enter online. An exhibitor will not be considered entered into the Indiana State Fair until payment is made in full. Payment can be made online with a valid credit card. Entries will not be accepted over the phone. An Unloading/Load Out permit, and 6 admission tickets will be included with the department fee. Purchasing of Parking Passes are optional and are sold separately through Exhibitor's Corner.

Entry Deadlines and Fees - Enter before July 1st for the best deal.

Pick Up Project Materials

If you have enrolled in 4-H and have not received your project manuals and record sheets, please stop by the Extension Office. These items are necessary for you as you work on completing your 4-H projects. In order to be listed as having completed a project, you <u>MUST</u> turn in a completed record sheet at the 4-H Fair. Also, every family should receive a fairbook. This contains important rules and guidelines for each project, as well as the fair schedule. Pick yours up today!

Kits and items for some 4-H projects are available for purchase at the Extension Office. Poster boards are \$4.00 and plastic poster sleeves are \$1 each.

4-H POSTER GUIDELINE AND HELPFUL TIPS

All posters, notebooks, and display boards must include a reference list indicating where information was obtained, giving credit to the original author, to complete the 4-H member's exhibit. This reference list should/might include web site links, people and professionals interviewed, books, magazines, etc. It is recommended this reference list be attached to the back of a poster or display board, be the last page of a notebook, or included as part of the display visible to the public. A judge is not to discredit an exhibit for the manner in which references are listed.

Steps to follow when making a poster:

- 1. Read your project manual.
- 2. Read your county project requirements.
- 3. Decide on information to include on the poster.
- 4. Sketch out your idea.
- 5. Collect supplies.
- 6. Mark guidelines for lettering and pictures (lightly).
- 7. Layout letters, pictures, etc. on the poster.
- 8. Glue items down.
- 9. Clean up the poster so it is neat. Erase any guidelines that are showing. Remove excess glue.
- 10. Label size should be 2x4".
- 11. Glue poster to backing.
- 12. Cover poster with plastic.
- 13. Take your poster to the fair on the right day and time.





WHAT'S WRONG WITH MY PLANT?



This time of year I get a lot of questions from stakeholders who want to know, "what is wrong with my plant?" Most of the questions are about trees and tomatoes. To me these questions are as interesting as they are challenging. Trees and tomatoes are two of the hardest plants in which to determine what is wrong. Trees are challenging because many times the trees show the signs of problems long after the event that caused the issue. Tomatoes are challenging because they are so sensitive.

When I first became an extension educator a more seasoned educator told me when asked, "what is wrong with my plant" to answer with anthracnose and that I would be right 75 - 80% of the time. He was correct!! In all honesty, I will only give an answer if I am sure. Many times we send samples to Purdue for an official diagnosis.

What is anthracnose? The name of several common fungal diseases that affects the foliage of plants. The list of fungi that are cause anthracnose is extensive. Symptoms of anthracnose vary from plant to plant. Generally, the leaves are affected by irregular spots. The affected tissue turns tan to brown. Affected leaves will develop symptoms at the tip of the leaves, often curl and may fall off. In some plant species the twigs/stems become infected and cause more plant dieback. Some plant fruits are also affected. To my surprise anthracnose that affects one type of plant may not be the same as the anthracnose that affects another plant.

In vegetables such as pepper, beans, tomato, eggplant, cucumber, muskmelon, watermelon, pumpkin, spinach and pea anthracnose often shows itself as sunken, dark spots on the fruit as well as the leaf symptoms described above.

Anthracnose is difficult to eliminate because spores can live in the soil three to nine months, even if the infected plant has been removed. Spores travel and spread through the movement of water above and below ground. It can also be spread by garden tools, wet hands, pruners and clothing.

The methods of controlling anthracnose is as varied as the fungi that are the culprits. Cool and moist weather conditions are favorable for the development of the disease. So since the weather is beyond our control here are a few other suggestions. Remember the list of options is LONG! The first form of defense it to clean up any contaminated debris. Anthracnose can survive in leaf litter. That's why it is important to clean up dead leaves and debris from infected plants at the end of the season. Anthracnose can over winter in this debris. There are some resistant varieties of plants to choose from. Do NOT save seed from infected plants. Do not compost infected leaves, fruit or stems. Thoroughly clean up garden/under trees where debris may accumulate. Using a broad spectrum fungicide can help as long as label directions are closely followed. Liquid copper sprays and sulfur powders can be applied weekly, starting when foliage begins to develop in early spring and continue through the growing season. Neem oil is another option, however applications are frequent. In gardens crops, rotating plantings by using plant that are non-host crops is important to bringing this disease under control. The good news is that in tree species this disease it commonly cosmetic. Practicing the suggested control methods should reduce the chance of this disease.

When in doubt you may send a plant and soil sample to the Plant Disease Diagnostic Lab at Purdue. For \$11.00 and the cost of shipping you will receive a specific answer with specific control suggestions.


