We have created social media accounts so we are more connected with families and community members. Be sure to like/follow us digitally on these accounts.



2022 Indiana 4-H Animal Identification

The following table lists the different animal species and the respective form of identification that is required for a 4-H member to be eligible to show in the 4-H livestock shows at the 2022 Indiana State Fair. The animal ID information must be entered in the Indiana 4-H Online enrollment system by the respective deadlines. Missing, incomplete or incorrect animal ID information could result in state fair ineligibility for that particular animal.

Important Livestock Dates!

• Sheep and Goat weigh-in: Weigh-in will be on Saturday, May 7 from 8-11am in the Goat Barn. More information will be mailed out. All sheep and goats (except Registered Boer Goat Does) will be ear tagged and weighed on this day. This is a requirement to be eligible to show at the 2022 Randolph County 4-H Fair and the 2022 Indiana State Fair. Trailers must enter the south drive for weigh-in. Animals must be entered in v2.4honline.com by May 15th. Don't forget that if you are planning on showing your sheep or goat at the Indiana State Fair that DNA hair samples must be turned into the office by May 15th.



A couple very important Animal Notes

- Beef, Dairy Steers, Market Heifers, Non-registered Heifers (commercial), Breeding Heifers, Registered Heifers, Beef Feeder Calves, Dairy Feeder Calves must be enter into v2.4honline.com by May 15th.
- All Goats and Sheep must be entered into v2.4honline.com by May 15th
- Swine must be entered into v2.4honline.com by May 15th.
- Horse must be entered and add color pictures to v2.4honline.com by May 15th.
- Enrollment of animals into v2.4honline allows the animal to be identified as an
 official 4-H animal that can be exhibited at our county fair and the Indiana State
 Fair. Animal enrollment is done through the same log-in you used to enroll yourself
 into 4-H.
- If you have <u>NOT</u> paid your 4-H enrollment fee you will <u>NOT</u> be able to add or enter your animals into 4HOnline until payment is collected.
- Rabbits- must complete the Rabbit Enrollment form and have it turned into the Extension Office by <u>May 15th.</u> Forms will be mailed out soon.
- Poultry Must complete the poultry enrollment form and have it turned into the Extension Office by <u>June 1st.</u>

RANDOLPH RIDERS HORSE & PONY



Entrance doors


All donors will have their name or business name on a donor board inside the horse barn. An outdoor donor board will be displayed on the outside of barn during fair week. Donor announcements will be made at club
