or make decisions on behalf of 4-H, you really need to be an approved 4-H volunteer! Contests on Campus

4-H is offering two new opportunities for youth interested in consumerism and the kitchen.

Grades 9-12: During the Consumer Decision Making Contest, youth will judge four classes of products (backpacks, fast food, sunglasses, and online subscriptions) and rank the items in the class 1-4. They will then give reasons on two of those classes to articulate why they chose one backpack over another, for example. This contest not only exposes youth to smart shopping, but it also works to improve their communication skills as they embrace the courage to share their thoughts.

Grades 6-8: In it's initial pilot phase, Indiana 4-H is also hosting a Kitchen Skill-a-thon contest for youth in grades 6-8. The contest will consist of four identification stations including small appliances, kitchen equipment/tools, herbs/spices, and kitchen hazards/safety; a written test and a skills demonstration. For the Skills Demonstration, participants can practice, and receive feedback from a judge, on an assigned kitchen/cooking type skill (measuring dry/wet ingredients, knife selection, table setting, etc.). All materials will be provided.

Both contests will take place on October 28th at Purdue University. If you know an interested young person, or if you want to help "coach" a team through some smart shopping, please reach out to Tami at mosier@purdue.edu or 260-668-1000 Ext. 1400. No Changes to Animal ID

Indiana 4-H announced in mid-September that there would be no changes to animal ID in 2024. So, plan on the same tags, tattoos, registrations papers, etc, in the coming year. As ID days become available, we will share those dates, but as a rule of thumb, plan on the following:

- Fat Cattle in March
- Small Calves in April
- Sheep & Goats in early May
- Self-tagging for Swine
- Supers/Volunteers to help tattoo Rabbits, as needed





Help Needed!

While many volunteers stay with us for years, when a volunteer signs on, they are only making a one year commitment that can be renewed or declined each year. Some volunteers don't even volunteer for a year...they volunteer in an "episodic" role where they help with a one-time project or a few weeks max. The volunteer year aligns with the youth program year, so each fall/winter, we ask volunteers to re-enroll in 4-H. If you haven't given 4-H volunteerism a try, consider these opportunities below. If after a year (or your episodic experience), you decide the role isn't for you, that's okay!

Youth in grades 10, 11 or 12 can apply to be part of the Indiana delegation for National 4-H Conference hosted in Washington, D.C, April 19-24, 2024. National 4-H Conference is the annual premier national civic engagement opportunity for 4-H members across the country. Delegates will not only learn while at the conference, but will have the opportunity to practice and apply in a real world setting their newly developed and refined skills. Delegates choose an important societal topic and in round table groups prepare a briefing. During the conference, groups present their briefing to federal officials. Applications are due December 1 and must be uploaded through 4HOnline. Members must be in active status to submit their application. 
