Changes for 2024

We'll try to share the 2024 changes frequently and in different formats. We don't love change, but sometimes change is necessary and sensible. Here are a few bigger changes for 2024:

- No veterinary services will be provided at ID days. It is extremely important that you create a Veterinary-Client-Patient Relationship with the vet of your choice for proper animal care. Don't wait to make the call to a local vet! All veterinary services must be completed by ID day!
- All small calves, now collectively called Feeder Calves (600 lbs. or less on June 21), will show the morning of Monday, June 24 (in the historical Started Calf time slot).
- Meat Goats and Pygmy Goats are going to show the evening of Monday, June 24 in tandem with the Sheep Show. We don't know if Sheep or Meat/Pygmy Goats will go first yet, but they will be on the same day with the same judge.
- Youth will only sell one animal through the 4-H Auction OR they may participate in "Back a 4-Her" which encompasses all static (non-living, non-moving projects).
- Market/Consignment trucks will likely not be available for animals. Rather, please plan to take all animals back home after the fair. Tami 🚜
















Indiana 4-H STEM Showcase

State Drone Competition - May 4th

Are you interested in technology and learning to fly drones? There will be an Indiana 4-H drone competition on May 4th for grades 6-12, with an obstacle course, rules and regulations, and drone programming. Tami would love to take a team and has drones you can practice with!



Contests on Campus

4-H is offering two opportunities for youth interested in consumerism and the kitchen (postponed from the fall).

Grades 9-12: During the Consumer Decision Making Contest, youth will judge four classes of products (backpacks, fast food, sunglasses, and online subscriptions) and rank the items in the class 1-4. They will then give reasons on two of those classes to articulate why they chose one backpack over another, for example. This contest not only exposes youth to smart shopping, but it also works to improve their communication skills as they embrace the courage to share their thoughts.

Grades 6-8: In it's initial pilot phase, Indiana 4-H is also hosting a Kitchen Skill-a-thon contest for youth in grades 6-8. The contest will consist of four identification stations including small appliances, kitchen equipment/tools, herbs/spices, and kitchen hazards/safety; a written test and a skills demonstration. For the Skills Demonstration, participants can practice, and receive feedback from a judge, on an assigned kitchen/cooking type skill (measuring dry/wet ingredients, knife selection, table setting, etc.). All materials will be provided.

Both contests will take place on April 6th at Purdue University. Premium Auction & Market Trucks

To provide a little context, we moved to a premium only auction and are forgoing market trucks based on the data and the idea that animals in the auction aren't REALLY being sold as in a normal auction (by the pound and for a realistic market price). In reality, the 4-H auction is inflated because buyers, in general, aren't interested in your animal. They're interested in supporting your future! Our auction has sort of been running as a premium auction already, other than a few sales in which the buyer wants to host a hog roast or purchase a calf for next year's Dairy Beef project. That's why we're moving to a singular animal auction as well. In 2024, the 4-H Auction Committee, the 4-H Fair Board, nor the Extension Office will be handling market/consignment checks for animals. There will be no Beef/Dairy Beef truck nor Small Calf Consignment. Stay tuned for Goats and Swine. Fewer and fewer animals are being sent on the market truck (block sale, as it is called in FairEntry), so the decision was rooted in the numbers. In a quick summary from 2023...

- 120 lots ended up as Keep by Exhibitor (going home with kids)
- United Producers (the market truck) only claimed 23 animals (1 big steer, 20 hogs, and 2 lambs)
- 33 calves went to local farmers



Premise ID

New to 4-H? If so, you may need a premise ID. All properties that house certain livestock species are required by state law to have a premise ID. Premise IDs are confidential and no one can look them up. They are a seven digit, alpha-numeric ID and usually begin with 00. If you have one and lost it, email animalid@boah.in.gov. Members with cattle, swine, sheep, and goats must have a premise ID. It is now strongly recommended by BOAH that those with equine and poultry also get a premise ID. Exhibitors with equine and poultry at the Indiana State Fair may be asked to present a premise ID.

- This number is assigned to a farm location almost like an address. If your farm does not have one, please call the Indiana Board of Animal Health at 317-544-2381 or visit www.in.gov/boah
- If you house your animals at another location, check with the property owner for the premise ID.
- Premise ID's are needed for cattle, swine, sheep, and goat animal identification in 4HOnline.



Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care Program, Required for Many

Those exhibiting cattle, goats, poultry, rabbits, sheep, and swine must complete an annual animal care certification. In-person Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care sessions cost \$3 per person. Online national Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) certificates (\$12) will also be accepted. Please send Tami a copy of your online certificate upon completion. Youth are welcome to attend one of the courses below OR you may complete YQCA online. Both will be honored and accepted at the Steuben County 4-H Fair as well as the Indiana State Fair. RSVP for in-person Steuben County certifications at https://2024SteubenQLC.4honline.com. If you are unable to take the certification course in Steuben County and do not wish to take the YQCA training online, you may attend in any county. Classes in other counties (LaGrange and DeKalb...2/10, 3/25, 4/20, 5/4) can be viewed in the Events tab in 4HOnline as they become available.



- **ALERT!**: Equine Herpes (type 1) has been detected in animals in western LaGrange county. The following link has a brief summary of the issue: https://www.aphis.usda.gov/animal_health/downloa ds/animal_diseases/ehv-ehm-finalrecommendations.pdf. Clinical signs may be nonspecific and some horses may be non-clinical: fever, difficulty urinating, nasal discharge and cough, depression, head tilt, loss of tail tone, stumbling or weakness in the hind limbs which may progress to all limbs, and down and unable to rise. Equine herpes virus (EHV-1 and EHV-4) is spread via nose to nose contact, contaminated equipment, and respiratory secretions within stalls/stables. If you suspect an issue: 1. isolate the animals; 2. contact your veterinarian; 3. Clean and disinfect all water/feed buckets, mucking equipment, tack and any other equipment that may have come into close contact with the affected horse; 4. Adhere to a minimum 30 day quarantine/isolation period for new horses.







Records Sheets and Add/Drop: May 31 or June 4???

Many 4-H program "due dates" used to be determined at a local level by the local 4-H Council or 4-H Fair Board. The Indiana 4-H Program is working towards a more consistent calendar, and as a result there are two dates that may not make a lot of sense on the surface, so let me explain...

- May 31, 2024—This is a locally set "collection" date, of sorts, in which all 4-H record sheets, ten year member bios, Achievement Winner apps, and other "paperwork" are collected at the Steuben County Extension Office. We really want everything collected no later than May 31, if at all possible, to that we can prep everything in time for the fair!
- June 4, 2024—Indiana 4-H says our FairEntry due date must be no less than one week and no more than three weeks before the first 4-H project check-in date. June 4 is 15 days before project check-in (June 19, 2024) and is the corresponding date we used in previous years. Indiana 4-H is also requiring this be the same date that QLC/YQCA is due AND serves as the Add/Drop date. So, Add/Drop is AFTER our Record Sheet Submission?! Yes! We know it's weird, but we're trying to follow the guidelines, and here's how this will work...Please call our office to add or drop projects throughout the year, as usual. If you decide to drop a project after May 31, it's honestly not a big deal. If you wish to add a project after May 31, we simply ask that you get the record sheet right away and complete it as soon as humanly possible. This is going to take some flexibility on everyone's part, but we think most things will be settled up by May 31, so we're not super concerned. Please note: You cannot add livestock projects after the May 15th Animal ID deadline (set by Indiana 4-H) because an unidentified animal is ineligible.
