WAI	RTS	Occurs when the calf's resistance is low because of stress, allowing bacteria or viruses to start an infection.								
BLA	CKLEG	Causes swelling and lameness. Skin between the toes and around the foot turns red, and the foot will have a foul odor.								
CALF SCOURS		Occurs in young cattle between 6 months and 2 years of age. Causes a high temperature and gas formation under the skin.								
FOC	OT ROT	The animal has swallowed metal while eating and it is caught inside the stomach.								
HAF	RDWARE DISEASE	Caused by an infectious virus. Serious cases are unsightly and painful.
