Arts and Crafts

Suggested ideas are: musical instrument, small/simple game, paint a picture, draw a picture, puppets, mobile, paper craft, doll, paint by number, pot holder, etc.

Collections

Exhibit 5 items or 5 pairs of items. Articles can be rocks, coins, insects, pencils, collector cards, etc.

Farm Animals

Exhibit a poster OR a small farm toy scene. NO LIVE animals will be exhibited at fair for Mini 4-H.

Flowers

Exhibit 3 cut flowers. Recommend using marigolds or zinnias.

Foods

Suggested items could be one of the following: nutrition poster – exhibit a poster showing nutritional foods or food groups, no bake cookies, table setting poster – Exhibit a poster with pictures drawn or pasted to the poster board showing how to properly set the table.

Woodcraft

Suggested items to create are: bird feeder, birdhouse, village, fort, wishing well, house, barn, and flower pot.
