You MUST have the proper project categories selected in 4-H Online before entering into FairEntry!


Prepare for up to an hour lag time between entering projects into 4-H Online and entering into FairEntry.

ALL livestock auction photos must also be submitted into FairEntry.

Don't wait until last minute to get signed up! If a high volume of people try to access 4-H Online and FairEntry all at once, the website may have delays, issues, or crashes that could complicate enrollment and entries.


<u>Dog Club Meetings Have Started!</u>

<u>Horse & Pony Forms Required on 4-H Online</u>

Horses & Ponies must have the following forms completed and signed to participate in the Horse & Pony Project.

• Vaccination Form

UPLOAD INTO 4-H ONLINE BY MAY 15TH!

- (Required For 2024) Measurement ID Card
- (Required For 2023 & 2024) Negative Coggins Test within 12 months of the date of exhibition
- Combine the Horse and Pony Measurement ID and the Coggins Form into one document then upload it to 4-H Online under either the Horse Vaccination Form PDF or Horse Vaccination Form IMAGE. If you need a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, please add it to this document as well.
- Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI / Health Certificate) if the horse has traveled from outside the state within 30 days of a 4-H event or if the horse is an out of state horse. An Extended Equine Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (EECVI) is provided by Global Vet Link which is accepted in Indiana. This electronic certificate is valid for up to 6 months and may be used for interstate movements of equine going to multiple destinations, such as shows and trail rides. - Horse Vaccination form, Measurement ID Card, COGGINS/EAI form and when necessary, CVI/EECVI Health Certificate must be carried by member to every practice, event, and/or show.



EMPORTANT ENFORMATIONS

Livestock Leasing Guidelines:

The only livestock allowed to be leased are:

- Dairy cows (as long as the animal is being shown by the same 4-Her from 2020 and forward) and heifers
- Horses & Ponies
- Alpacas & Llamas

All other animals must be OWNED by the 4-H'er exhibiting that animal. Lease forms due are in 4-H Online and the Extension Office by May 15th! Lease form is available at the Extension Office or in the Handbook on pages 212-213

What is Mini 4-H?

Mini 4-H is a noncompetitive 4-H program for youth in grades K-2.

Mini 4-H is designed to introduce you and your child to the 4-H program and is an excellent way for children to learn by doing and to exhibit projects at the Fair. Mini 4-H members also have the opportunity to attend club meetings, workshops, and a summer day camp just for Mini 4-H'ers.

The noncompetitive learning environment for Mini 4-H includes:

- 1. Planned learning activities in which children are invited to be active and explore materials and ideas without the pressure of completing a specific product or exhibit.
- 2. Low adult/leader to child ratio that allows time for adults/leaders to provide individual positive encouragement and assistance.
- 3. Simple, interesting activities that are fun.
- 4. Encouragement of children to participate in a group activity by sharing and or displaying their activity projects.
- 5. Rewards are identical ribbons of the same color for everyone.


There is no limit to the number of projects youth can sign up for, however, try not to overwhelm a child with too many projects.





Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care Training (QLC): LAST CHANCE!

ALL youth in grades 3-12 showing Cattle, Poultry (eggs included), Sheep, Goats, Swine, or Rabbits at the County Fair or the Indiana State Fair are required to complete this training for exhibition (State Fair requires a physical certificate). Fees are sponsored by 4-H Council. Alternatively, IN 4-H will accept online YQCA certification for 2024. If you choose to complete the YQCA option, you will register for the online course at https://yqcaprogram.org/. YQCA is recommended for those who participate in shows out of the state. The cost of the online YQCA course is \$12. After completing the course, you must email your certification to cammepurdue.edu AND faith2@purdue.edu to receive credit.

Poultry Blood Testing: MANDATORY!

On June 6th from 6-8pm at the Poultry Barn, ALL poultry over 1 year of age MUST be tested for Pullorum-Typhoid. All poultry under one year of age must be tested if they did not originate from a National Poultry Improvement Plan (NPIP) Pullorum-Typhoid Certified clean flock per requirements set by the Board of Animal Health. If you have any questions about Poultry Blood testing, please contact the Extension Office at 812-738-4236.



<u>Mini 4-H Decoupage</u> <u>Workshop</u>

You're never too young or old to learn something new! Miss Mary learned this lesson recently. Having never tried decoupage, much research and practice went into being able to teach this class. Decoupage is the art of decorating an object by gluing cutouts onto it. By using only the top layer of decorated paper napkins, the Mini's created miniature works of art. 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Carcass Workshop


