The annual meeting of the Hendricks County 4-H and Agricultural Fair Association, Inc., will be Monday, September 25, 2023, starting at 6:00 pm at the 4-H Fairgrounds Conference Center, Danville, Indiana. The purpose of the meeting will be to elect directors to represent specified geographic areas on the Hendricks County 4-H Fair Board. Directors will be elected from the following townships and district for a three-year terms: Brown Township, Liberty Township, Lincoln Township, Marion Township, and First Fair District which includes Eel River Township, Marion Township, Clay Township and Franklin Township.
