4HOnline Animal ID Quirks

Animal ID is due May 15th. Please check the animal ID chart provided in this newsletter so that you know exactly what information is needed and where it goes. A few quirks with the system include:

- Dairy Beef Cross Feeder Calves will go under "Dairy Feeders" in 4HOnline Animal ID. Choose "Crossbreed County ONLY" for the breed.
- If there is a required field for RFID but your animal doesn't have an RFID tag, simply enter 15 zeros (00000000000000000).
- Pigs aren't tattooed, and we know that, but when the prompt first pops up for Swine Barrows and Swine Gilts, it will ask for a tattoo. Enter your ear notches here. If you don't have ear notches, enter the 5-digit county tag (76XXX). State Fair pigs MUST have ear notches.
- As a reminder, nothing is entered in 4HOnline for Rabbits, Poultry, Dog, or Cat at this time.


