National 4-H Council Salute to Excellence Awards

Indiana Winner for Outstanding Lifetime Volunteer Award

Trina Copeland, Jefferson County

Trina Copeland just finished her 20th year as a 4-H Adult Leader, leading a 4-H Club and the 4-H Dog Project. It is not the 20 years that makes her resume so impressive, but the amount of time she spends organizing activities for 4-H members to hone their skills in Dog Obedience and Agility. Officially, our 4-H Dog Obedience classes start in March, but for Trina, this is a year round vocation. Our 4-H Dog Club serves as 4-H ambassadors throughout the year by promoting 4-H and specifically the dog project by setting up a booth at Tractor Supply in the fall and participating in the Christmas parade as well as the Regatta parade. 4-H members and their dogs also visit nursing homes and read books to kids at the Public Library. This take a great deal of planning and communication, and it all starts with Trina.



Trina is a dedicated volunteer who has a vision of how she wants to inspire her 4-H members and she follows through with thorough planning and hard work. Early on Trina knew she could not do this alone, so as she develops young 4-H members into outstanding 4-H members, some become volunteers to help her pass it on. As a result of her leadership, the Jefferson County Southpaws have nine other 4-H leaders that assist our 4-H members learn the skills they need to achieve excellence in the 4-H Dog project. Of course, when you have good leaders, your project grows. In 2015, our county had 25 4-H members participate in the 4-H Fair Dog Shows and three completed posters; in 2019 40 4-H members showed their dogs and 5 exhibited dog posters.

In the last nine years, Jefferson County has had 9 Indiana State Fair individual winners and one drill team placed 1st at the State Fair. Two of those 4-H members are judging in other counties to fill the need that other counties have in finding good judges. Trina's trick to providing the best learning environment is consistency, constant communication, and high expectations. 4-H Dog project meetings start the first Monday of March and continue past fair time so that 4-H members can prepare for the State Fair. She often schedules additional sessions on another day of the week so that 4-H members get as much opportunity as possible, given their busy schedules, to prepare their dogs for show.

Trina communicates important information to members through the Jefferson County Southpaws 4-H Dog Club Facebook page and email twelve months of the year. This includes opportunities to provide community service hours, ways to raise funds for trips to State Fair, and any other activities the club decides to take on. The Top Dog Award is an award that is given to the 4-H member that earns the most points by attending training meetings, participating in community service, volunteering to give presentations to groups, etc. All these opportunities provide 4-H members growth in achievement, leadership, and citizenship. Five of her former 4-H Dog members have become 4-H Dog Project Leaders. One of them started a 4-H Dog club in a neighboring county.

Additional Indiana Nominees for Outstanding Lifetime Volunteer Award

Bethany Perlee, Clinton County

Bethany is the co-leader of the Kirklin Hoosier 4-H Club, one of the largest clubs in Clinton County 4-H with over 80+ members. Bethany is an active 4-H leader, who assists many of her club members with their 4-H projects and community service events. She is the first to volunteer for their many community service opportunities and does a great job leading and teaching others. She is a hardworking, self-motivated individual. Her motivation comes from the desire to help others. Whether it is helping members with 4-H projects or if it is showing kids how to take care of sheep, Bethany is there making the best better. She motivates others to help as well. Her participation in the county and state 4-H fairs have been great opportunities for her to highlight and develop leadership skills, not only in herself, but in her club members as well.



Bethany has a work ethic that demands excellence, as has been demonstrated through her exceptional teaching of student leaders. Her moral character is unchallenged as well, as can be seen through her helping, caring attitude.

Her commitment to positive youth development is second to none. She knows many people in the community and always encourages youth not in 4-H to join SPARK clubs and other activities to get them involved. She knows how to communicate with the youth and uses Facebook and other social media outlets to promote these events. She even started a video series called *Fun Fact Friday*, where she made live Facebook postings to teach people about 4-H and remind them of upcoming deadlines. They were very funny, informative, and well done. She reached many, many people through these hilarious videos.

Debbie Sajdera, Lake County

Debbie Sajdera has put in 35 years of blood, sweat, and yes, even tears for the Lake County 4-H program. She assisted with some State 4-H events and has assisted or spearheaded the start of new projects and activities in Lake County. The largest project that she started was Shooting Sports. Shooting Sports in Lake County is on its second year; she just recently had someone else trained so she is not trying to manage the project on her own. Debbie started the Horse Bowl and Hippology teams that competed and were very successful at the Indiana State, Eastern National 4-H Horse Round-Up, and Quarter Horse Congress contests.



She diligently serves on county committee and is currently the superintendent for the Lake County Horse and Pony Project. While Debbie has taken on the superintendent role, the horse and pony project in Lake County has doubled in size! This is outstanding as many counties are seeing their livestock projects declining or staying steady. Not only does she take on those roles, but she is also a club leader. Her club is extremely active: they go on trips, do activities, and complete a club project each year. She strives for the youth in her club and the projects that she is involved in to have the best overall experience they can. She has a true passion for the 4-H program and teaches to the 4 H's that 4-H stands for. Debbie organized and facilitated the Lake County 4-H 5K for two years to help promote what 4-H has to offer. During this event, she asked different clubs to set up a table with an activity or craft for participants to take part in before or after the run. Not only did 4-Hers participate, but friends and the general public came as well. Those two years were a huge success! She does not ask for recognition, but she truly helped "make the best better" with the 4-H program in multiple ways.

2020 Indiana 4-H Volunteer Awards of Excellence

Excellence in 4-H Animal Science Programming, Adult

Jean Thomas, Vigo County

Jean Thomas has been a Vigo County 4-H Volunteer for 40 years. She serves as the Vigo County Rabbit Club Adult Leader and Rabbit Barn Superintendent. Jean has also been a chaperone for the 4-H Academy @ Purdue for many years. She has served Indiana 4-H as the Indiana State Fair Rabbit Superintendent.

Jean provides multiple opportunities for members of the Vigo County 4-H Rabbit club to develop leadership skills. She works with older members to create learning stations at club meetings to benefit younger members. The club members are motivated to work hard to be competitive at the State Fair Rabbit



Ambassador contest. Even though she lives outside county lines, you can count on Jean to be holding two meetings a month and being down in the rabbit barn preparing for the fair. This year she adapted to COVID challenges to keep the club engaged. Members were encouraged to create a video about their rabbitry to teach younger members about different rabbit set-ups. These videos were used as a 4-H Rabbit Educational Project. She also created a "Battle of the Breeds" contest that members voted on their favorite breeds in one-on-one tournament-style match ups! When it came time for fair, she stepped up and came up with a plan to meet additional Rabbit Show requirements to keep 4-H families and rabbits safe.

Excellence in 4-H Animal Science Programming, Youth

Abigail Arvin, White County

Abigail Arvin is a very active White County 4-H Member. She participates in many different projects, including both building and livestock projects. Abigail is also an active member in the Princeton Cavaliers 4-H Club and Junior Leaders, having held the position of Treasurer in Junior Leaders this past year.

Abigail has a strong passion for Animal Science and is always willing to get involved in whichever way she can. In 2020, Abigail worked with the White County 4-H Educator to plan a session for the annual Ag Day focusing on



Swine to introduce local fourth graders to the pork industry and provide some beginning knowledge for them on that topic. Abigail had several great hands-on activities planned, and was all set to lead the 10 sessions with ~35 youth each. During the COVID shutdown this spring, Abigail also participated in an educational video series led by White County Junior Leaders which focused on providing information about different projects of their choosing. This series was meant to build community within our social media outlets. Abigail's video focused on how she begins working with her pigs to get them show ready and was very well-received within our community. Abigail's interest in Animal Science is evident, and she is always seeking opportunities to share her knowledge and experience with others.

Excellence in 4-H Science Programming, Adult Patty Breslin and Rahul Sarkar, Hendricks County

Two years ago, Hendricks County STEM programming consisted of one National Youth Science Day activity that was lucky to get a handful of youth participants. When Rahul Sarkar and Patty Breslin learned of the need to increase STEM programming, they jumped at the chance! Since 2019, Rahul and Patty have increased STEM Programming within Hendricks County 4-H by 300%! Titled "4-H STEM Coordinators," the two volunteers have worked hard to grow the amount of STEM events and offerings for Hendricks.



STEM events/programs they have developed include:

• Family STEM Day 2019 – youth were provided a "STEM Passport" to travel around the facilities to participate in Makerspace activities, including Ozobots, Makey Makeys, Straw Structures, Keva Planks, Google Scratch, and 3D pens/printer. After exploring all of the stations, participants watched a demonstration on matter with dry ice and had a chance to interact with STEM professionals on a STEM Career Panel. Additionally, the Indiana 4-H STEM Specialist was at the event to promote STEM in Indiana 4-H.



- STEM in Nature this event included a video about inventions created based on nature, interactive stations from the Indiana 4-H Natural Resources STEM specialist, NOAA, and SWCD. Participants were then tasked with exploring nature on the fairgrounds and creating a new invention based on their observations with nature that evening.
- STEM Fun & Games at the Fair— During the 2019 4-H Fair, Rahul and Patty offered a Makerspace where members of the public could explore STEM-related activities with little "pressure" to attend a full day event. Throughout the two days it was open, stations were set and manned with Jr. Leaders/volunteers to help answer questions about the STEM activity and 4-H.
- National Youth Science Day By using the curriculum provided by National 4-H, Rahul and Patty took lead on the NYSD activities. NYSD participation increased 60% from 2018 to 2019!
- **Diversity in STEM Day** This event in early 2020 focused not only on diverse careers in STEM, but also on the importance of having diverse people represented in those STEM careers.

Excellence in 4-H Science Programming, Youth Josiah George and Joe Riffle, Franklin County

Josiah George and Joe Riffle are true STEM ambassadors for Franklin County and Indiana 4-H. These young men are current Franklin County 4-H members who are Juniors at Franklin County High School in Brookville. Their natural curiosity and love of science led them both to join the Brookville Middle School Science Club in its initial year when they were in 5th grade. Since then they have been very involved in learning and helping to teach other youth about STEM in



our rural county and throughout the state. They were on a fluid power team for three years, as well as a robotics team. They have led educational stations at the Indiana State Fair on Fluid Power twice, and computer coding once. They have led many makerspace activities throughout our county, and were selected to attend the National 4-H Makerspace Summit in Washington DC in 2018. Joe and Josiah attended Teens as Teachers for coding and have been CS Teen leaders for three years, teaching the NYSD Code Your World and Game Changers activities to all 6th & 7th grade classes at the middle school, as well as leading activities at our annual Halloween event and at the Indiana 4-H Summit in 2019. They are currently making plans for conducting the Mars Base Camp national 4-H science experiment this fall.

Excellence in 4-H Civic Engagement Programming, Adult

Dan Miller, Vanderburgh County

Dan Miller is actively involved in the community and leads youth by example. He has served as a dedicated 4-H volunteer in Vanderburgh County for 37 years. He serves as a club leader for the Energetics 4-H Club and serves as project superintendent for the Government and Wildlife projects.

Dan has consistently served as a chaperone for 4-H Academy @ Purdue for many years. He has served on the planning and presentation team for the 4-H Civic Engagement Workshop held during the Academy for the past 7 years, and takes



the lead on discussing the roles of county government section with the attendees. This workshop received the 2017 National Citizenship in 4-H Youth Development Award presented by the National Association of Extension 4-H Agents.

He always makes time to assist with the Vanderburgh County 4-H awards process to ensure 4-H members are recognized for their hard work. He was honored as a Rural Urban Extension award winner in 2014, a prestigious honor, for his dedication to the 4-H program and Extension work.

Excellence in 4-H Civic Engagement Programming, Youth

Ethan Roos, Spencer County

Ethan has been involved in various efforts across the Spencer County 4-H program and has served in any area needed. He is more than willing to advocate for 4-H on a local, state, or national level.

Ethan has been involved in the Spencer County Junior Leaders for 4 years. In his time, Ethan has helped secure and plan a summer fundraiser to financially support the Spencer County Bags of Blessings. Bags of Blessings are distributed to youth during the summer that experience food insecurity. Through Ethan and other Junior Leader's efforts, more than \$1,000 has been donated the last 3 summers to Bags of Blessings.



While serving with the Junior Leaders, Ethan has also helped judge Mini 4-H projects for the last 4 years. Parents have commented on how caring Ethan is with their Mini 4-Her, taking time to encourage their 4-H participation.

During his Junior year, Ethan took on the challenge of being a 4-H Camp Counselor. His compassion was evident as he helped homesick campers find joy in being at camp.

Ethan attended the Indiana State Fair Youth Leadership Conference in 2017 as a delegate. In 2018 he served as a group advisor, and in 2019 was elected as the delegate coordinator. In 2018 he was selected to serve on the National Youth Leadership Team for Indiana at the National 4-H Congress. Recently he was elected to serve on the 2021 State 4-H Junior Leader Council.

Ethan has grown in his leadership role in Spencer County, the state of Indiana, and nationally. He is always willing to help where needed and give of his time and talents.

Excellence in 4-H Healthy Living Programming, Youth

Cassie Burgett, Benton County

Cassie has exhibited leadership qualities by participating in 4-H. As a Junior Leader, she has led and demonstrated many different activities for the Cloverbud and Mini 4-H members over the last 3 years. As a Junior Leader, Cassie is looked to by the younger members as a role model.

Most recently, Cassie has been involved in the Indiana 4-H Teens as Teachers program, attending a state conference and National Healthy Living Summit, both in 2020. She has learned various lessons in healthy living to then share and teach to others in the community. In this role, she has presented to groups of adults and youth on topics related to healthy living such as nutrition, stress reduction, sun safety, mindfulness, and overall wellness. These experiences have enabled Cassie to develop



her public speaking skills and to grow more confident while presenting to groups.

Cassie also exhibits good teamwork when working with others. She has learned to work with her team of other Teen Teachers to plan and implement different programs. While different ideas may be presented, compromise is established and in doing so, Cassie strives to support the team with her efforts.

Through the COVID-19 pandemic, Cassie also contributed multiple videos to support our educational efforts. These videos were shared online and through our virtual 4-H Camp.

Excellence in 4-H Healthy Living Programming, Youth

Madison Powell, Tipton County

Maddie is an excellent choice for this award as she has devoted many years and hours to 4-H and to Healthy Living in her Tipton County community and at the state level.

During the 2020 Teens as Teachers Conference, Maddie served on the state leadership team. Maddie was tasked with not only helping with the Healthy Living track but also presenting six separate sessions on the topic of "What you need to know to be successful." After our initial meeting to discuss expectations for the sessions, Maddie planned, organized, and presented each session by herself. Her attention to detail, imagination for ice breakers and other activities, kept the attendees engaged and interested throughout. Maddie has a dynamic, positive attitude and passion for healthy living!



Maddie has been selected to serve on the 2021 State 4-H Junior Leader Council. She has also contributed to the Growing Jr. Leaders Into the Future #Adulting 101 series of lessons that was released in the Fall, 2020.

Excellence in 4-H Club Programming, Adult Shirley Maloney, Hendricks County

When it comes to impactful 4-H Volunteers in Hendricks County, Shirley Maloney is at the top of the list. She is always willing to help where needed and holds a variety of 4-H roles and responsibilities.

As a club leader, Shirley plans activities that will be appropriate for all individuals and all abilities so they can be successful and grow in their 4-H experience. Her co-leader stated, "4-Hers come to meetings knowing that Shirley will be there with exciting activities and encouragement." Shirley encourages kids to come up with ideas to express their interests. During club meetings, Shirley welcomes all



family members to participate. Parents are invited to ask questions and Shirley is great at providing resources to families, especially those new to 4-H.

She ensures youth know the importance of giving back to the community. Annually, her club participates in several community service projects. One of the club's favorite service activities is working with a local organization involving individuals with physical and developmental disabilities. Shirley's club creates keepsakes for the individuals, serves a meal to the group, hosts some form of entertainment, and then cleans up afterwards. The kids look forward to this special time with the community every year.

Shirley treats every 4-Her as an individual who can grow to be a responsible and active citizen in our society. In all experiences, she maintains she learns more than the 4-Her and she receives much more back than the 4-Her. This humility enables her to rejoice with a 4-Her in his/her successes and sympathize in his/her failures. Her empathy with 4-Hers also allows her to show a 4-Her how to turn failures and successes into learning experiences. Her acceptance and encouragement of allowing 4-Hers and 4-H volunteers to be different allows the 4-H program in Hendricks County and throughout the state to accept new programs and ideas which will help future generations.

Excellence in 4-H Club Programming, Youth Thomas Carroll, Lawrence County

Thomas has an enthusiasm that is contagious, and when he commits to something, he follows through and does not take his responsibility lightly. Thomas' drive goes beyond his personal ambition. He wants to see Lawrence County 4-H grow stronger and be held in high regard across the state. He attended many out of county opportunities and is constantly looking for things he can bring back to his clubs. For example, he attended the Vanderburgh County Junior Leader Retreat, and he came back with an idea to improve the etiquette dinner. He has already committed to lead this activity as a volunteer next year.



Thomas shines in a crowd, because he wears his personality where all can see it. He is proud of who he is and wants to share that with those around him. He especially displays this in his Sewing project. From the time he created a complete steam punk outfit to his 4-H fabric suit and tie, he stands out for being more than one of the only young men to complete the project. His ability to be comfortable with his unique personality helps those around him be more comfortable in their skin. I have seen youth open up in numerous meetings and become more involved in Junior Leaders thanks to Thomas. He is enthusiastic in groups and always happy to take the lead and ensure everyone is engaged. He leads discussions with ease, and works to ensure all sides are heard. His presidency of the Lawrence County 4-H Junior Leaders has pushed them to grow and try new opportunities. He was our first teen to attend Teens as Teachers, and this year, he helped recruit two whole teams to attend, even though he could not.

Excellence in Youth Adult Partnerships, Team

Amanda Deutsch, Jennifer Deutsch, Emily English, Susan English, Vanderburgh County

Amanda and Emily have both held offices and been committee chairs in their respective clubs and Junior Leader organization. Jennifer and Susan were both 10-year 4-H members and have been leaders before they had children. After attending the "Global Gateway Experience" trip to Heifer International in 2019, the two girls researched hunger in our community and determined that there is food insecurity in our own community.

The girls developed an idea to help provide nutrient dense food



to children in need during the summer. After researching, they found that the Fulton Square neighborhood Boys & Girls Club had a 100% poverty level. With the help of the leaders, they arranged a meeting with the director of the Boys & Girls Club to present their idea of the "Fresh Fruit & Power Protein" take home bags for the kids to take home for the weekend. With help from the leaders, they applied and were awarded a grant from the Indiana 4-H Foundation, "Indiana 4-H Takes a Bite Out of Hunger."

The girls gave presentations to twelve organizations to help raise awareness of food insecurity in our community and were able to raise an additional \$3,800 locally to support their summer project. Amanda and Emily, with help from their leaders, organized to make 50 lunch bags for the Fulton Square Boys and Girls Club each Friday for twelve weeks for field trips. They also made 25 take home bags including a 16 oz. jar of peanut butter and 6 pieces of fresh fruit to send home with each child in need for the weekend since the back pack food program is not available during the summer.

They organized a trip to the fair for the children to view animals in the various barns including, chickens, rabbits, pigs, llamas & alpacas, and cows. The girls also arranged for them to experience some fair food for lunch from their Junior Leader food booth. The children thoroughly enjoyed their day seeing and interacting with animals most had never seen in person.


Recognition awards have been mailed to the Purdue Extension County Offices for each of these volunteers. Recognition includes the following:

Wyneta Duncan has served Hancock County as a 4-H Horse & Pony Leader and Superintendent for 55


