 - List of local service organizations (Optional)

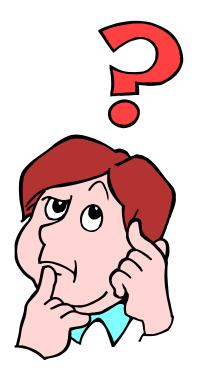
