 - Newspaper (Optional)
 - List of local service organizations (Optional)

- Make a positive impact on your local community

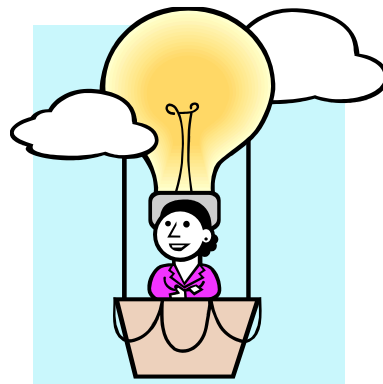

Selecting a community service project

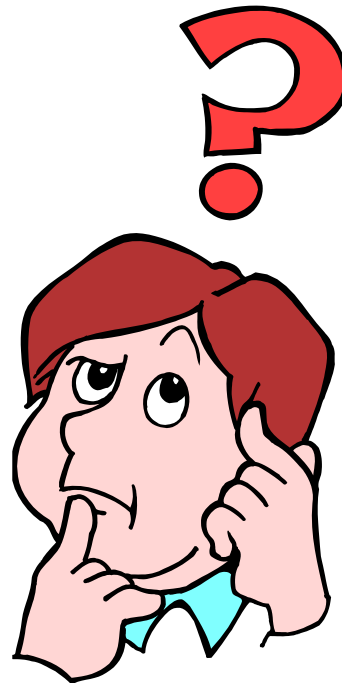
- Everyone gets three stickers.
