Auction Picture Needed

All 4-H members that will be selling an animal through the Adams County 4-H Auction must turn in a photo of the 4-H'er and the animal they intend to sell.

This <u>4x6 landscape photo</u> is **due** to the respective Livestock Committee on **Saturday during livestock check-in**. On the back of the picture make sure to include the members name and animal ID. (ear notch, tag/tattoo)

Auction Animals

All 4-H Members must notify the livestock committee if they plan to sell an animal in the auction and the animal ID (Tag Number/Ear Notch) of the intended auction animal. This needs to be done at the <u>Announcer's Stand the day of</u> <u>each livestock show you are exhibiting in.</u>

If undetermined due to showing multiple species, please understand 4-H'ers must inform the livestock committee which animal will sell within 30 minutes of the last livestock show exhibited in.

Battle of

Purdue Extension Staff, 4-H Junior Leaders and some Rock Star Volunteers will be meeting 4-H'ers at the East end of the Expo Hall to collect 4-H projects on the designated project check-in times.

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Projects will be dropped at table, then taken to another station by volunteers to be labeled, checked-in and delivered to its designated judging station.

Those 4-H'ers that have large projects that need a "team lift" and require set-up will need to check-in at the table and will be directed to the appropriate area to deliver/set-up large items.

Open Judging at Fair

In Adams County, we practice open judging which means that 4 -H members, have the opportunity to have an open conversation with the judge of all static (non animal) project. Open judging is a great learning experience in which youth can ask questions and obtain constructive criticism and genuine praise regarding your project and your efforts.

Parents/guardians are not permitted to speak with judges during open judging as it is a prime time for youth to shine on their very own, explaining what they learned and how they accomplished their goals.

The Adams County 4-H Fair Board will provide commercial tents with tables and chairs near the Dining Hall and Clover Center for fairgoers to eat under.



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
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Adams County 4-H Livestock Check In Map
