SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

Senior Year Scholarship

Available to 4-H members in their senior year of high school

Club Scholarship

Available to 4-H members entering Purdue University majoring in the College of Agriculture or select majors in the College of Health and Human Sciences

Purdue Horticulture & Landscape Architecture Scholarship

Available to a 4-H member majoring in horticulture or landscape architecture at Purdue University and studied plant science in 4-H.

Accomplishment Scholarship

Available to 4-H members in grades 10-12 of high school and the year immediately following high school graduation. The purpose of the 4-H Accomplishment Scholarship is to recognize youth who have excelled in life skills development through their 4-H activities and involvement.

Categories: Animal Science—Meat and Milk Production; Animal Science—Companion and Small Animal Production; Citizenship; Communications; Engineering and Technological Science; Healthy Living, Food and Nutrition Science; Leadership Development; and Plant and Environmental Science. Three additional categories are reserved for applicants demonstrating life skills development in more than one of the previously listed categories. Those are Premier Achievement, Premier Citizenship, and Premier Leadership.

Eligibility: Applicants must be in grade 10, 11, 12, or their first year immediately following 4-H enrollment eligibility at the time applications are due. While an applicant does not have to be a current 4-H member, they must demonstrate multiple years of involvement in Indiana's 4-H Youth Development Program.

Youth who have previously been awarded a \$1,000 accomplishment scholarship are only eligible to compete in the Premier Achievement, Premier Citizenship, and Premier Leadership categories. Youth who have previously been awarded a \$2,000 scholarship are no longer eligible to compete in any category.

Awards: A minimum of thirty \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded to youth based on their demonstration of life skills development in these eight categories: Animal Science—Meat and Milk Production; Animal Science—Companion and Small Animal Production; Citizenship; Communications; Engineering and Technological Science; Healthy Living, Food, and Nutrition Science; Leadership Development; and Plant and Environmental Science.

A minimum of one \$2,000 scholarship will be awarded in each of these categories: Premier Achievement; Premier Citizenship; and Premier Leadership.

Livestock Identification Dates

All identification dates happen at the Adams County 4-H Fairgrounds, specific details sent to those enrolled in each species.

Premise ID

Premise ID is issued by the Indiana Board of Animal Health (BOAH) and serves much like a social security number for your farm. BOAH uses the Premise ID to assist with tracking of animals, especially in the event that an animal health issue arises they are able to help track those animals.

Premise IDs are a seven digit alpha-numeric ID, usually starting with 00.

Animal ID Deadline - May 15th

Some livestock have earlier ID days, however those ID days are simply to get animals tagged and weighed. Information is gathered and provided for the family at those ID days but it is your responsibility then to go into the 4HOnline system to officially enter those livestock.

All animals must be identified and entered into 4HOnline (v2.4honline.com); which is the same place where 4-H'ers enroll themselves in the 4-H program and sign-up for events **by May 15th.**

This does not include:

Cats, Dogs and Small Animals

Poultry are NOT entered online*

*Poultry has a paper enrollment form due by **May 15th.**

Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care Program

Those youth exhibiting cattle, goats, poultry, rabbits, sheep and swine must complete an annual animal care certification.

What is the Adams County 4-H Council?

- RESPONSIBLE FOR FACILITATING THE 4-H YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM FOR THE YOUTH OF ADAMS COUNTY THROUGH PURDUE EXTENSION - ADAMS COUNTY.

THE SPECIFIC FUNCTIONS ARE:

- TO FACILITATE 4-H YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM PLANNING FOR ADAMS COUNTY, INCLUDING NEEDS ASSESSMENT, PROGRAM IMPLEMENTATION, RECOGNITION, AND EVALUATION.
- TO PROVIDE FOR VOLUNTEER STAFF DEVELOPMENT INCLUDING RECRUITMENT, ORIENTATION, AND RECOGNITION.
- TO PROVIDE FOR AND ASSIST WITH MEMBER RECRUITMENT AND RECOGNITION.
- TO PROVIDE FOR AND ASSIST WITH PROGRAM VISIBILITY.
- TO PROVIDE CONTINUING FINANCIAL SUPPORT.
- TO ASSURE THAT THE 4-H YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM IS OPERATING COOPERATIVELY WITH OTHER YOUTH-SERVING EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS.
- TO ESTABLISH COUNTY 4-H POLICIES CONSISTENT WITH NATIONAL AND STATE POLICIES AND RESOLVE CONFLICTS RELATING TO 4-H POLICY AND PROGRAM.

Who can serve on the 4-H Council?

THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE 4-H COUNCIL SHALL CONSIST OF ANY ADULT 4-H VOLUNTEER WITHIN ADAMS COUNTY, ANY PARENT OR GUARDIAN OF A CHILD ENROLLED IN THE 4-H YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM, AND/OR ANYONE ELSE WITHIN THE COUNTY WHO HAS AN INTEREST IN THE 4-H PROGRAM.

THE ADAMS COUNTY 4-H COUNCIL IS COMPOSED OF 17 DIRECTORS, 13 OF WHOM ARE ELECTED MEMBERS SERVING THREE-YEAR TERMS.

COUNCIL MEMBERSHIP IS LIMITED TO TWO CONSECUTIVE TERMS.
