All projects, including static, need to be entered in Fair Entry by May 24th. Failure to do so could result in the inability to participate in that project for the 2024 fair. 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News for Everyone

4-HOnline enrollment & payment of program fees is due by May 15, 2024.

If you enroll May 1-15, you must use a major credit card for payment.

Note: some animal projects have an earlier deadline.

Fair Entry is open. All entries are due May 24th

Failure to do so will result in those projects placing no higher than a blue ribbon (no honor, division reserve champion, division champion, State Fair Entry, reserve grand champion or grand champion).

4-H Online - May 15

All animals and projects need to be entered in 4-H online by May 15, 2024! There is some flexibility for projects but not animals! You **MUST** be enrolled in a project to select that project in Fair Entry. If you run into problems, call the Extension Office 260-481-6826 or email Rebecca: rcclay@purdue.edu

Fair Entry is Due May 24, 2024.

Think of Fair Entry as a RSVP for a class, pen, poster rack or table spot for your project. We need to know how many spaces to reserve and what project labels we need to print. Fair Entry is to be completed by all in grades K-12. There will be a help session on May 22 from 8am– 7pm (open house style) for families who need help completing fair entry. Detailed directions are attached to the email!

Tips and Tricks as questions have come in:

- You do not need to register an animal in 4-H online as a mini 4-H'er. Communicate with your committee/leaders your intent to show and select project in fair entry
- Mini 4-H'ers do not specify projects on 4-H online. They will register for specific projects on Fair Entry
- If Fair Entry will not let you select an animal, check the animal tab under that child on 4-H online to ensure the animal is registered/listed.
- Sign up for everything you might bring to fair. It is easier to "scratch" project than add day of.
- If fair entry says "a membership to one of the following 4-H online projects is required" your child did not select the project on 4-H online. Ex: Ben wants to bring a dog poster but gets this fair entry message. Ben goes back in 4-H online on the project tab and adds dog. Ben will have to wait for the office to resync the systems before he can complete fair entry. (This is why we ask you add all projects in 4-H online)
- Use the cheat sheet! Fair entry looks a little different this year and some levels don't list the grades.

EXHIBIT BUILDING CHECK IN PROCESS

All Exhibit Building projects will be checked in on Friday, June 14 from 3 pm to 7 pm **OR** Saturday, June 15 from 9 am to 12 pm. Judging will start promptly at 12:30 p.m. on Saturday, June 15. Late projects will be marked down a ribbon color or given a participation ribbon if the judge is no longer present.

You will check in at the Exhibit Hall this year!

1. Bring your General Record Sheet with your projects. You only need one (1) record sheet regardless of the number of non-livestock projects you are exhibiting. These can be found on Allen County's website at the top linked here: <https://extension.purdue.edu/county/allen/allen-4h.html>
2. Find a volunteer with a computer near the doors who will check in your projects online. If you do not have your tags, they can be picked up where the 4-H office is located in the exhibit hall on June 14th or 15th. Tags should be ready for early pick up hopefully the first week of June in the office. An email will be sent out.
3. Once checked in, you can take your projects to their location to be judged. Ask questions if you are confused!!!

Non Auction Animals: Sunday, June 23 from 6 - 9:30 pm

Auction animals will stay on the grounds and be released after the auction on Monday

*Remember all projects are expected to stay until the release day and time




ATTENTION ALL 12th GRADERS:

We will be holding the 4-H dance this year following the fun night in the show barn. Bring your dancing shoes and your friends for a night full of dancing and fun.





4-H Spot Light!

On May 2nd and 9th Please do not plant to park by the Lions barn as we will be having an ID day on the 2nd and plant sale on the 9th creating a lot of traffic.

Premise ID

Do you need a Premise ID? **If you are showing cattle, swine, sheep, goats you will need a premise ID.** If your animals are being housed on someone's property, they will hold the ID for their property. It is recommended you have an ID for poultry but not required. To apply for an ID go to www.in.gov/boah/2700.htm. If you have not done this, please do it ASAP. It may take a few days to get the ID back and animal ID is due May 15th! If you are worried you will not get it by the May 15th deadline, I recommend you call the Board of Health at 317-544- 2381. This only needs to be done once for your farm.

Grooming Assistance at the Indiana State Fair

Just a reminder that if you are planning to exhibit at the Indiana State Fair you need to make sure that you are in compliance with the Grooming Assistance rule. 4-H Exhibitors may receive clipping and grooming assistance from members of their immediate family (father, mother and siblings), from a current Indiana 4-H Member; and from individuals enrolled in the Indiana 4-H Approved Animal Grooming Assistance Program. Temporary guardianships are not permitted and shall result in immediate disqualification. Please note that this program is only for Indiana residents.

*Those enrolled in this program should not see this as a way to do the work for the 4-H member, but should provide hands-on learning opportunities that further the skills and abilities of the 4-H member.

Transitioning from YQCA to the Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care Program

Please remember that every member exhibiting cattle, goats, poultry, rabbits, sheep and swine has to complete either the online YQCA or in person QLC training. Failure to complete this requirement will result in the inability to show your animal at fair!

If you complete the National YQCA program, **please email your certificate to Rebecca at rcclay@purdue.edu** to ensure your requirement is marked complete in 4-H online. **Last in person training in Allen County will be on May 14, 7-8pm at the Extension Office. Sign up on 4-H Online.** There are still a few surrounding counties that are offering the in person training if you cannot make it. To register for another county's program, go to events under your child's profile on 4-H online. You then will click on the county you want to go to and that will allow you to see and register for a specific date. Please do not wait until the last minute! Thank you to everyone who has already completed the training.

HORSE & PONY & LLAMA INFORMATION

Horse and llama identification must be entered in V2.4online by May 15.

Please review the table on page 10 for the updated Animal ID requirements. All Horses and llamas, must be in V2.4online on or before May 15. Fair Entry is due May 24th (this is now mandatory as per state rules! If you need help please reach out!). Please remember to select all the classes you think you might compete in. We can scratch day of.

Identifying Animals in 4HOnline

Horses and Llamas are the only species requiring photographs in 2024. You will need to upload two images of your animals in V2.4online for verification purposes. The first colored photo will be of the animal's head showing all features. The second colored photo will be a full body image showing all 4 feet and the head of the animal. If families need assistance adding the photos in 4HOnline, please call the office at 260-481-6429. Additional detailed instructions for identifying each species in 4HOnline are located on the home screen of 4HOnline after logging into your family profile. Horse & Pony Scholarship: 12th Graders - Ask your leader about the Joannie Tumbleson Horse & Pony Scholarship. The Application is due May 31. The form can be found on the [Purdue Extension-Allen County Web Site](#) under horse and pony.

Mini Horse and Pony: All minis need to complete ID form, Vaccination form, lease form (if applicable), and liability release form and return to the office by May 24th. (We will allow extra time. Ignore the date online) Forms can be found on the [Allen County Extension Website](#)



Cattle, Horse, Llama, Swine, Sheep & Goat Animals identification must be entered in V2.4online by May 15.

Please review the table on page 10 of the newsletter with updated Animal ID requirements. All Cattle, Horse, Llama, Swine, Sheep, and Goats must be in V2.4online on or before May 15. If you intend to show at the state fair, all DNA Envelopes must be back to the office by 4:30 pm on Monday, May 15. This is a state fair deadline for DNA, so please do not miss this! Envelopes can be picked up at the office.

If your animal is not in 4-H online by May 15th you will NOT be state fair eligible!!

The animal ID information must be entered in the Indiana 4-H Online enrollment system by the respective deadlines. Missing, incomplete or incorrect animal ID information could result in state fair ineligibility for that particular animal.
