SOME PLACE TO GO SOMEONE TO HELP

Ever wonder what they mean? The Safe Place sign indicates that any young person can enter the location and ask for help.

What is Safe Place®? Safe Place is a national outreach and prevention program for youth in crisis. More than 20,000 locations across the U.S. and 2,000+ in Indiana, display the yellow and black Safe Place sign, the universal symbol of help and safety for all young people.

Most licensed Safe Place agencies serve youth between the ages of 12 to 17 years old, although some agencies serve younger and older youth. To learn more, please visit: www.nationalsafeplace.org/what-is-safe-place.

Indiana has been operating Safe Place programs since 1987. Since that time, nearly 15,000 young people accessed immediate safety and were connected to resources to keep them off the streets.

It is estimated that more than one million youth run away from home each year due to abuse, neglect, family conflicts and other issues. The Safe Place program is an option for young people who feel they have nowhere to turn.

There are nineteen Safe Place programs serving youth in 31 counties across the state of Indiana with 2,000 stationary and mobile sites ready to help any Indiana youth in need. In 2019, 450 youth were helped through the Safe Place program and nearly 150,000 youth were educated about how to get help through Safe Place in times of crisis.

The Safe Place program, operated locally by Purdue Extension Benton County, partners with 14 businesses and community organizations such as the Benton County EMS Boswell and Fowler, Benton County Public Library, Benton County Sheriff Department, Benton County Health & Wellness Center, Boswell Public Library, Ceres Solutions Templeton, Farmers & Merchants Bank Boswell, Otterbein Pizza King, Farmers & Merchants Bank, Otterbein, EMS & fire Department, Otterbein, Oxford Public Library, Strasburger Trucking and Town of Boswell to provide Benton County youth immediate safety and access to supportive resources.





We would like everyone in the state of Indiana to be able to use the internet at fast speeds. While it might help you play games and watch videos more easily, it also can help people who are looking for jobs or trying to communicate, do business, or do schoolwork.

The FCC, or Federal Communication Commission, can't help everyone get fast internet unless they know all the places the internet is installed and how fast it is in each location.



HOW

To earn acceptance into Purdue, Indiana students can take the Modern States online courses for free. Those who pass a minimum of five corresponding College Board CLEP exams are assured admission to Purdue and will be designated as Klinsky Scholars. Students also will have access to mentors during the program.

Make a Purdue University education even more affordable:

- Free online courses and corresponding CLEP exams through Modern States, covering the entire cost of the Fast Start program
- Complete 5 courses + pass the CLEP exams (paid for by ModernStates.org) = 15 credits, a full semester's worth of credit at Purdue, WHICH CAN SAVE A STUDENT \$11,000
