

New this year- Any volunteer who has completed all their training for the year can receive a shirt at project fair, too.



LIVESTOCK JUDGING 2023-2024

Learn to evaluate livestock, improve your decision making skills, increase your communication skills, and have a lot of fun!



Practice will begin Tuesday, September 19 from 3:15-5:00 at Webo with a parent information meeting to follow as well as Wednesday, September 20 from 6:00-7:30 with a parent information meeting to follow. Families can choose which night to attend. Contact us with questions or for more information.

WHAT DO WE DO?

Our livestock judging teams learn to judge cattle, hogs, sheep, and meat goats. We work to learn the parts of the animals, terminology for describing the animals, and presenting oral reasons to justify our placings of the animals.

WHEN IS PRACTICE?

We will practice at Western Boone this year. We will practice on Tuesdays from 3:15-5:00 and Wednesdays from 6:00-7:30. Both nights are not expected, but rather are designed to offer different options for families and flexibility.

CONTESTS

The primary livestock judging season is in the spring with contests from March to May. We do have a contest in October and one in December. Most contests occur on Saturdays. A schedule will be provided the first week of practice. Judging team members are not required to attend all contests.

COACHES

The teams this year will be coached by Tyler and Mandy Trent as well as FFA advisor Makayla and Todd Smith.



Breakfast Pumpkin Cookies

48 cookies

INGREDIENTS:


- 1 3/4 cups cooked, pureed pumpkin (15 ounce can)
- 1 1/2 cups brown sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1/2 cup oil
- 1 1/2 cups flour
- 1 1/4 cups whole wheat flour
- 1 tablespoon baking powder
- 2 teaspoons cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1 cup raisins
- 1 cup walnuts or hazelnuts, chopped

DIRECTIONS:

1. Preheat oven to 400 degrees F.
2. Mix pumpkin, brown sugar, eggs, and oil thoroughly.
3. Blend dry ingredients and add to pumpkin mixture.
4. Add raisins and nuts.
5. Drop by teaspoonfuls on greased baking sheet, 1 inch apart.
6. Gently flatten each cookie (use a spoon, bottom of glass, or palm of your hand).
7. Bake 10-12 minutes until golden brown.


