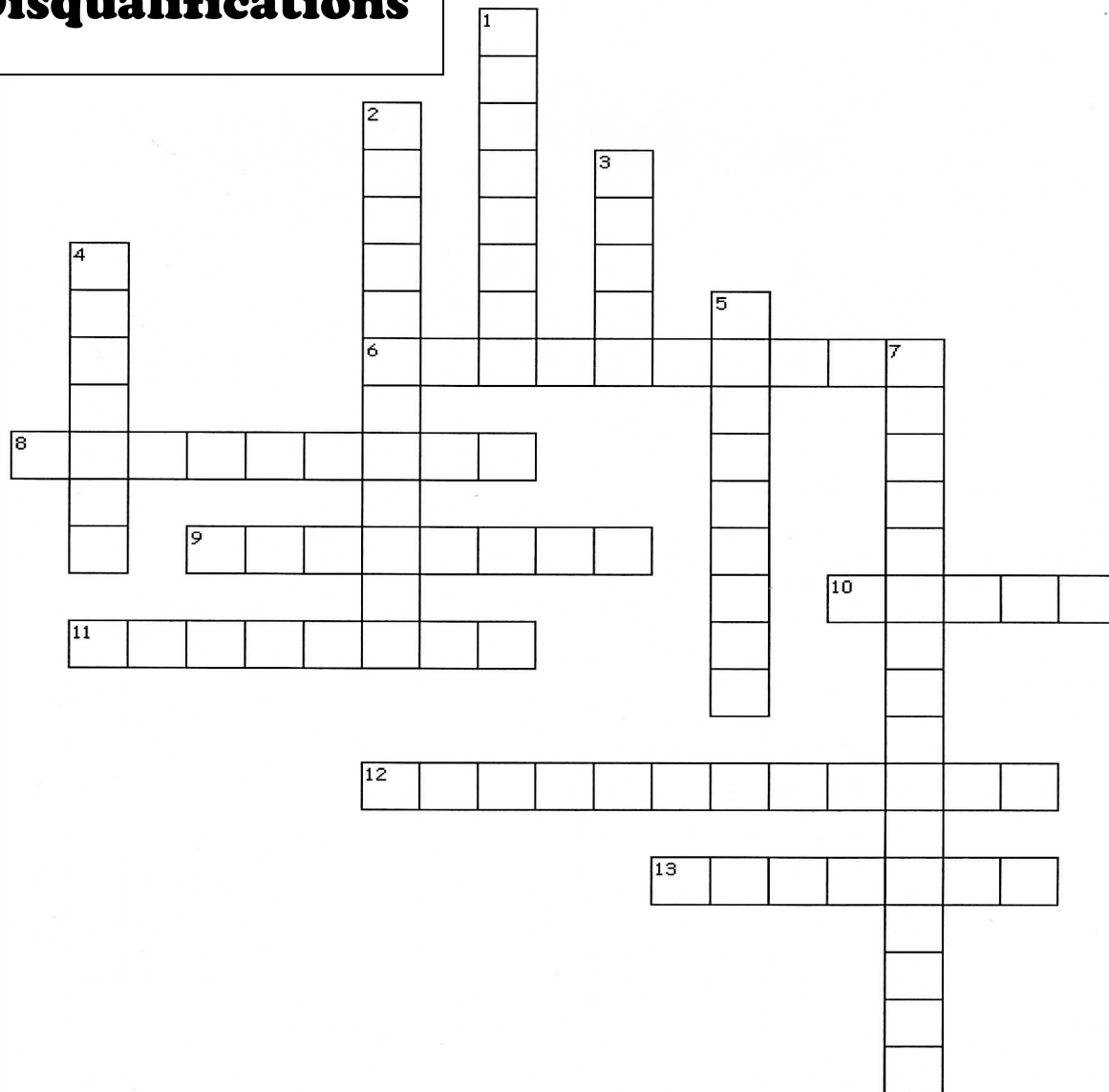

# Disqualifications



## Across

6. A purebred rabbit that has been examined and approved by an official ARBA licensed registrar.
8. The longer, coarser hair of the coat, which offers protection to the undercoat, and provides wearing quality and resilience to the coat.
9. A written record of a rabbit's ancestors, going back at least three generations on both the dam's and the sire's sides.
10. A mottling of eye color.
11. Ear canker, slobbers, potbelly, vent disease or abscesses.
12. Buck or wolf teeth.
13. Disqualify when noted in the breed standard.

## Down

1. Any dying, plucking, trimming or clipping so as to alter appearance.
2. The body structure and weight conforming to the standard type of the breed represented.
3. Thick nasal discharge must be present.
4. Protrusion of the abdominal muscle collecting between the skin and muscle.
5. Males showing only one at the time of judging.
7. One or more permanent blemishes, defects, or deformities that cause a rabbit to be ineligible for registration or competition.
