Info on Each Trip:

4-H Achievement Day Trip- This is a 1-day trip that is free to selected 4-H members in grades 7-12. The details are being worked out. Meals are included. The trip is tentative for November 2023. By indicating you are interested in being selected to attend this trip on the application you are not required to accept the invitation to attend once we give final info is given.

National 4-H Conference- National 4-H Conference delegates engage in personal

development experiences that increase their knowledge, resources, and skills while they discuss topics affecting youth and 4-H programming nationwide. The delegates choose an important societal topic and in round table groups prepare a briefing.

If you apply for this and are selected by the 4-H Awards committee to be considered for the trip you will then need to fill out the Indiana 4-H application, for this trip and may have to do a phone/zoom interview. The state 4-H office takes 9 kids from all over the state for this trip.


Stephanie Gay

Recipe of the Month:

Baked Apples and Winter Squash





- 2 cups winter squash cubes
- 2 cups apple cubes
- 1 Tablespoon vegetable oil
- ½ teaspoon cinnamon
- 1 Tablespoon sugar
- ½ teaspoon salt

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Wash hands with soap and water.
- 2. Preheat oven to 425 degrees F.
- 3. In a large bowl, combine all ingredients. Toss to coat evenly.
- 4. Spread the mixture on a baking sheet.


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- 5. Bake for 20 to 30 minutes, or until squash is soft.
- 6. Refrigerate leftovers within 2 hours,
