Next, I would like to share some notes and photos from some of our recent programs. This summer, a partnership began between Royal Center Boone-Township Public Library and myself; I joined their Tuesday coffee group in June & July for lessons on living with arthritis and meal planning. Stay tuned for future programs at the Royal Center Library.

In September, Logansport High School became one of the first groups across the state to participate in our Mock Grocery Store Simulation. Students from multiple classes gained budgeting and meal planning experience through this interactive, hands-on program. In October, we kicked off our Beginner's Guide to Grant Writing Workshop. This two-day Community Development program will conclude in November. I look forward to the November session, when participants will hear from a panel of local funders and finish their draft proposals.

## **Easy Caramel Apples**

What are your favorite parts of fall? I love a good sweatshirt, watching a scary movie, and I have yet to meet a hot chocolate I don't like. Apples are another fall favorite of mine. Nothing says fall like a warm apple crumble, or the delicious sweetness of a caramel apple. This recipe for easy caramel apples is the best of both worlds. Granola adds texture, along with fiber. What other ingredients would you mix into your caramel apples?

#### Ingredients:

1 T water

4 vanilla caramels (1oz.)
2½ cups apples, bite size pieces
½ cup ice cream or whipped topping

2 T granola

#### **Directions:**

- 1. In a small dish, combine water and unwrapped caramels.
- 2. Place apple pieces in a bowl. Cover and cook in microwave on high for 4 minutes.
- 3. Add small dish of caramels to microwave with the apple dish. Microwave for another 2 minutes until fruit is tender and caramels are soft.
- 4. Stir caramel mixture until nearly smooth.
- 5. Fold caramel mixture into the cooked apples.
- 6. Serve with ice cream or topping. Sprinkle with granola.

#### **Purdue Horticulture & Landscape Architecture Scholarship**

Availabletoa 4-Hmembermajoring inhorticulture orlandscapearchitecture at Purdue University and studied plant science in 4-H.

#### **Accomplishment Scholarship**

Available to 4-H members in grades 10-12 of high school and the year immediately following high school graduation. The purpose of the 4-H Accomplishment Scholarship is to recognize youth who have excelled in life skills development through their 4-H activities and involvement.

Categories: Animal Science—Meat and Milk Production; Animal Science—Companion and Small Animal Production; Citizenship; Communications; Engineering and Technological Science; Healthy Living, Food and Nutrition Science; Leadership Development; and Plant and Environmental Science. Three additional categories are reserved for applicants demonstrating life skills development in more than one of the previously listed categories. Those are Premier Achievement, Premier Citizenship, and Premier Leadership.

**Eligibility:** Applicants must be in grade 10, 11, 12, or their first year immediately following 4-H enrollment eligibility at the time applications are due. While an applicant does not have to be a current 4-H member, they must demonstrate multiple years of involvement in Indiana's 4-H Youth Development Program.

Youth who have previously been awarded a \$1,000 accomplishment scholarship are only eligible to compete in the Premier Achievement, Premier Citizenship, and Premier Leadership categories. Youth who have previously been awarded a \$2,000 scholarship are no longer eligible to compete in any category.

**Awards:** A minimum of thirty \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded to youth based on their demonstration of life skills development in these eight categories: Animal Science—Meat and Milk Production; Animal Science—Companion and Small Animal Production; Citizenship; Communications; Engineering and Technological Science; Healthy Living, Food, and Nutrition Science; Leadership Development; and Plant and Environmental Science.

A minimum of one \$2,000 scholarship will be awarded in each of these categories: Premier Achievement; Premier Citizenship; and Premier Leadership.


