Dear Parents,

We want to take this opportunity to welcome you and your child to the Clay Mini 4-H Program! We feel that 4-H is an educational program that responsibility, cooperation and is also enjoyable for the kids. Mini 4-H is designed boys and girls in grades K-2 during this school year.

Your job as a "Mini 4-H" parent is to guide your child in any way that you can, but suggest that you do not do the projects for him or her. It is their project and will be a teaching and learning experience for them. So, guide your child, but let him or her as much of it by themselves as they are able.

Your child may exhibit up to five projects at the county fair. The exhibit requirements are listed for each project in this manual. Your child needs have their project(s) at the fair for judging on either <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>July 10</u>, <u>OR Thursday</u>, <u>July 11 from 5 to 8 p.m.</u>

Project(s) need to have the exhibit tag with child's name attached to the project. exhibit tag is on the front cover of the respective project book. The project books will available at the next few mini meetings or you may pick them up at the extension office. Your projects will need to be picked up on <u>Thursday</u>, <u>July 18 from 6 to 9 pm or Friday</u>, <u>July 19 from 9 a.m. to Noon</u>. <u>Mini 4-H'ers may choose up to 5 exhibit hall projects</u>.

<u>Livestock Projects:</u> In addition to the animal poster project exhibit displayed in the project building at the fair, Mini 4-H'ers are also able to participate in a Mini 4-H showmanship class during each animal show. This does NOT mean that they need to purchase their own animals and bring them to the fair. Each Mini 4-H livestock exhibitor will be paired with an older 4-H member mentor that they will be able to ask questions and work with their animal project to show in the class. Mini 4-H'ers may choose to participate in up to 3 livestock species.

PROJECT EXHIBIT REQUIREMENTS

ARTS & CRAFTS

• Exhibit an 11" x 14" poster (mounted horizontally with hard backing and covered in plastic) of a geometric design, collage, drawing, or finger-painting.

BICYCLE

Choose one:

- Exhibit an 11" x 14" poster (mounted horizontally with hard backing and covered in plastic) using pictures from magazines and catalogs of bicycles.
- Exhibit a short story about you and bicycling including a picture of you and your bicycle on an 11" x 14" poster (mounted horizontally with hard backing and covered in plastic).

COLLECTIONS

Choose one:

- Exhibit an 11" x 14" poster (mounted horizontally with hard backing and covered in plastic) with three items from your collection.
- Exhibit a notebook or folder with your 3 items from your collection
- Exhibit photos of your 3 items in a poster or notebook as directed above.

CUPCAKES

• Exhibit 2 individually decorated cupcakes, decorated in a theme and displayed in a single layer, on a solid base.

DINOSAURS

Choose one:

• Find 3 pictures of dinosaurs. Write the name of the dinosaur next to it. You can use the dinosaurs in your project book or from another source. Put the pictures in a self-made notebook.

• Find 4 pictures of dinosaurs. Answer these questions for each picture. You can use the dinosaurs in your project book or from another source. Put the pictures and information in a self-made notebook.

Name of dinosaur

- Size of dinosaur

Weight of dinosaur

- Type of dinosaur

- Make a poster that shows how big dinosaurs were. Draw pictures of yourself, your house, your school, and your favorite dinosaur.
 - Give each item in your picture a name.
 - Compare the size of your dinosaur to you, your house and your school.

FLOWERS

- Exhibit a folder or notebook with pictures and identification of 10 different flowers.
- Exhibit one bloom from a flower that you grew.

FOODS

• Exhibit four cookies on a white six-inch paper plate covered with plastic from the cookie recipes in the project manual.

FORESTRY

Choose one:

- Make a poster of a tree that you have drawn. Label the parts of the tree that you have drawn. (1st year)
- Make a poster with pictures cut from a magazine or pictures taken with a camera of items that are made of wood. Use 5 to 7 pictures on your poster. (1st year)
- Exhibit a collection of leaves. They can be displayed in a notebook or a poster.
 Use 5 to 7 leaves. Label each leaf with their name. (2nd year)
- Make a poster with pictures cut out of a magazine of the different types of trees.
 Write the use of each tree by its picture. Use 5 to 7 pictures in your poster. (2nd year)

GARDENING

Choose one:

- Exhibit a plate with 3 (same type) vegetables. (Exhibit only one for larger vegetables such as watermelon or pumpkin).
- Exhibit a homegrown sweet potato plant.
- Exhibit an 11" x 14" poster (mounted horizontally with hard backing and covered in plastic) with 3 to 5 pictures of your plant or garden. Each picture should have a sentence describing the photo for identification.

I'M A HOOSIER

Choose one:

- Make a poster about Indiana's symbols and include at least 3 of the 5 symbols that you have learned about. Mini 4-H posters should be 11" x 14". Make sure it's horizontal (sideways). Title your poster: INDIANA'S SYMBOLS. You can find larger pictures of the symbols in your project manual. Color and cut out to include on your poster.
- Have your helper help you find the following Indiana symbols: tree, flower, rock, bird. Take pictures of them. Include these pictures on a poster. Be sure to tell where you took the picture and label each of the symbols. Mini 4-H posters should be 11" x 14". Make sure it's horizontal (sideways). Title your poster: INDIANA'S SYMBOLS.
- Find the page with the large-print version of the state song in your project book. Make a poster about the state song. You may use the printed version or recopy it in your own handwriting. Around the lyrics (words to the song) draw and color pictures about Indiana. The words in the song may help give you some ideas. Mini 4-H posters should be 11" x 14". Make sure it's horizontal (sideways). Title your poster: INDIANA'S STATE SONG.

LEGOS

• Exhibit a Lego built model that is an original or a Lego set. Exhibit shall not exceed 8" long x 8" wide x 12" high, including fully extended parts.

LIVESTOCK

• Exhibit an 11" x 14" poster (mounted horizontally with hard backing and covered in plastic) which includes your labeled animal diagram, a picture of yourself with your animal and a short story about your animal. (Story should include animal's name, breed, age, bought or raised, what you like best about your animal and a funny experience that happened to you and your animal.)

PET ANIMALS

• Exhibit a notebook or folder that includes at least 3 pictures of you and your pet along with a short story about your pet. Story must have a title and contain your pet's name, age, and what you feed it.

PHOTOGRAPHY

• Exhibit an 11" x 14" poster (mounted horizontally with hard backing and covered in plastic) with 5 colored pictures you have taken. Title: ME AND MY FAMILY.

ROCKETS

Choose one:

- Make a rocket using food. Use items such as marshmallows, gum drops, etc.
- Make a space helmet (page 12 in project book). Complete the activity Blast Off and the star gazing chart.

SEWING

 Exhibit a sewing box that includes at least a homemade pin cushion, homemade needlebook holder, and a button you have sewn on a piece of fabric. You may also include various sewing items in our box if you desire.

SUN, STARTS & SPACE

Choose one:

- Make a poster showing one or two different constellations. You can use the ones in the manual or you can find new ones. (1st year)
- Make a poster about one or two different planets. Label the planets and tell something about them. You can use the information in this manual or find your own. (1st year)
- Make a solar system mobile. You may use any materials that you want. Make sure you label each planet. (2nd year)
- Exhibit the asteroid that you made in Activity 3. (2nd year)

WEATHER

• Exhibit an 11" x 14" poster (mounted horizontally with hard backing and covered in plastic) with a picture/drawing of the weather one day that you observed it.

WILDLIFE ADVENTURE

Choose one:

- Make a poster showing different types of birds. You can color and cut out the birds in the manual or find your own pictures of birds. (1st year)
- Make a poster about animal characteristics from the information in Activity 6. (1st year)
- Exhibit the bird feeder that you made in Activity 2. (2nd year)

Mini 4-H Livestock Shows

A Mini 4-H member may choose to show up to 3 livestock species. This does NOT mean that they need to purchase their own animals and bring them to the fair. Each Mini 4-H livestock exhibitor will be paired with an older 4-H member mentor that they will be able to ask questions and work with their animal project to show in the class.

Members will be expected to attend a mandatory barn meeting with their assigned mentors prior to the show. This will be led by the barn superintendent. It is designed for the Mini 4-H member to become comfortable with the animal and learn what to expect during the show. More information about meeting times will be release closet to the date.

The Mini Livestock Show Schedule:

Saturday July 13th – Rabbit, Poultry and Goat Show (immediately following 4-H Rabbit Show)
Sunday July 14th – Cattle, Sheep, and Swine Show (immediately following 4-H Meat Goat Show)
Sunday July 14th – Horse (Time TBD)

*You must let the Extension Office know which livestock projects you are planning to participate in by our final Mini 4-H Meeting on June 17th in order to participate in a Mini 4-H Livestock Class at the 2024 Clay County 4-H Fair. This is so we can properly prepare for participants and assign mentors.

*If planning to participate in a livestock show, all members must have a signed Mini 4-H liability release form submitted to the Extension Office.

Mini 4-H Liability Release Form

The safety and well being of our 4-H youth is of the utmost importance. Although kindergarten is specified as the time when a child may begin participation in some 4-H events and activities, parents are encouraged to take into consideration their child's physical and mental development before agreeing to let the child begin to show, work with, or care for animals. Each child matures at a different rate, and children in grades K-2 may still be too young to begin showing, working with, or caring for animals.

The Indiana 4-H Youth Development Program at Purdue University has agreed to allow Mini 4-H members in grades K-2, to participate in NON-COMPETITIVE animal projects subject to certain conditions. These conditions are specified below.

"Mini 4-H members, in grades K through 2, will be allowed to show, work with, or care for animal projects after their parent or legal guardian has signed a liability release. Mini 4-H members may independently show, work with, or care for animals that weigh 300 pounds or less. Mini 4-H members may only show, work with, or care for animals over 300 pounds when they are assisted by a parent, legal guardian, or another adult designated in writing by parent or legal guardian." (*The word assisted means that the adult has control of the animal at all times.*) Mini 4-H members are not required to own the animals they participate with in Mini 4-H. All animals on exhibit should meet the regulations of the Indiana Board of Animal Health Requirements for Exhibition of Domestic Animals in Indiana and meet the vaccination requirements set by Indiana 4-H.

Mini 4-H members exhibiting horses must wear ASTM or SEI standard F1163 (or above) certified helmets whenever mounted. The parent/guardian is responsible to see that this specified headgear is properly fitted with the approved harness in place and fastened whenever a rider is mounted.
