PLEASE READ THIS LETTER IN ITS ENTIRETY.

2024 POULTRY MEMBER ENROLLMENT PROCEDURES: Any poultry you wish to have eligible for the Clay County 4-H Poultry Show must be included on the enclosed identification form. Please list the class, breed, color/variety, sex/ age, and size.

Sex and Age Clarification – C=Cock, H=Hen, Ckl=Cockerel and P=Pullet.

Return the Identification form included in this mailing to the Clay County Extension Office or your poultry leader by May 18th.

1. BLOOD TESTING

In 1981 Indiana became an official U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid clean state. To maintain this classification, all poultry (excluding waterfowl & pigeons) going to the county fair must be officially blood tested.

Blood testing will be offered on May 18th at the fairgrounds from 8:00 a.m. to Noon. *This will be the only day that blood testing is offered.* The cost for testing is to be determined, but is expected to be about \$1 per animal. Please make arrangements to attend! If you have any questions, please contact the Extension Office at 812-448-9041.

2. Please be sure to read the Clay County 4-H Poultry requirements in the Clay County 4-H Terms and Conditions Handbook for further rules and policies. The Clay County Terms and Conditions can be found on the Clay County 4-H Purdue Extension website at <http://tinyurl.com/2p8yd23v>

3. 4-H'ers who plan to show their poultry at the Indiana State Fair can view the project and entry requirements via their website at www.indianastatefair.com. Please refer to their website for updates and deadlines as well. Currently, the project information has not been updated for 2024, but will be available soon. When the entry information becomes available, more information will be sent out.

The dates of the 2024 Indiana State Fair are August 2 - 18. You can find the livestock schedule here: <https://bit.ly/36o6vcf>



4. **GROOMING POLICY:** 4-H Exhibitors may receive clipping and grooming assistance from members of their immediate family (father, mother, and siblings), legal guardian, from a current Indiana 4-H member, and from individuals enrolled in the Indiana 4-H Animal Ethics Program.

All groomers must be registered and approved by **July 1, 2024** to be able to assist at the Clay County fair. If you have questions on if you need to have someone register, please call the Extension Office.

5. **HEALTH:** Health papers will not be required for the poultry project. However, at fair check in the Poultry Superintendent will check for any signs of disease. The animal must not show symptoms of a communicable disease at the time of arrival and throughout the remainder of the fair week. For more information on poultry health requirements call the Indiana Board of Health at (877) 747-3038. **Animal check in is scheduled for July 12th from 6:00 to 9:00 p.m. and July 13th from 7:00 - 10:00 a.m. Animal release begins at 9:00 pm on Thursday July 18th, those who leave early without special permission are subject to penalization.**

6. **INDIANA 4-H QUALITY LIVESTOCK CARE:** *All Livestock Exhibitors must complete the Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care training.* This is a new program that is replacing the previous Youth for the Quality Assurance Program or YQCA. This program is currently only offered in-person. If you are not able to attend one of the in-person trainings, the YQCA online program will fill the requirement for the quality care training. This can be done at yqcaprogram.org. If you complete it online, you **MUST** provide your certificate of completion to the Extension Office (email it to aevinger@purdue.edu or bring it in during office hours Monday-Friday 8 am to 4 pm). Clay County Farm Bureau has generously offered to sponsor the program, so in person trainings are **FREE**. However, if you decide to complete the program via the internet, there is a \$12.00 fee.

Please call the ExtensionOffice (812-448-9093) to RSVP for an Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care training session or follow the link next to your select date to register. Members must be registered **BEFORE** attending a training.

7. **4-H LIVESTOCK AUCTION:** For 2024 we will have a live auction on **Friday July 19th** beginning at **6:00 pm** with an animal lineup that will have Beef, Dairy, Goats, Poultry, Rabbits, Sheep and Swine. The auction will follow the same guidelines as in years past with a buyer that will provide us with peg prices and animals will have the option to be shipped, processed, or kept depending on the buyer's choice. You will need to have a market animal to elect for the auction in order to be a part of it as normal procedure, these animals will not be eligible to show at the Indiana State Fair.

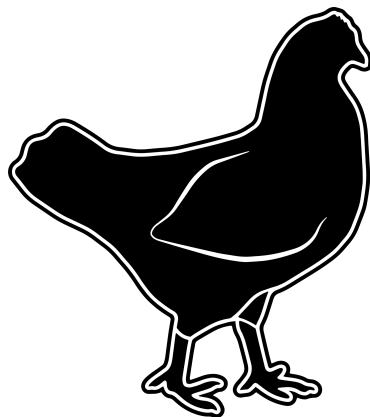

CLAY COUNTY 4-H POULTRY – ALL CHICKENS & WATERFOWL

**Updated for 2024*

4-H Poultry Club Leaders: Mitchel Riddell – (812)249-2913 (mitchriddell@gmail.com) and Derik Tipton

ENROLLMENT:

- a) All 4-H'ers are responsible for the individual care of their livestock project.
- b) Birds entered at County Fair must be owned, raised, and cared for by the 4-H'er.
- c) **Blood testing will once again be required for the 2024 year. The date for that will be:**
 - **May 18, 2024 – 8:00 am – 12:00 pm in the Poultry Barn**
 - ***All chickens & turkeys intended to be used for exhibition must be brought to this***
- d) All 4-H exhibitors will need to be enrolled in Clay County 4-H and in the poultry project by **May 15, 2024**.
- e) **FairEntry.com will NOT be used to enter Poultry.**
 - All entries must be submitted on a [paper form](#) & turned into the club leader or the Extension Office **no later than May 18** (blood testing date).
 - You can find that form [here](#), at a poultry club meeting or at the Extension Office.
- f) In each commercial/layer 4-H chicken class, two pullets or two hens constitute one entry. A 4-H'er may show a maximum of 6 or 3 different pairs of poultry of not the same variety.
- g) If you need to scratch a show entry, please let the poultry leader or the Extension Office know by **July 1, 2024**.

HEALTH:

SEE GENERAL REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL SPECIES

- a) All Poultry in state or out-of-state are required to have an official health certificate. Such animals must show no symptoms of any infectious or contagious disease and be permanently and individually identified and such identification must be clearly indicated on the accompanying health certificate; provided however, at the discretion of the state veterinarian, the health certificate may be waived in lieu of an inspection by personnel approved for this purpose by the state veterinarian.
- b) All poultry presented for exhibition shall be accompanied by an official health certificate **of veterinary inspection** or an appropriate National Poultry Improvement Plan (NPIP) certificate
- c) All poultry presented for exhibition must meet one of the following requirements:
 - Test negative for pullorum-typhoid within 90 days prior to the date of their exhibition.
 - Be hatched from eggs originating from **certified NPIP pullorum-typhoid clean flocks**.
 - Originate from a flock where the entire flock is certified NPIP pullorum-typhoid clean.
 - For more information on poultry health requirements call the Indiana State BOAH at (877) 747-3038, extension 322.
- d) No clinical signs of disease. No poultry may be exhibited showing signs of infectious or communicable disease.
- e) No external parasites. No poultry may be exhibited showing excessive signs of external parasite infestation (lice, nits, scaly leg).
- f) All poultry must be WASHED before bringing to the fair and clean when brought to the fair.

GROOMING:

4-H Exhibitors may receive clipping and grooming assistance only from members of their immediate family (father, mother, and siblings), legal guardian, from a current Indiana 4-H member, and from individuals enrolled in the Indiana 4-H Approved Animal Grooming Assistance Program. Please contact the Extension Office with questions on how to be approved or to see if you are already on the approved groomers list.

PENNING:

All 4-H'ers must provide bedding and feed and water their own chickens and waterfowl.

SHOW:

- a) All 4-H Livestock will be shown by current Clay County 4-H members only!
- b) Each bird exhibited must have been raised by the owner as part of his or her 4-H project
- c) In judging classes of birds, special attention will be given to growth, development, and production qualities.
- d) It is suggested that 4-H club members be present at the time their 4-H poultry exhibit is judged.



- e) Each 4-H member can show up to 24 birds total (one per breed/variety/sex/age).
- f) Egg Class – Exhibits 6 uniform eggs (same size & color).
- g) All waterfowl and turkeys will be brought in day of show and returned home after the Poultry show except for the turkey and meat pen ducks that are going through the auction.
- h) All poultry, pigeon & waterfowl will be judged as a blue, red, white, yellow and pink group.
- i) Commercial 4-H Chicken classes:
 - 1) Pullets: two female birds hatched between ***August 1st** and May 1st
 - 2) Hens: two female birds in laying condition hatched before ***August 1st** of current year
- j) Description of Commercial/Layer classes:
 - 1) White Ear Lobe or white shell - pullets or hens
 - 2) Red Ear Lobe or brown shell - pullets or hens
- k) Meat Type Classes
 - 1) Two Cornish type weighing 5 lbs, each or more
 - 2) Must be from club group order.
- l) The Mini 4-H Show will include Kindergarten, 1st, and 2nd graders that are enrolled in the Clay Co. Mini 4-H program and entered in the poultry project by **June 17**.

4-H STANDARD EXHIBITION CLASSES (LARGE FOWL):

- a) A 4-H'er may enter for show a maximum of one entry per class for a total of 24 birds.
- b) Judging will be judged according to the American Standard of Perfection as authorized by the American Poultry Association
- c) Description of classes by age:
 - Cock - a male bird hatched prior to ***August 1, 2023**
 - Hen - a female bird hatched prior to ***August 1, 2023**
 - Cockerel - a male bird hatched on or after ***August 1, 2023**
 - Pullet - a female bird hatched on or after ***August 1, 2023**
- d) Standards will be broken into six different classes – American, Asiatic, Continental, English, Mediterranean & All Other Standards

4-H BANTAM EXHIBITION CLASSES:

- a) 4-H'er may enter for show a maximum of one entry per class for a total of 24 birds.
- b) Judging will be judged according to the American Standard of Perfection as authorized by the American Poultry Association.
- c) Description of classes by age:
 - Cock - a male bird hatched prior to ***August 1, 2023**
 - Hen - a female bird hatched prior to ***August 1, 2023**
 - Cockerel - a male bird hatched on or after ***August 1, 2023**
 - Pullet - a female bird hatched on or after ***August 1, 2023**
- d) Bantam Exhibition classes are broken down into 5 different classes – Game, Modern Game, Single Comb Clean Legged (SCCL), Rose Comb Clean Legged (RCCL), All Other Clean Legged (AOCCL) & Feather Legged

4-H PIGEON CLASSES:

- a) A 4-H'er may enter for a maximum of one entry per class for a total of 24 birds.
- b) Birds will be judged on show condition and confirmation to the National Pigeon Association Standards
 - 1) Description of birds by age:
 - Old Cock - Male bird banded prior to **August 1, 2023**
 - Old Hen - Female bird banded prior to **August 1, 2023**
 - Young Cock - Male bird banded on or after **August 1, 2023**
 - Young Hen - Female bird banded on or after **August 1, 2023**
- c) Pigeon classes are broken down into three different types of breeds - Fancy breeds, Sporting breeds & Utility breeds



4-H COMMERCIAL/MEAT PEN WATER FOWL CLASSES:

A 4-H'er may enter a maximum of two birds of same of the same sex and variety weighing over 5 lbs. each or more, one pair (same sex) of any age for a total of Four birds.

4-H EXHIBITION WATER FOWL CLASSES:

- a) 4-H'er may enter for show a maximum of one entry per class for a total of 24 birds.
- b) One male and one female constitute one meat pen pair.
- c) One male or female may be shown as a single.
- d) Birds will be judged according to the American Standard of Perfection as authorized by the American Poultry Association
 - Old Drake- Male bird hatched prior to **August 1, 2023**
 - Old Duck - Female bird hatched prior to **August 1, 2023**
 - Young Drake - Male bird hatched on or after **August 1, 2023**
 - Young Duck - Female bird hatched on or after **August 1, 2023**

4-H TURKEY CLASSES

- a) All Turkeys Compete in one of 4 classes - Old Tom, Young Tom, Old Hen & Young Hen

4-H QUAIL CLASS

- a) Shown as 2 birds per cage.

POULTRY SHOWMANSHIP:

4-H'ers will demonstrate their ability to present birds that are clean, healthy, trained and manageable, along with the techniques of proper display. This activity provides an opportunity to competitively demonstrate one's knowledge and skill in raising, conditioning, evaluating and handling poultry. (See 4-H manual number 679, "4-H Poultry Showmanship", available from the county Extension office for details.) **Must be entered in live poultry to participate in showmanship.**

- a) **JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP**_ for 4-H members in the 3rd, 4th or 5th grade on January 1 of the current year.
- b) **INTERMEDIATE SHOWMANSHIP**_ for 4-H members in the 6th, 7th or 8th grade on January 1 of the current year.
- c) **SENIOR SHOWMANSHIP**_ for 4-H members in the 9th grade or above on January 1 of the current year.

Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care Training

To exhibit beef cattle, dairy cattle, swine, sheep, goats, poultry and rabbits, 4-H members must be certified through the Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care Training. This is an annual program that can be completed in-person by attending one of the classes on the following dates at the Fairgrounds:

- **March 25, 2024**
- **April 30, 2024**
- **May 22, 2024**
- **June 19, 2024**

An online option is available for \$12 through the YQCA program. Once you complete this online course, you must email the Extension Office your final certificate emailed to you at completion showing your certification number.

CLAY COUNTY 4-H LIVESTOCK AUCTION:

To be in the AUCTION you MUST be in a minimum of 3 entries.

The Livestock Auction/Benefit for the Barns Event will be held upon the conclusion of the fair. In order to be eligible, you must show an animal at the fair and have a designated animal for auction. A small percentage auction fee will be deducted from each member's check. Detailed auction information will be finalized closer to fair.
