



CARE OF ANIMAL EXHIBITS

4-H Exhibitors are completely responsible for the care and custody of animal exhibits at the Daviess County 4-H Fair. Exhibitors shall be responsible for the continuous care, grooming, and preparation of their own animals entered into the Fair and are expected to actively participate in the fitting of their animal for show.

PENS/STALLS

4-H Exhibitors are required for the cleanliness and upkeep of the pens/stalls of their animals. Reminder: community members will be there to observe and admire your animal exhibits

4-H members are not to tamper with other exhibitor's pens or animals. If a 4-H member is concerned for the well-being of another animal, they should contact a livestock committee member, livestock chairman, or 4-H Educator before taking any action on their own.

- -Final day for pen reservations
- o This is how you tell us what projects and animals you will be bringing to the fair. This is an important step every year, but this year it is more important than ever before.
- Fair Entry directions have been emailed to you through 4HOnline and are available in the Fair Newsletter.
- You will use the same family 4Honline login that you used when enrolling for 4-H.
- o It is important this year that you complete your entries online at Fair Entry. Think of this as your preregistration for your show. This will save a lot of time when you arrive at the fair and help us have a fast check-in and turnaround to show time.
- o You will find the following projects located in the corresponding departments;
- § State Projects (building projects that are state fair eligible)
- § County Specific Projects (building projects that are not state fair eligible and are county only projects, ex. scrapbooking, Americana)
- § Livestock (Find your species listed as a department.)
- § State Garden (All possible Garden exhibits)
- o When finished entering the projects, you will click on the "continue to payment." There is no charge for entries. Continue as instructed.



· Community judging will be offered for ALL projects. This means, 4-H members have the opportunity to come in on Saturday morning and sit down with a judge to talk about their 4-H projects. This provides youth the opportunity to share with the judge all of the processes they went through to complete their project, and to hear one-on-one feedback from the judges. 4-H members will still receive comment cards for their projects, but an in-person interaction with a judge is a very valuable experience. While it is not required for 4-H members to participate in community judging, it is HIGHLY encouraged.
