Fair Entry information was emailed to you recently. That portal is open until July 1st. You must log in to Fair Entry (using your same information as 4HOnline) and declare what projects you are bringing to the fair. For example, you may have signed up for Sheep in 4HOnline (and registered your animal on time), and in Fair Entry, you declare that you have a Shropshire Ewe. Another example would be that you signed up for Arts and Crafts, and in Fair Entry, you declare that you are bringing an oil painting.

Make sure to attend your club meetings in June as your leaders will prepare you for upcoming 4-H Fair responsibilities and deadlines.

Lastly, as you are working on and finishing your 4-H projects, make sure you are having fun and enjoying the process. Don't just throw something together because you "have" to. Have fun, make mistakes, and recognize the learning and knowledge you're gaining in the process.

10-Year Member Info

All 10-year members should have received an email with a short survey and the request for a senior picture. **If you have not submitted a picture, please do so immediately.** We will use that information at livestock shows, for the 4-H Handbook, and to recognize you all publicly throughout the year.



1. Go to the Fair Entry website at <https://daviess-county.fairentry.com>
2. Sign in using your 4HOnline email and password.
3. Follow instructions on screen to register an exhibitor and then add entries for that exhibitor.
4. Add other exhibitors (siblings) if needed. It is easiest if siblings register at the same time and your family submits one registration. Otherwise, you will need to wait until the first one is approved before you continue.
5. When all exhibitors and entries have been added, click "Continue to Payment" (payment due **cost per tag** will be \$0.00).
6. When everything is finished, click on the green "Submit" button.
7. You will receive an email when the registration is submitted and then another email letting you know if your entry was approved or rejected. If your entry was rejected, a reason will be listed and you will be able to log in and fix the problem before submitting that entry again.

A copy of the 2025 4-H Vaccination form 671-W (Rev. 11/21) will be required and if you are not a 4-H member, a copy of your vaccination records with rabies certificate will be required. Also, if you are not a 4-H member, the attached release form must be completed prior to participating in the show. We will follow the 4-H Agility Rules at the Agility Fun Match.

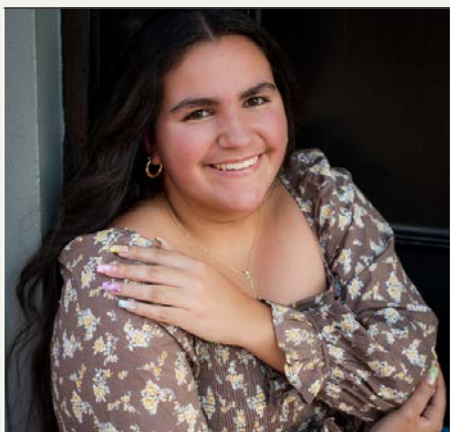

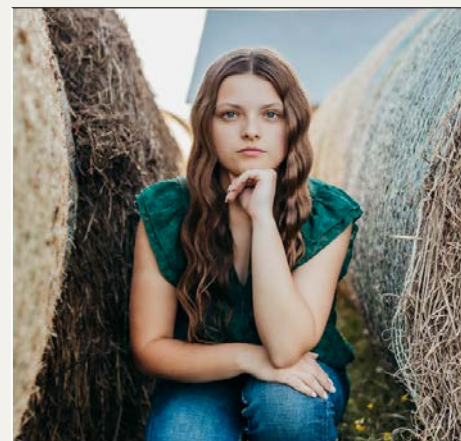
