Dear 4-H Family,

It is 22 days from the day I am writing this newsletter till fair set-up and 25 days until project check-in! Are you ready for the 4-H Fair?

Don't forget to buy some extra food items to donate to the "Stock the Trailer" during Fair Week. Items will be donated to local food pantries in Dearborn County.

For Livestock exhibitors, animals will be release after the auction on Friday, June 21st or before 8 am on Saturday, June 22. Exhibit Hall projects will be released on Friday night June 21 from 7-9 pm or before 8 am Saturday morning.

Fair Clean up is Saturday, June 22 from 8 am-4 pm. The Exhibit Hall awards program will be held on the 22 after clean-up at 3:00pm.

Remember while there is no gate fee to collect, donations will be accepted and Clubs are asked to work one day at the front and side gates to count fair-goers and help collect food donations for the Fight Hunger Stock Trailer. Two clubs will partner to provide workers each day covering two shifts per day. Please see page 6 for details. Parents are asked to step up and assist, as they are no longer needed to help monitor Agner Hall projects during the fair. 4-H Board of Director members may be reaching out to you to ask for your help with Fair tasks.

Things You Need to Know

- SCAM Alert!! 4-H Board of Director or Fair Board members will never ask for money through and email. If you get an email, do not open; trash it!
- 4-H Clubs will have a fundraising opportunity during the livestock auction this year. If clubs wish to participate, they may offer one basket to be included in the silent auction. Proceeds from the basket sale will go directly to clubs. If interested, please let Ellen Bruce know at 859-240-7913.
- Mentor Opportunity-In an effort to be of support to all Indiana youth getting ready for life beyond high school, Indiana 4-H has become an approved intermediary to provide Career Discovery Meetings in Indiana high schools beginning in Fall 2024.

As stated in guidance provided to Indiana schools in March 2024 "House Enrolled Act (HEA) 1002-2023 states students in grades 11 and 12 must meet for at least thirty (30) minutes, in person, with an approved postsecondary institution, intermediary, employer, or labor organization to discuss future career opportunities and their necessary education levels." 



Dearborn County 4H Club Leaders,

The 4-H Board along with the Fair Board, have decided that for the 2024 Dearborn County 4-H Fair this year each club will be assigned to work the front and side gates for one (1) day. A day will be assigned to each club. Clubs will be partnered up and will be assigned to cover two (2) shifts for the day. Monday-Thursday, the 1st shift is 4:30pm to 7:30pm and the 2nd shift is 7:15pm to 10pm. On Friday, the 1st shift is 3:30pm to 7:30pm and the 2nd shift is 7:15pm to 11pm.

There will need to be four (4) people, a minimum of two (2) adults and two (2) 4H members at the FRONT gate and one (1) adult and two (2) 4H members at the SIDE gate. You may have more, but please keep in mind there MUST be at least two adults minimum at the FRONT gate and at least one adult minimum at the SIDE gate.

Gate duties are as follows:

FRONT GATE: (If a Board member is needed, you can radio the office for one)

- 1. Monitor the Freewill donation bucket.
- 2. Use the counter to track the number of people coming into the Front gate.
- 3. Take food donations for the Fill the Trailer, Feed the Hungry Program and place donations into the trailer.
- 4. Help with basic Fair information if fair goer has any questions.


SIDE GATE: (If a Board member is needed, you can radio the office for one)

- 1. **NO ENTRY,** by anyone, unless designated in #4, for any reason after 4:45pm Monday through Thursday and 3:45pm on Friday. This is in place for the safety of our 4H'ers, vendors, and attendees and MUST be done.
- 2. Any violation of the gate entry could result in the Fire Marshall issuing a fine and/or shutting down the Fair.
- 3. Any person needing assistance after 4:45p Monday Thursday and 3:45p on Friday with 4H animal supplies, vendor supplies, the elderly, etc. the gate worker will radio the Fair office for assistance with a golf cart. ABSOLUTELY NO VEHICLE ENTRY AFTER DESIGNATED TIMES.
- 4. The only exception(s) is an emergency vehicle or a 4H or Fair board member who will be working the fair different hours throughout the week.
