



## Grain - Corn

### Description:

The 4-H Grain Corn project provides youth with educational information about general grain knowledge.

### Decatur County Expectations

**THIS IS A COUNTY ONLY PROJECT.** Project manuals will need to be presented at the time of judging. Participants should complete two activities per year from the project book. Green books can be utilized to hold record sheets and project manuals. The information card will be provided by the office. **4-H youth must have been enrolled in the Corn project the previous year to be eligible for the Grain - Corn project.**

### Exhibit Guidelines

All exhibits will be judged together within a division. Blue, red, and white ribbons will be given on the quality if the exhibit as determined by the judge. A Champion and Reserve Champion will be selected in each division at the discretion of the judge. From the Champions, a Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion will be selected.

This project will show the complete process from planting through harvest.

### Exhibit Class Guidelines:

#### *Beginner (grades 4-6)*

Youth will exhibit five (5) ears of produce and/or one (1) gallon shelled corn (preferably in a glass jar). Members may select dent corn, sweet corn or popcorn. An information card containing hybrid and yield must be included with the exhibit.

#### *Intermediate (grades 7-9 suggested)*

Youth will exhibit ten (10) ears of produce and/or one (1) gallon shelled corn (preferably in a glass jar). Members may select dent corn, sweet corn or popcorn. An information card containing hybrid and yield must be included with the exhibit.

*Advanced (grades 10-12 suggested)*

Youth will exhibit ten (10) ears of produce and/or one (1) gallon shelled corn (preferably in a glass jar). Members may select dent corn, sweet corn or popcorn. An information card containing hybrid and yield must be included with the exhibit.
