4-H Around the World

Did you know that the 4-H program is an international program? Over 70 countries have an independent, country led 4-H program. There are nearly 7 million 4-H members world-wide, and 4-H has a goal to reach 20 million members by 2025. The 4-H emblem and projects may change country to country, but the values of the program remain the same. Civic engagement is not only important in your community, but it is also important to practice the skill of global citizenship.

How is 4-H different around the world? In Kenya, the goal of 4-H is expose youth to agricultural career opportunities, develop youth into responsible leaders, and create Agribusiness mentor-ship centers in communities. In Costa Rica, the 4-H program is known as "4-s", and their mission is

to organize youth and rural women to participate in agribusiness. In Cameroon, the mission is to make poverty history in their community and with members ranging from 12-45 years old. 4-H Norge (Norway), has a different but familiar 4-H pledge than what we are used to hearing in the U.S. "We promise to work towards the goal of becoming a youth with a clear Head (klart hode), warm Heart (varmt hjerte), clever Hands (flinke hender) and good Health (god helse)."

4-H may look different in the other 70 countries. There may not be a livestock show or ID days for livestock, but we all share the key fundamentals of what the 4-H program is. So, we are not that different after all.

Putting Your Poster Over the Top

A Successful Poster...

- Catches the eye.
- Is simple and clear.
- Makes people stop, read, and remember.

Planning a Poster

- Who are your viewers?
- What do you want them to know?
- Think of a clever theme or slogan.
- Make a small rough sketch. Remember to leave some blank space because uncluttered posters are easier to read.

Basic Poster Requirements

- ***Refer to the 2026 DeKalb Co. 4-H Handbook, "Poster Guidelines," and the specific requirements for your project(s). Always read and understand all the rules for your project before doing anything.***
- Orientation: All 4-H posters must be horizontal (exception: some photography exhibits).



HORIZONTAL
(HOW YOU SLEEP)



VERTICAL
(HOW YOU STAND)

- Size: All posters must be 22" X 28" (exceptions: some photography exhibits and mini 4-H).
- All poster projects must contain a stiff backing the same size as the poster, and poster board alone is not acceptable.

- All poster projects must be covered with some kind of clear plastic sheeting for protection. Plastic sleeves are available from the Extension Office for a small fee.
- All poster projects should have a label in the lower right corner with the exhibitor's name, township, and grade. Refer to the Handbook and specific project requirements for other information to be included.
- All poster projects should include a reference list indicating where information was obtained. Refer to Handbook for guidelines for this list.

Materials

- Foam board, mat board, poster board, etc. and stiff backing.
- Clear plastic
- Variety of colored papers
- Double-stick tape or glue
- Markers or paints
- Scissors or paper cutter
- Ruler and pencil
- Letters
- Stencils
- Stickers
- Computer and printer

Choosing Colors

- Color combinations affect how easily the message is read as well as the overall appearance of the poster.
- Avoid using too many different colors for the purpose of letters and backgrounds. Two or three should be sufficient. Color photos or clipart may be added to enhance your poster, but be sure they don't overwhelm your main point.
- Let the most important items be the most important color.
- Consider the contrast, which means use dark letters on a light background and light letters on a dark background.



Analogous colors are any three colors which are side by side on a 12-part color wheel. Complementary colors are any two colors which are directly opposite each other. This creates maximum contrast.

- Use the color wheel to help you choose colors.

- Consider the color context, which is how color behaves in relation to other colors. Compare the contrast effects of different color backgrounds for the same red square on the diagram below:

Lettering

- Lower case letters are easier to read than all capitals. Use capitals for emphasizing an important phrase or idea or to add variety.
- Avoid fancy or script lettering because it can be hard to read.
- Letters may be cut out by hand or by machine (i.e., Cricut), precut letters may be purchased, or headings may be produced on the computer and then affixed to the poster.

- Use different size lettering for items of varying importance.
- Allow margins to keep items from running together and looking too cluttered.
- Refer to the table below for letter sizes and their effectiveness:

The Three R's of Posters - Revise, Rearrange & Redo

- Using your original sketch, lay out all your components on your poster. How does it look? Revise and rearrange as needed. Redo anything that should be a different color or size. Move things around until you're happy with the overall effect and message of your poster.

LETTER SIZE	VIEWING DISTANCE
¼ Inch	8 Feet
½ Inch	16 Feet
1 Inch	32 Feet
2 Inches	64 Feet

- Ask your parents/guardians, project helpers, other 4-H members, or leaders to look at your poster and tell you what they think.
- Affix everything in place.

- Remember – **NEATNESS COUNTS!!!**

Advice for Current 4-H Members: Is to try as many projects as you can, you learn something different from each one.



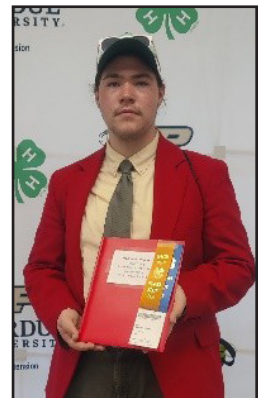
George Williams

If you choose to complete the YQCA option, you will register for the online course at <https://yqcaprogram.org/> Cost of the online YQCA course is \$12.

After completing the course, you must email the 4-H Educator your certificate to receive credit.

If you prefer to take the QLC in person (Instructor-Led), the cost is \$3 per child and will be located at the Exhibit Hall (Fairgrounds); Registration is open now in 4-H Online!

SUNDAY, JULY 12

As a requirement to exhibit your static projects, you **MUST** enter all of your static (non-animal) projects and Summer Goats into FairEntry between June 1 and July 1.

- You will use your 4HOnline login email and password to get into the system and register your exhibit(s) for the project(s) you are enrolled in. Be sure to check the Summer Checklist in the DeKalb 4-H Hub to make sure you are ready! Link: <https://bit.ly/DeKalb4HHub>
- You'll need to plan for the exhibit label when you plan your project.

The exhibit label is 2.8 inches wide by 5.5 inches tall.

- You will receive your label during the appointed Check-In times listed in the Summer Judging

Schedule, so make sure to bring tape or string to affix the label to your project

- You'll be required to provide a description of your project. If you need to change that description when you check in your projects, that's ok. Just give us your best guess what you will be bringing. For posters, please use the title of the poster.

4-H SUMMER GOAT DOE EXHIBITORS

If you did not attend a Goat Workshop, you will need to complete a worksheet to be eligible to exhibit your animal in the Summer Goat Doe Show.

Worksheets are available on the website (to print out) at <https://bit.ly/DeKalb4HHub> or contact the office at (260) 925-2562 to have one sent to you.

Worksheets are **DUE BY JULY 1** for those exhibiting Goat Does.

SCRAPIES TAGS

If you are showing sheep or goats, the animal you purchase should come with a Scrapies tag, by law.

If your animal does not come with one, or your animal was born on your farm, you'll need to apply for a flock ID through the Board of Animal Health (BOAH) at <https://www.in.gov/boah/2669.htm>



We will NOT be providing Scrapies tags at ID Day.

PREMISE ID NUMBERS

If you are showing cattle, swine, sheep, goats, rabbits or poultry you are required by law to apply for a Premise ID number from the Indiana Board of Animal Health (BOAH). You will need this number to nominate your animals, so get your number at <https://www.in.gov/boah/2700.htm> now!

SWINE TAGS ARE FREE

Two options to get your pigs tagged:

1. **Schedule a time to have your pigs tagged at your farm by a Swine Committee member.**
 - \$20 per farm visit (All money will be put in the 4-H Council fund).
 - On-farm tagging will take place around June 10–June 25
 - To schedule a time, text or call Kevin Days at 260-243-0266 or another Swine Committee member.

2. **June 20 - Swine ID & Free Tagging**

8:00-10:00 am - Horse Pavilion **all tagging must be witnessed by a swine committee member and tags are free for 2026.

Pigs must be tagged and photos submitted by July 1st.
