Enrollment will remain open until May 15, 2024 but enrolling by **January 15, 2024** will ensure that you do not miss out on trips and events.

COST: \$25 4-H Fee* (Grades 3-12) - Paid at time of enrollment (\$25* each for up to three children, \$10* for each additional child) \$5 for Mini 4-H (Grades K-2) - Paid at first meeting in May

4-H Fees are non-refundable and paid at the time of registration.

The fee can be paid online with credit or debit card or at the Extension Office with cash or check. **The Extension Office cannot take credit cards.**
