

The Delaware County 4-H Council Scholarship

Applications are due April 1.

Purpose:

1. To recognize and reward deserving youth by providing funds to help pay for their educational needs beyond high school.
2. To encourage youth to develop leadership, citizenship, and communication skills that will assist them in becoming good citizens in the community in which they live and work.

Rules and Criteria:

1. The applicant must be a high school senior or graduate of an accredited high school, pursuing or planning to pursue post-high school education.
2. The applicant must be an active member of a Delaware County 4-H Club and must have *completed* at least *five years* of 4-H.
3. The scholarship may be used at any accredited college, university, or vocational/trade school.
4. The scholarship may be used for a four-year, two-year, or short course.
5. The scholarship must be used within one year of the date awarded.
6. Grades will not be a factor, except to indicate evidence of effort and willingness to attain goals.
7. Candidates must complete an application and secure two letters of recommendation. One letter of recommendation must be from a 4-H Leader. Individuals other than parents should write letters of recommendation. These letters may be included with the application or they may be sent by the person compiling the recommendation directly to the Delaware County Extension Office.
8. Applications should be typed.

Notification

- Winners will be notified at appropriate time and place after being selected.

Receipt of Money

- Money may be requested upon completing a term of study. Proof of this must be shown in the form of school grade report or completion certificate showing student's academic good standing.
- Checks will be made payable directly to the student.
