

## FairEntry Cheat Sheet for 2022 Fair

### Beef

- Heifer classes
  - Senior Calves-Born between Sept. 1 and Dec. 31 of preceding year.
  - Summer Yearlings- Born between May 1 and Aug. 31 of preceding year.
  - Junior Yearlings- Born between Jan. 1 and April 30 of preceding year
  - Senior Yearlings-Born between Sept. 1 and Dec. 31, two years previous (if in milk will show in cow class)
- Feeder calf
  - Must be under 1,000 lbs.
- Cow/Calf class
  - The calf must be less than 6 months at show date.

### Dairy

- Junior Calf – Born March 1<sup>st</sup> or later. Must be at least 4 months old
- Fall Senior Calf – Born December 1<sup>st</sup> 2021 to February 28 2022
- Senior Calf – born September 1<sup>st</sup> of 2021 to November 30 2021
- Summer Junior Yearling – Born June 1<sup>st</sup> 2021 to August 31 2021
- Junior Yearling – Born March 1<sup>st</sup> 2021 to May 31 2021
- Intermediate Senior Yearling – Born December 1<sup>st</sup> 2020 to February 28 2021
- Senior Yearling – Born September 1<sup>st</sup> 2020 to November 30 2020
- 2-year-old cow – Born September 1<sup>st</sup> 2019 to August 31, 2020
- 3-year-old cow – Born September 1<sup>st</sup> 2018 to August 31, 2019
- 4-year-old cow – Born September 1<sup>st</sup> 2017 to August 31, 2018
- Aged Cow – Born prior to August 31, 2017

### Goats

#### Wether Classes (Males)

- Meat Goat Division
  - Classes will be decided by weight
- Dairy Division
  - Classes will be decided by weight
- Pygmy Division
  - Classes will be decided by weight

#### Females

- Meat Goats Only - Market Doe Classes
  - Classes will be decided by weight
- Pygmy Breeding Classes
  - Junior Division - Does never freshened
    - Born April thru July of show year (0 to 3 months)
    - Born March of show year (4 months)
    - Born February of show year (5 months)

- Born December of previous year thru January of show year (6 to 7 months)
    - Born August thru November of previous year (8 to under 12 months)
    - 13 to under 24 months never freshened
  - Senior Division - Does that have freshened
    - 1 Yr. Old that has freshened
    - 2 Yr. Old to 3 Yr. Old
    - 3 Yr. Old to 4 Yr. Old
    - 4 Yr. Old to 5 Yr. Old
    - 5 Yr. Old and Up
- Pygmy Herd Class - Three breeding females from the same herd
- Meat Goat Breeding Classes:
  - Junior Division – Does never freshened
    - Born April thru July of show year (0 to 3 months)
    - Born March of show year (4 months)
    - Born February of show year (5 months)
    - Born December of previous year thru January of show year (6 – 7 Months)
    - Born August thru November of previous year (8 to under 12 months)
    - 13 to under 24 months never freshened.
  - Senior Division – Does that have freshened
    - 1 Yr. Old that has freshened
    - 2 Yr. Old to 3 Yr. Old
    - Over 3 Yr. Old and up
- Meat Goat Herd Class – Three breeding females from the same herd
- Dairy Goat Classes:
  - Junior Division – Does not in milk and never freshened
    - Junior kid – April 1 or after of show year
    - Intermediate kid – March 1 to March 31 of show year
    - Senior kid – January 1 to February 28/29 of show year
    - Dry yearling – July 1 to December 31 of previous year
  - Senior Division – Does in milk
    - Milking Yearling – Under 2 years old in milk
    - 2 Yr. Old – 2 years old and under 3 years, in milk
    - 3 to 4 Yr. Old – 3 or 4 years old and under 5 years, in milk
    - Aged Doe – 5 Years and over, in milk
    - Dry Doe – Does that have previously freshened but are now dry.
- Dairy Herd Class – Three breeding females from the same herd.

Sheep (Each lamb can only be shown as a Breeding or Market...Must choose one!!)

- Ewe lambs, breeding class
  - Must be under 1 year of age.
- Yearling Ewes, breeding class
  - Ewes in this class must be older than 1 year of age, but less than 2 years of age.
- Ram Lambs, breeding class
  - Rams must be under 1 year of age.
- Market Class
  - Must be under 1 year of age. Class is determined by breed and weight.

Swine

- Swine gilts can be decided on breeding gilt or market gilt.
- Classes will be broken out by weight. No more than 10 swine will be in the ring
