Goat Club Rule/ Regulations

4-H Member Information:

- Enrollment deadline for 4-H is January 15, 2023in order to exhibit at the Elkhart Co. 4-H Fair and the Indiana State Fair. <u>Enrollment deadline for the Elkhart County 4-H Goat Club is March 15, 2023.</u>
- > We encourage all 4-H members and parents to attend meetings and activities to get the full benefit of 4-H.
- > Officers of the Goat Club must be 7^{th} grade or older.
- The 4-H Goat Club Advisory Board, Adult Leaders, and the 4-H Corporation will rule on special problems arising at the 4-H Fair. Their decision will be final.
- > Essays are to be turned in to your Goat Club leaders by July Meeting of current year.
- Participation fee will be \$20.00 per 4-H'er for the 1st two family member with a family maximum or \$50.00. Fees must be paid before auction numbers can be drawn.
- > The club's queen candidate must have been a member of the Goat Club the previous year.

Animal Information:

- 4-H'ers may enter as many animals as they own or lease but may only show two per class. 4-H animals exhibited in open shows after the enrollment deadline of May 15, 2023, under a different name than the person listed on the Indiana 4-H enrollment form, shall not be eligible to be shown in the 4-H show at the Elkhart County 4-H Fair or the 4-H show at the Indiana State Fair. This term/condition does not apply to siblings, who may show each other's animals at any show during the year without jeopardizing State Fair eligibility, regardless of whether the sibling is a 4-H member or not.
- Each 4-H member must complete 4H <u>online enrollment</u> of all goats they are planning on exhibiting by the May 15, 2023 deadline. NO EXCEPTIONS.
- > All goats must have permanent ID and come to the fair with a collar.
- All goats brought to the fair must be shown in a class except nursing kids less than one month. Only nursing buckling(under 8 weeks of age), no bucks.
- An Animal Quality Assurance program has been implemented by the state and all 4-H Goat Club members must complete this training course by May 15, 2023 or they will not be able to show at county or state levels.
- All goats brought from another state for the 4-H show must have health papers certified by a licensed veterinarian. NO EXCEPTIONS!

4-Her Born and Raised Classification:

- > The goat must be born to a doe that the 4-Her owns at the time of breeding..
- We are trusting the 4-Her and the family to give us truthful information regarding the "4-Her Bred and Owned" status.
- Market goats with this status will be tagged with a different color tag at tagging/weigh-in days.
- Breeding stock that is born and raised must be noted at goat check-in in order to be eligible for this status. This must be done by noon on the first Saturday of the fair.

Fair Check-In:

- Goats are to be brought to the fair on Friday, July 21, 2023 between the hours of 8 a.m. and 4p.m. Goats must be checked by an official before entering the barn and all market goats weighed before penning. Any health issues will be taken before the fairground's veterinarian before the animal may enter the barn. Results of the Veterinarian's findings are final. (Prior arrangements for check-in other than the announced time frame must be cleared with one of the Goat Club leaders.)
- Once entered, no animal will be allowed off the fairgrounds without advisory board/organizational leaders approval. Animals will be released Thursday evening after Round Robin and Friday up to 9:00 a.m., but no sooner than one hour after the sale. Breeding stock animals may be taken home after the Monday show with approval of the leaders. Exceptions to this early Monday release are those animals that won Grand Champion or Reserve Champion in the 4-H Show. Those entered in the open show will remain in the barn until the completion of that show on Saturday. Special requests to leave outside the above instructions must be addressed to the Advisory Board and/or Organizational Leaders.
 - Pen fees of \$3 per goat, brought to the fair, will be collected when checking in goats the first Friday of the fair. Those that have not paid their fees, including dues, will not be allowed to show or go through the auction.
 - All goats including market animals and breeding stock must be checked in by 12 noon on Saturday, July 22, 2023. This must be done in the goat barn office. Please make sure to go online before July 1st to enroll you goats in the proper classes so that check-in can be expedited.

Fair Goat Care:

- > Members are required to keep their goat's pen clean including the area surrounding the pen.
- > Animals must be fed twice a day during the fair.
- Members must supply their own grain and hay.
- Water must be changed often.
- PENS MUST BE CLEANED AT LEAST EVERY OTHER DAY. Pens will be evaluated daily for cleanliness, water, and feeding. Members will be contacted if issues arise regarding their goat's care.

Showing:

- Members are expected to do their own showing with help as needed. In case of illness or injury, another eligible Elkhart County 4-H Goat Club member may show the animal with the permission of the advisory board/leaders. If members have more than one goat in a class another eligible Elkhart County 4-H Goat Club member is allowed to show the second animal.
- Attire for showing breeding stock dairy goats should be a white shirt with white pants, black pants, nice dark jeans, or a skirt of one of the corresponding colors. Please wear appropriate under garments, a belt, and close toed shoes. No shorts or sandals are allowed.
- All 4-H'ers showing market goats, pygmy goats, and fiber goats should wear the club t-Shirt and nice jeans with a belt and close toed shoes. Shorts and sandals are not allowed. A nice dress shirt can replace the club T-Shirt during showmanship.
- All goats competing for championship honors in the milk classes may be required by the judge to milk their goat out before the final awards are made.
- > Every goat entered in the dairy doe classes must be FREE OF HORNS.
- Pygmy, meat breeding stock, and angora goats may have horns in accordance with their national association rules. Market animals may have horns at the 4-H'er's preference.

4-H Exhibitors may receive clipping and grooming assistance from members of their immediate family which includes: father, mother, siblings, legal guardians or grandparents, or from a current Elkhart County 4-H Goat Club Member. This will be enforced by the Advisory Board.

Scholarships

The 4-H Goat Club offers three \$250 scholarships a year to 4-H Goat Club members that submit an application and essay. The applications are available from your Organizational Leaders. The essay should be about your experiences with goats, 4-H, what you have learned in the club, and your future plans. Any additional information you would like to include is welcome. The applications and essays are due at the July meeting (no exceptions). The advisory board will review the applications and essays and will chose the three 4-Her's that they feel are most deserving of the scholarships. Winners will be announced before the 4-H Goat Club show on July 29, 2023.

Showmanship Classification

Dairy Goat Showmanship

All members are encouraged to participate in showmanship classes. The animal used in showmanship <u>MUST</u> be your own animal. An animal can only be used by one club member for showmanship. The classes will be divided as follows:

Greenhand	Grade 3 as of Sept 1, 2022
Junior	Grades 4 & 5 as of Sept 1, 2022
Intermediate	Grades 6-8 as of Sept. 1, 2022
Senior	Grades 9-12 as of Sept. 1, 2022
Master	Previous Senior Winners

- 1. 4-H members are eligible to win in Junior, Intermediate, and Senior Showmanship only once. A previous winner in the Junior division automatically moves up to the Intermediate division; and the Intermediate winner, regardless of age, moves up to the Senior Division the following year.
- 2. Senior winner as well as the Junior and Intermediate winners of the day and past winners in Senior or Master compete for the Master if they have not won Round Robin. The winner goes on to the Large Animal Round Robin.
- 3. After the Master is chosen, the runner-up for whatever division they are from will compete for runner-up Master Dairy Showman in the event that the Master Dairy Showman does not go to Round Robin.

Meat Goat & Variety Goat Showmanship

All members are encouraged to participate in showmanship classes. The animal used in Showmanship MUST be your own animal. An animal can only be used by one club member for showmanship. The classes will be divided as follows:

Junior	Grades 4 & 5 as of Sept. 1, 2022
Intermediate	Grades 6-8 as of Sept. 1, 2022
Senior	Grades 9-12 as of Sept. 1, 2022
Master	Previous Senior Winners

- 1. 4-H members are eligible to win in Junior, Intermediate, and Senior Showmanship only once. A previous winner in the Junior division automatically moves up to the Intermediate division; and the Intermediate winner, regardless of age, moves up to the Senior Division the following year.
- 2. Senior winner of the day as well as the Junior and Intermediate winners and past winners in Senior or Master compete for the Master if they have not won Round Robin. A Runner-up will be chosen from each division (Variety and Meat).
- 3. The Master Variety Goat showmanship winner and the Master Meat Showman will compete against each other for an Overall Meat Showman and the winner will go to the Large Animal Round Robin. After the Overall Meat Showman is selected, the Runner-Up from that division will then compete for a selection of a runner-up overall Meat Showman. In the event that the winner does not go to Round Robin the Runner-Up will participate.

Dairy Goat Classifications

Dairy Goat Classes Registered and non-registered Dairy Goats will be shown in the same classes. All DOES must be free of horns and be tattooed.

Grand Champion and the Reserve Grand Champion Senior doe will be selected at the conclusion of all Senior Doe classes. Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Junior doe will be selected at the conclusion of all Junior Doe classes. After the selection of both the Grand Champion Senior Doe and Grand Champion Junior Doe, the Supreme Champion Dairy Doe will be selected.

After the conclusion of the Senior Doe, Yearling Doe, and Junior Doe classes, the Grand Champion does from those divisions will compete for Overall Supreme Meat Type Doe.

Grand Champion and the Reserve Grand Champion Senior doe will be selected at the conclusion of all Senior Doe classes. Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Junior doe will be selected at the conclusion of all Junior Doe classes. After the selection of both the Grand Champion Senior Doe and Grand Champion Junior Doe, the Supreme Champion Variety Doe will be selected. Group classes will follow.

Pet Wether Classes

Pet Wether class is for all breeds of goats: ie. Boer, Pygmy, Mytonic, Nigerian, and all dairy breeds

Junior Wether - (One year of age and Younger- Born July 25, 2022 Thru July 25, 2023

Senior Wether- (Over One year of age – Born on or before July 25, 2022)

The Pet Wether show will follow Showmanship on Sunday July 23, 2023

Market Goat Classifications

- 1. A 4-H member may have 2 market animals; i.e. 2 meat, 2 dairy, or 1 meat and 1 dairy.
- 2. Market animals entered in this project MUST be owned by May 1, 2023 and must be brought to the fairgrounds for Tagging/tattooing on one of the 2 Tattoo/Tagging days that will be announced.
- 3. To be eligible for the sale, the 4-H member must show a goat on show day.
- 4. All Full Size Market Goat will be getting an ear tag this year instead of a tattoo. The only exception will be the Lamancha dairy market goats that will be getting a tail tattoo. The charge for this ear tag will be \$3 per goat and must be paid the day the goat is tagged. You may tag as many goats as you want.
- 5. All goats that are born and raised on the 4-Her's farm will be tagged with a different color tag so that "bred and owned" goats can be distinguished in the show ring.

Miniature Market Goats

There is no longer a miniature market goat class. Please see "Pet wether" classes for further details.

Dairy Market Goats

All Dairy market goats must have "Milk Teeth" or born the fall of 2022 or after. Dairy Market goats must be chosen from one of the following/or combination of the following breeds of dairy goats: Alpine, Lamancha, Nubian, Saanen, Toggenburg, Oberhasli, Sable, or Guernsey. All Dairy Market Goats will weigh 40 pounds or more to be shown and auctioned. Animals to be sold will be weighed on Friday, July 21, 2023. Goats not weighing 40 pounds will be sent home immediately and will not be penned. This weight will be the selling weight. All animals must be dairy goat breed or a combination of dairy goat breeds. Dairy Market Goats will be shown in classes to be established, after weigh-in, by the club leaders. **Studded/Prong collars will not be allowed on Dairy Market Goats**.

Meat Market Goats

All Meat market goats must have "Milk Teeth" present or be born the fall of 2022 or after. All meat market goats will weigh 40 pounds or more to be shown and auctioned. Animals to be sold will be weighed on Friday, July 21, 2023. This weight will be the selling weight. Goats classified as meat include Boer, Kiko, Savanna, Spanish, Kinder, Myotonic (Fainting), or cross-breeds thereof. Meat market goats will be shown in classes established, after weigh-in, by the club leaders. Properly fitted studded/prong collars are permissible.

Rate of Gain

All meat goats will be weighed when tagged/tattooed. This will be the starting weight. The number of days from tagging/tattoo day until weigh-in at the fair on July 21, 2023 and the total pounds differential will be used to calculate the rate of gain. IF YOU WANT TO COMPETE IN RATE OF GAIN YOU MUST ENTER YOUR BEGINNING WEIGHTS ONLINE WHEN ENROLLING YOUR MARKET GOATS.

Decision of Which Goat To Sell at Auction

We are now making it mandatory that you notify a leader in the goat barn office which market goat you will be putting the auction by Monday evening, July 24, 2023 at 8p.m. If you have not notified the office by that time the Leaders will make the decision for you.

Other Classes

Costume Class - Goat and 4-H'er are to be in costume. Costume and theme are open to your imagination. The class will be judged Wednesday, July 26, 2023 in the Beef/Dairy Show Arena at 6pm.

Cart Class - Goats in cart class may be does or wethers. 4-Her's must provide their own cart and harness. Goats may be led at the beginning to accustom them to the surroundings. You will be asked to turn both left and right, and to back your goat. Judging time to be after the conclusion of the costume class.

Goat Agility Class – Goat doe or wether will negotiate a predetermined pattern. The course will be set up so that 4-Her's can practice. Judging will take place on Wednesday, July 26, 2023 at 2 p.m. Judging will be done in the Beef/Dairy Arena.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

Advisory Board to the 4-H Goat Club Established 1976 Amended 1997, 2000, 2009, 2017, 2019, 2020

Introduction to Bylaws:

The Purpose of the Advisory Board shall be to help and coordinate an active county 4-H program, secure the necessary support for such a program, cooperate with the Fair Board and local leaders, and collect and dispense funds.

Section One, Article I: Membership:

The members of the Advisory Board shall consist of 10 elected members and two appointed treasurers, not to include the Fair Board Director, the 4-H Leader and Co-Leader. Members shall be elected from anyone interested in serving the 4-H program that is a parent, or legal guardian with one member per household being eligible per term.

Members are elected on a rotating basis with five (5) persons being elected each year for a period of two years. In the event of a vacancy, the Chairman shall appoint a person with input from the advisory board. The election is to be held with nominations being submitted 60 days before the advisory board elections are held. Those voting are parents, 4-Her's, and current advisory board members. The five (5) persons with the most votes become the newest members of the Advisory Board and are to start their term of office at the next advisory meeting held. The Advisory Board will present new members a copy of the Constitution and By-Laws. The retiring members of the board are eligible for reelection.

Section Two, Article I: Officers:

The officers of the advisory board shall consist of a Chairman, a Vice Chairman, a Secretary, and two Treasurers. The Vice Chairman will act as the Chairman in the absence of the Chairman.

The term of the office shall be one (1) year with the provision that they (the officers) are eligible for re-election in the following year. These officers are the elected from the twelve (12) Advisory Board members as soon as possible after the new members are elected.

Section Two, Article II: Chairman and Vice Chairman:

The Chairman will preside at all meetings. If the Chairman is unable to preside at a meeting, the Vice Chairman should be notified. The Vice Chairman shall then fill the duties of the Chairman at the meeting.

The duties of the Chairman are to preside at the meeting, to keep order and guide the meeting to a constructive line of business, to put to vote all questions that properly arise in the course of the meeting and to announce the results of the question. In the event an officer is not present, the Chairman shall appoint a person to fill the vacancy for the meeting. The Chairman will adjourn the meeting.

Constitution and By-Laws Continued:

Section Two, Article III: Secretary:

The Secretary will keep an accurate record of the meetings, copy of which will be given to all members of the advisory board before or at the next meeting. A copy of the minutes should be sent to the Livestock County Extension Agent.

Section Two, Article IV: Treasurers:

The Treasurers will be appointed and will work together to pay all bills promptly and keep an accurate record on Quickbooks of all money spent. The Treasurer should have the approval of the Advisory Board on all major purchases. A monthly report is to be made to the Advisory Board as to the financial status of the club. They will also work with the treasurer of the club. Signers for the checking account shall include the Treasurer, Chairman, Vice-Chairman, and Fair Board Representative.

Section Two, Article V: Club Organizational Leader(s):

The Leaders shall be in charge of the 4-H meetings after the club President has completed his or her portion of the meeting. The Leaders will guide the way the Club is run and its goals. He or she may attend fair board meetings.

Section Two, Article VI: Assistant/Project Leader(s):

The Assistant/Project Leader is to give support and help to the Leader(s) in serving the club.

Section Two, Article VII: Director:

The Director will attend Fair Board meetings. The Director must attend the advisory board and 4-H club meetings. The Director is to work closely with the Leader and the Fair Board and is to keep the Advisory Board well informed. The Director has the power to call a special meeting of the Advisory Board to alert them of any special business. The Director has no voting power in regular meetings except in Section Three, Article II of the By-Laws, or to break a tie on a board vote. The Director may have been a previous leader. The Advisory Board shall elect a Director every two(2) years with the previous Director being eligible.

Section Three, Article I: Amendment:

Any amendments to be changed or added to these By-Laws must be approved by a 2/3 majority of the Advisory Board.

Section Three, Article II: Member Dismissal:

If any officer or member of the Advisory Board does not live up to the 4-H morals and responsibilities, and if he or she proves to be a hindrance to the progress of the 4-H Goat Club, the Advisory Board shall have the right to vote them off the Board by having a 2/3 majority vote with all members present. The Director and the 4-H Leader have the right to vote on the situation at that time.
