

## Notebook Ideas for Home Environment

If you are completing a notebook: *required for furniture or portfolio options.*

- a. Use a three ring binder
  - b. Use sheet protectors
  - c. Include all previous year's work (separate with dividers).
  - d. Current year should be first!
  - e. Include your record sheet, signed by your 4-H leader
  - f. Neatness counts!
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- 1- Your notebook tells the judge what you learned in this project and the things you did that helped you to learn.
    - a. Make it interesting to read.
  
  - 2- Include the story of your furniture item, or your design board.
    - a. What did you make?
    - b. Why decide on the item or design?
    - c. When and where did you get the item or ideas?
    - d. How much did the item, or design cost?
    - e. How did you create the final project?
    - f. How much time did you spend on the project?
    - g. Who helped you with the project?
  
  - 3- Tell how and where you are using the item you are displaying. Or where you would implement your design
    - a. Include photos of you working on your project
    - b. Include photos of the completed project.
      - i. Use a drawing or sketch if photos are not available
