### Purdue Extension/4-H Relationship

Purdue University is Indiana's land grant institution and delivers 4-H through the Cooperative Extension Service. The Cooperative Extension Service is supported through the USDA's National Institute of Food and Agriculture (NIFA) and "provides non-formal education and learning activities to people throughout the country- to farmers and other residents of rural communities as well as to people living in urban areas. It emphasizes taking knowledge gained through research and education and bringing it directly to the people to create positive changes" (nifa.usda.gov). 4-H is offered across the nation but may look a little different from state-to-state. I encourage you to participate in state and national 4-H opportunities, as these connections you make will last a life time.

### **4-H Volunteers**

Our program has over 500 youth members, which is very exciting for our community! We also have over 100 adult volunteers who work hard and dedicate their time to ensure that our program is successful. ### Communication

# 4-H Online

You are receiving this because you signed up for 4-H in 4-H Online. Step 1- complete! We will utilize 4-H Online throughout the year as our information database. Throughout the year, you will receive "broadcast emails" that we send through 4-H Online. Please make sure to keep your profile updated- if you have an address, phone number, or email change, please update it in the system, both under your individual profile AND your family profile. Contact the office if you need help with this.

### **Fair Entry**

As we get closer to the county fair, you will learn more about Fair Entry. This is a state-wide system that allows you to enroll in specific projects/classes for the fair. For example, in 4-H Online you signed up for Arts and Crafts and Poultry. In Fair Entry, you will select Basketry (Arts and Crafts project) and Laying Production (Poultry class). Be on the lookout for directions in late May/early June.

### 2024 Franklin County 4-H Fair

The Franklin County 4-H Fair will take place on July 15-20 (pre-fair week starts the Wednesday before). Please review the updated schedule for dates, times, and locations of 4-H events.

# Franklin County 4-H Handbook

If you are a returning 4-H member or volunteer, you should have received a printed handbook in a 3-ring binder last year. You will not be receiving a new one this year unless you are a new family. All of the changes are in red font and the new book is updated on our website at <a href="https://extension.purdue.edu/county/franklin/franklin-4h.html">https://extension.purdue.edu/county/franklin/franklin-4h.html</a>. I encourage you to go to the website, review the changes, and print and update your handbook with the new pages as needed. Please note that the entire schedule is updated and we have included it with this packet. It is your responsibility to double check these changes. Let the office know if you have any questions or if you would like to request an updated, printed copy.

# **Project Manuals**

New this year- Several 4-H projects have manuals that may be used for additional information or guidance in completing the project. These manuals are available at Shop4-H.org or can be requested from the Extension Office until our inventory runs out. If the manual is required for project completion, it will be provided at no cost with your Green Folder. These projects include Achievement, Child Development, Consumer Clothing, and Electric. All animal project exhibitors will receive a resource book that they will keep for their entire 4-H career (1 per family). Mini 4-H members will still receive manuals for their static projects.

# **Green Folders**

Each 4-H member will receive a Green Folder with a Franklin County Points Sheet, My Record of Achievement, Project Record Sheet, other important paperwork and project manuals (if applicable). Mini 4-H members don't necessarily have a Green Folder, but they do have a packet with their project manuals and other important information. The Green Folders/Mini 4-H Packets are ready for pick up at the Extension Office now until March 1. After March 1, your 4-H club leader will have them to give out at 4-H meetings.

# **Extended Office Hours**

We will have extended office hours the week of February 12, Monday-Friday from 8:00 am until 6:00 pm. Please utilize this time to come to the office and pick up Green Folders/Mini 4-H Packets and ask any questions.

### **Mini 4-H Information**

Mini 4-H is a fun way to get youth involved in the program before "regular" 4-H begins. Mini 4-H is exhibition only, meaning youth do not actually compete for awards. Youth signed up for Mini 4-H Horse and Pony should contact a leader of the Mustangers to let them know their intentions of either bring their own animal or borrowing a regular 4-H member's animal. Youth signed up for Mini 4-H Rabbit, Poultry, Dog, Swine, Dairy Goat, Meat Goat, or Sheep need to have a mentor. Their mentor is a regular 4-H member who loans them their animal during the show. Please contact the office if you need a mentor. Review the handbook for all guidelines regarding Mini 4-H animal exhibits. A new change for Mini 4-H rabbit is that the show will be Tuesday morning following rabbit showmanship (9 am).

# **Static Project Information**

Static projects are also known as non-walking or building projects. These are typically judged during pre-fair week. This year, we will have a new and much needed exhibit hall to judge and house these projects. I would like to send a huge thank you to the 4-H Association Board of Directors, building committee, county officials, and to all of the generous donors who are making this vision a reality. We are very fortunate to have a supportive community. And thank you to our 4-H members, volunteers, and families who helped to fundraise and promote this large project. Project judging may look a bit different this year, as we navigate how the building will be set up- stay tuned!

There are a few static project changes to note. Please see below for major changes. However, please review the updated handbook for all of the guidelines.

- Aerospace: There are a few additions to the guidelines. Please see the handbook for changes in red font.
- Arts and Crafts: The Sewing Craft subcategory has been removed.
- Consumer Clothing and Consumer Clothing Fashion Revue: These will both take place on Wednesday, July 10<sup>th</sup> (check in- 12:00-1:00 pm; judging- 1:30 pm). Those entered in both Consumer Clothing and Fashion Revue will be judged first, simultaneously. Then those only entered in Consumer Clothing will be judged. Fashion Revue awards will take place on Wednesday, July 17<sup>th</sup> at 6 pm.
- Electric: There are a few additions to the guidelines. Please see the handbook for changes in red font.
- Food: The recipe card has been updated.
- Garden and Herbs: The Latin name is not required.
- Sewing and Sewing Fashion Revue: These will both take place on Wednesday, July 10<sup>th</sup> (check in- 8-9 am; judging-9:30 am). Jr. Sewing and Sr. Sewing Fashion Revue will take place first, simultaneously. Then, Sr. Sewing and Jr. Sewing Fashion Revue will take place afterwards, simultaneously. Fashion Revue awards will take place on Wednesday, July 17<sup>th</sup> at 6 pm.
- Woodworking: The skills sheet has been updated.
- Zero-Turn, Tractor, Lawn and Garden Tractor: There will be no multiple-choice written exam this year- parts ID and driving only. The parts ID and driving will both take place on the same day (Wednesday, July 9<sup>th</sup> at 9 am).

### **Animal Information**

Livestock ID and weigh in will take place at the fairgrounds on Friday, May 10 from 5 pm to 8 pm. 4-H market animals and commercial animals - including market lambs and commercial ewes, dairy goat wethers, dairy feeder steers, dairy beef steers, ALL beef cattle including starter calves, meat goat wethers, market goat does - must attend Weigh-In/ID Day each year.

ALL animals, including rabbits, horse and pony, sheep, meat goats, dairy goats, swine, beef, and dairy, must be entered in 4-H Online by May 15. Failure to do so will result in losing the opportunity to exhibit at both county and Indiana State Fair. If a 4-Her is still unsure of which animal(s) they plan to exhibit at the fair, it is advised they enter all eligible animals on 4-H Online by May 15. Even if the animal is not born and does not have ID data yet, you must still enter the animal with a pending ID.

Animals exhibited at the Franklin County 4-H Fair must be identified through a tattoo or tag, which must be secured to the animal by May 15 or when they are old enough (for animals that are not born by May 15). Exceptions- dogs, horses and ponies, and poultry. Please see the handbook for specific identification requirements.

There are a lot of changes regarding animal guidelines. Please review the updated handbook for all of the guidelines. A few of the major changes are outlined below.

- Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care Training: This training, or YQCA, must be completed one week prior to checking in at the Franklin County 4-H Fair. This means that you must complete an in-person training or turn in a certificate of completion for YQCA by Sunday, July 7<sup>th</sup>. This is a new statewide policy and will be enforced. If you have not completed the certification and provided proof of completion by July 7<sup>th</sup>, you will not be eligible to participate. This does not apply to horse, dog, or Mini 4-H participants.
- Tack Set Up: Horse and Pony members may set up their tack on Friday, July 12<sup>th</sup> from 3:00 to 8:00 pm. Swine may set up their tack on Saturday, July 13<sup>th</sup> from 8:00-10:00 pm. Beef, Dairy, Sheep, Meat Goat, and Dairy Goat members may set up their tack on Sunday, July 14<sup>th</sup> beginning at 2:30 pm (or after the horse show is complete). Please be respectful of all 4-H members as we share the fairgrounds. Exhibitors are always welcome to set up their tack during check in as well.

- Check In (Beef, Dairy, Meat Goat, Dairy Goat, Sheep, Swine): Youth may pen/stall their animals first and then do weigh in/check in. Before penning/stalling, they must get checked by the vet. Penning/stalling and the vet check is from 3:00-7:00 pm. Weigh in and check in times will depend on the species and will be communicated at a later date.
- Check In (Rabbit and Poultry): 3:00-8:00 pm on Sunday, July 14th
- Trailer Parking Area: There will be a designated area for trailers to park during fair week.
- Livestock Registration Papers: Franklin County 4-H Youth exhibiting registered beef, sheep, and swine must turn in registration papers to the respective species committee or the Extension Office by May 15 unless communicated with committee.
- Beef: There will be classes for purebred beef steers.
- **Dairy Goat:** There will be a Franklin County Born and Raised class for Junior Does and a separate class for Senior Does.
- Meat Goats: There will be a wether dam class.
- **Poultry:** Poultry exhibitors may enter eggs in the auction.
- Sheep: Market lambs and breeding ewes will be shown by breed.
- Swine: Barrows and gilts will be shown by breed.

# Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care Training

Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care Training is a certification that each Indiana 4-H livestock (rabbit, poultry, dairy, beef, swine, dairy goat, meat goat, sheep) exhibitor must obtain one week prior to checking in at the Franklin County 4-H Fair. This certification can be completed at an in-person training provided by the 4-H Youth Development Educator (dates listed below). The training must be completed yearly.

One alternative is YQCA training completed online. If a 4-H member chooses the YQCA option, they must provide proof of certification one week prior to checking in at the Franklin County 4-H Fair.






