HOW DO I JOIN?

Enrollment is completed through 4-H Online (v2.4honline.com) between October 1 through January 15 each year.

Mini 4-H (grades K-2) is free. Regular 4-H (grades 3-12) has a program fee of \$25 per member and a \$75 maximum per immediate family. Scholarships are available for families in need.

Members are not considered enrolled in 4-H until all forms are signed and fees are collected.
