FAIR ENTRY

You are required to enter the exhibits and animals you plan to bring to the fair into the FairEntry system. Instructions for this have been emailed to each 4-H member. Entries may be entered at fairentry.com

Fair Entry will be open June 5-23th. All projects must be registered in Fair Entry by June 23



ALL 4-H members must pick up their fair pass during project check-in. 4-H members will be given arm bands that serve as entry into the fair.
You also may pick up your free t-shirt at this time.
T-shirts will only be distributed at project check-in and if you did not register you will not receive a tshirt. Passes for Superintendents and Leaders may be purchased at a discounted rate prior to the start of the fair at the Fair Office.

Poster Information

All posters must be on poster board and mounted horizontally, 22"x28" foam backing board and covered with clear plastic or enclosed in a plastic sleeve, as stated in the handbook. Foam mounting boards are available for purchase for \$3 at the Purdue Extension Office. Plastic sleeves may be purchased for \$1. Please make sure you are using the correct size of foam board.

HORSE STALL DECORATING CONTEST

All decorations must be mounted on plywood or foam board and attached to the stall. Do not nail or staple anything to the stall. The front is 5'4" wide. The length is 4' (plywood part of stall) or 6' (up to 2nd from last bar on stall). The stall door is 3'8" wide by 3'10" (plywood only) or 5'5" (up to 2nd from last bar on the stall.

Showmanship

Livestock Showmanship is based on grade just completed. ·Clover (grades 3, 4, 5) ·Junior (grades 6, 7, 8) ·Senior (grades 9, 10, 11, 12) Horse is Junior (grade 3-7) & Senior (grade 8>).

Supreme Showman

4-H members selected as the Clover, Junior or Senior age group showmanship winner in the Swine, Beef, or Sheep project are eligible to compete in the Supreme Showmanship **Contest. Contestants show** beef, sheep, and swine and answer questions about these animals. The Supreme **Showmanship Contest is** Thursday, July 14th at 11:00 a.m. Previous Senior winners are no longer eligible to compete. Previous Junior and Clover winners are only eligible to show in the next (higher) division. The Supreme Showmanship Contest order for 2022 will be: Swine, Beef, Sheep. If a member wins showmanship for more than one species they will represent the specie won first in the supreme competition.



Livestock Stalling

Pens will be assigned for livestock exhibitors based on the information you provide in Fair Entry. If you register more animals than you will be bringing, please let the Superintendent and/or the Extension Office know as soon as possible. When you unload your animals at the fair, you should check for a board that will be posted with the pen assignments.

Again for 2022:

No animals can be penned or stalled until the superintendent inspects the animal. Failure to comply will result in ineligibility to show animal and animal must be removed from premises. There will be check-in times for each species and the animals must arrive during this time and be checked by a superintendent before the animal is penned or stalled.

Please see the fair schedule for check-in times for each species. If you absolutely cannot make it during the check-in time, please contact the Superintendent IN ADVANCE to make other arrangements.

Livestock Auction

The 4-H Livestock Auction is a premium only auction. Buyers bid a premium and the 4-H member keeps the animal. Per Indiana State Fair Rules, any animal (or animal product such as eggs and milk) sold in the auction is ineligible for the Indiana State Fair. Grand Champions are not required to be sold in the auction.

The Livestock Auction is Thursday, July 14th at 6:45 p.m. Any 4-H member enrolled in one or more of the following livestock projects is eligible to participate:

swine, beef, sheep, meat goat, and dairy. The grand champions in the following projects are also eligible:

rabbit, dairy goat, and meat pen rabbits.

If the Grand Champion is not sold in the auction, the Reserve Grand Champion in that species may be sold in the Sale of Champions. Each 4-H livestock member may have only one entry in the sale. Please be sure to greet and shake your auction buyer's hand and thank them for the donation! And don't forget to send them a thank you note!

Auction Fees & Payment

A small fee for the livestock auction picture will be deducted from your sale check. This picture is given to the auction buyer. In addition, a 2% deduction also will be made from each sale check. This deduction is approved by the auction committee and the 4-H Inc. Board in order to generate funds for livestock cages, pens, equipment, etc.

4-H members will receive their check from the 4-H Sale Committee (look for an envelope from the Purdue Extension Office) NOT FROM THE BUYER. We will let you know who purchased your animal so that you can express your appreciation to them. It is very important that you thank the buyer of your animal. Minimum Weights for Auction Participation Beef Steers - 900lbs Dairy and meat goat wethers- 40lbs Swine- 220lbs

Auction information can be found in the handbook.

Absolutely NO animals are to enter or exit the pavilion through the Heidenreich Arena.

Vehicles are not allowed to park between the pavilion and the 4-H building. This will not be used as parking or an unloading zone.

Help Out!

During the fair any trash cans in the pavilion that are full need to be emptied. Extra bags and tape can be found at the Mt. Olympus food stand and bags can be taken out to the dumpster by the horse wash racks. Helping empty trash is a responsibility of 4-H so please help out!

Livestock Show Policies

4-H exhibitors are expected to show their own animals. In case of illness or an emergency, the department Superintendent may allow another 4-H member to show the animal for the exhibitor. 4-H exhibitors may receive clipping and grooming assistance from members of their family who are no more than 2 generations removed from the exhibitor or from a current Indiana 4-H member. Temporary guardianships are not permitted and shall result in immediate disqualification. 4-H members exhibiting at the Gibson County 4-H show may also help one another or receive assistance from parents of other 4-H members exhibiting in the 4-H show or from Gibson County 4-H leaders. Any other assistance such as from professional showmen, etc. will result in that exhibitor's entries being withdraw from the show. Please read the 4-H Handbook for an entire listing of show policies.

Manure Disposal

We will once again have a roll off box available for manure disposal. We need to make sure that ONLY manure, straw and sawdust go into the box. 4- H members need to provide their own bedding in the pens. PLEASE TAKE MANURE ALL THE WAY INTO THE DUMPSTER. DO NOT UNLOAD MANURE ON THE CONCRETE PAD.

Livestock Insurance

The 4-H Inc. Board does not provide

insurance coverage on 4-H livestock at the fair. Your animals are YOUR responsibility. There is NO insurance provided by 4-H or the Fair Board for animals at the fair. It is your responsibility to make sure your animal does not cause injury to other people or animals.


Care of Animals at the Fair

It is IMPORTANT that 4-H members demonstrate proper care for their animals at home and at the fair.

4-H members must continue to properly care for their animals the entire time that the animal is at the fair. Adequate water, food, bedding, etc. must be maintained and pens kept clean. No physical abuse of animals with canes, whips, etc. is allowed.

Animals should be checked several times each day. You must care for your animal from the time you bring them to the fair until they are taken home or to the market. Failure to take care of your animals may result in you receiving a fine. See the 4-H Handbook for more details. Animals are not insured by the fairgrounds or 4-H. It is your responsibility to insure your animals. The Fair Board and 4-H are not responsible for any injuries or harm that occurs to your animals.

Swine Information



We will follow the Indiana State Fair rule regarding not exhibiting pigs that have been slick shaved. "Slick" clipping or body shaving of 4-H barrows and gilts is prohibited. Animals that are slick clipped or body shaved will not be allowed to exhibit. There must be a minimum of one-half inch of hair on the body of hogs. Hogs with less than one-half inch of hair will not be allowed to show.

Swine Affidavit

Swine affidavits are required from swine exhibitors. This affidavit states that your pig(s) have been given the swine flu vaccination and booster. Affidavits must be signed and returned at Swine check-in to be eligible to exhibit.

Swine Show

During the swine show, exhibitors are limited to one person helping them in the swine pens and show area. This is for safety reasons and to reduce congestion.

Livestock Release Times

Livestock will be released at the following times: Rabbits not in auction: Thursday from 2-4 p.m. Auction rabbits: 8:00

p.m.

Horses: Thursday, 8:00 p.m.

Other Livestock: Thursday, at the conclusion of the auction You may NOT take your animals home before this time. Exhibitors that take animals home early may not be permitted to exhibit next year. All animals MUST be out of the pavilion by Friday at 5:00 a.m. Animals remaining after this time will be dealt with at the discretion of the livestock superintendents.
