STALL FEE

A \$10.00 per stall fee will be paid the day of check-in. If the stalls are cleaned, per the 4-H Leaders standards, the money will be refunded.

PROJECT REQUIREMENT:

1. Complete the Grant County 4-H Livestock Record Sheet. Place in green record book and turn in at the fair.

The Horse & Pony project has three exhibit options of which you can do one of these options:

- 1. Live Animals
- An educational poster about Horses (no Best of Show will be selected). These posters need to be turned in on Tuesday, June 13, 5-7 p.m. <u>OR</u> Wednesday, June 14, 8 a.m.-4 p.m. (Open judging)
- 3. An action demonstration

All posters, notebooks, and display boards must include a reference list including where the information was obtained, giving credit to the original author, to complete the 4-H member's exhibit. This reference list should/might include web site links, people and professionals interviewed, books, magazines, etc. It is recommended this reference list be attached to the back of a poster, display board, be the last page of a notebook, or include as part of the display visible to the public. A judge is not to discredit an exhibit for the manner in which reference are listed.

ALL GRADES EXHIBIT ONE OR MORE ANIMALS FED AND CARED FOR BY MEMBER SINCE MAY 15 AND SAME CONTINUOUS OWNERSHIP AND CARE UNTIL DATE OF SHOW.

FEEDING AND CARE OF ANIMALS

4-H'ers are responsible for the daily feeding and care of their animals during the 4-H fair week.

RULES:

1. All 4-H Horse & Pony classes shall be judged by the current edition of the Indiana 4-H Horse & Pony Handbook (4-H 661) available at the Extension Office.

- 2. All animals must be in good physical condition before the animal can be unloaded at the fair or be shown, for example, no broken limbs, no serious wounds, no foot rot, sore mouth or ring worm.
- 3. No stallions allowed. (4-H 661)
- 4. All 4-H Riders in the 4-H show must wear the proper footwear of western, hunt or jodhpur boots (4-H 661)
- 5. <u>Designated Riding Areas</u>: Horse and ponies can only be ridden on the east end of the horse barn or in the horse arena. No riding south of the barn! NO riding of horses in the barn!
- 7. Only Grant County 4-H Members or parents, grandparents, or guardians are allowed to be riding the horses.
- 8. Ring courtesy dictates that exhibitors maintain a safe distance between animals in halter and performance classes. (4-H 661)
- 9. All 4-H Horse & Pony members are recommended to participate in their respective showmanship divisions. Not participating in your respective showmanship class could forfeit your ability to show in other classes, unless prior approval has been granted.
- 10. Horse & Pony measuring will be at the 4-H Park at a future scheduled date. All animals must be measured to be eligible. Note: Any horse over six (6) years of age that has been measured previously, does not need to be measured again. *No animals will be individually measured at 4-H'ers homes - all animals must be brought to the 4-H Park*.
- 11. Refer to the General Livestock Rules and Rules for 4-H Livestock State Fair Entry for State Fair Entry.

HORSE & PONY HELMET POLICY

This policy will be in effect beginning with the 2003 program year and applies to <u>ALL</u> county, area, and state 4-H Horse & Pony events, shows and activities. This policy has been instituted by the Administration in the Department of 4-H Youth Development at Purdue. Risk management at Purdue University requires this be put into effect. *This policy is not open to alteration at the State level or the County level*.

The Official Policy is all 4-H members are required to wear a properly fitted ASTM or SEI standard F1163 (or above) certified helmet whenever mounted, or driving, at a 4-H Horse & Pony event, show or activity. The 4-H member is responsible to see that this specified headgear is properly fitted with the approved harness fastened in place whenever mounted. Original tags must be present in all approved helmets.
