



# 4-H Academy June 11-13, 2025

4-H Academy @ Purdue is a program held at Purdue University specifically designed to offer handson, exciting opportunities to learn about a diverse selection of subjects and careers. During this
conference previously known as 4-H Science Workshops, participants will meet and learn from
professors, graduate students and other experts in their respective fields and participate in
interactive activities and experiential learning. Participants stay in a Purdue University Residence
Hall for two nights while exploring the Purdue University campus and meeting 4-H members from
across Indiana. 4-H Academy @ Purdue is open to all youth grades 9-12.

# 4-H Roundup June 23-25, 2025

4-H Round-Up is an exciting opportunity offered to youth who have completed grades 7, 8, and 9. Attendees have an opportunity to explore a variety of careers by attending classes created just for Round-Up attendees at Purdue University. Participants will get a taste of college life and will live in a Purdue Residence Hall for two nights. Youth have an opportunity to meet others from across the state and further develop their leadership skills. Recreation events are planned in the evenings and blocks of free time allow attendees the opportunity to build friendships on their own.

It is ALMOST time to sign-up for the Hancock County Farm Bureau Dairy Bar. Groups that work 2 and 3 hour shifts will receive a \$125 donation (a \$25 increase from last year). This is open to your groups on a first come, first serve basis, and these time slots fill up quickly! Sign-up is May 1, 2025. We are sending this out early so you can work with your group to plan a few times your group could work (list the shifts in order of preference) so you are ready to sign-up on May 1st.

It is important that we have the correct amount of workers, not too many, not too few.

The 2-5 afternoon shifts need: 2 adults (18 and up), 3 high school age or older, and 2 elementary age children or older. (Total of 7 workers at a time, you may rotate workers on the hour).

The 11-2, 5-8 and 8-10 shifts need: 3 adults (18 and up), 5 high school age or older, and 2 elementary age children or older. (Total of 10 workers at a time, you may rotate workers on the hour).

The available shifts are:

Tuesday, June 17: 8-10 pm

Thursday, June 19 through Monday, June 23, each of the 5 days: 11-2, 2-5, 5-8, 8-10. Tuesday, June 24: 11-2 and 5-8.

When you request a shift, I will need your group name, contact person and contact information. Also let me know if you are interested in a second, and even a third shift, and we will do our best to get everyone scheduled on May 1st. Our plan is to let everyone know their shifts on May 2nd.

### **4-H Electric Project Information**

4-H Electric Project participation is determined by "**years in electric**", not by age or grade level. New 4-H Electric participants will start with the level 1 project, then the level 2 project the following year, and so on. Youth may start participating in 4-H Electric Projects when they enter the **3rd** grade and continue through the **12**th grade.

Participants are required to fill out and hand in an "Electric and Electronic Exhibit Skills and Knowledge **Sheet**" at project judging. Participants are encouraged to use the "Electric and Electronic Exhibit Skills and Knowledge **Guide**" to help them fill out the sheet. Project kits for level 1 through level 4 are being provided for free and may be picked up at the Purdue Extension office while supplies last, courtesy of NineStar Connect. Kits may also be found and purchased at local hardware stores or online.

Please bring all project materials to the workshop, including batteries. All tools needed to assemble the projects will be available for participant use, including screwdrivers, wire strippers, solders, and soldering irons. Participants may bring their own tools if they choose. Instructors will work hands-on with participants to assemble and solder all connections. Participants will be supervised while soldering connections. Participants will be instructed on proper soldering, wire stripping, and assembly techniques but will be expected to perform all tasks themselves.


