You Never Know Until You Give It A Try!

Through the last 35 years, I have developed a reputation for baking (mostly breads) by competing at the Indiana State Fair. I started small being encouraged by a friend who had sampled my dinner rolls and said they belonged at the State Fair. I had attended the Fair since I was a small child and wasn't sure that my baking was good enough. It took a couple of years to take the plunge. This was before the internet, so I had to request an entry catalog and mail in my entries. The rest is history.

I know there are those in the Hancock County Extension Homemakers who could exhibit at the State Fair. Entries are so much easier now with everything being online. Go to https://www.indianastatefair.com/p/state--fair/competitions-contests to explore the possibilities.

Those with a green thumb will want to explore the Ag-Hort catalog.

The Indiana Arts catalog includes classes for Culinary, Sewing and all types of needlework, Crafts, Antiques, Non-Professional Arts and Photography.

The catalog will show you the classes in each category. Entries are due July 1. You can enter up to 50 items for \$30. The entry fee also includes 6 tickets to the Fair (normally \$14 each) with the opportunity to purchase more for \$10 each. The Entry form and fees are due by July 1. Most entries are due at the Fair between July 22 and 28. (Check the catalogs.)

I personally will be happy to help you through the registration process and answer your questions. You do not have to have competed in any earlier contests. You may very well have a painting, afghan, cross stitch finished that you could enter. Check out the antique classes for some of your family heirlooms. Enter that cherry pie or snickerdoodles that your family loves. There are special live culinary competitions like one for heritage recipes over 50 years old. Check the catalog. Most of all, don't deny yourself the chance to exhibit... You will never know until you give it a try!




