Choosing an Outfit

Make sure that your clothes and shoes are comfortable- not too tight, or too loose.

Please do not go out and buy a new outfit for this project. This project is all about helping you learn self-confidence when you model.

A date and time will be set for Mini 4-Hers to practice at the 4-H Bowl before fashion revue night. Fashion revue night will be held


