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
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Mini 4-H Parent's Page

Welcome to the Mini 4-H Photography project! Do you like taking photos? Have a camera or a phone to borrow? Take a few pictures and turn them in as your project! In this project you will learn how to take and display photos.

Tips to take good photos

Here are a few tips to take your photos:

- Take pictures from lot of angles and distances to see what works
- Make sure your photos are clear and easy to see the point of the photo
- Good lighting will help your photos
- Practice: take picture of people, pets, flowers, toys. The more photos you take the better you will get!
- Focus your photos and try to hold still when taking the picture
- Have fun! Photos are a great way to remember important memories. Take pictures of all the fun you have.



What to Exhibit

After you take your photos, you will want to have them printed.

Select your best three photos and prepare a poster of your photos.

Your poster should be 22"x14" foam board and have the title "My Life". Your photos should all be 4"x6". Be creative and use paper to create frames for your poster!

Kindergarten: 1 picture of a flower and 2 pictures of your choice

1st grade: 1 picture of a person and 2 pictures of your choice

2nd grade: 1 picture of an animal and 2 pictures of your choice

Your photos can be vertical or horizontal and placed below your title. Use the labels to create a name tag for the bottom right side of your poster.


