

Crockpot Apple Dump Cake

Prep Time: 5min. Cook Time: 3 hrs. Total Time: 3hrs. 5 min. Servings: 10

Ingredients

- 15.25 oz yellow cake mix
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1/2 cup butter 1 stick, melted butter
- 40 oz. apple pie filling
- 1/3 cup chopped pecans
- vanilla ice cream



Instructions

- 1. In a large mixing bowl, add yellow cake mix, cinnamon and nutmeg. Mix well. Add melted butter and mix well. Set aside.
- 2. Grease a 6 quart slow cooker with nonstick cooking spray. Spread apple pie filling into the bottom of the slow cooker. Sprinkle crumbled cake mix on top. Top with pecans.
- 3. Place two layers of paper towel on top of the slow cooker and cover with the lid. Heat on high for 3 hours. Serve warm with vanilla ice cream.

- 2. Any professional artist, crafter, etc. may present entries for display only, <u>not to be judged</u>. A professional is defined as anyone who teaches their skill(s) and/or regularly profits from the sale of their artistry, craft and/or skills.
- 3. Exhibits shall have been made, completed or prepared by exhibitor and never before exhibited at Riley Festival.
- 4. No foods or food preservation in 2023. We urge everyone to enter the Riley Festival Baker's Best on September 30,2023. The theme this year is Apples.
- 5. No entry Fee will be charged.
- 6.. Exhibits will be judged in two categories: JUNIOR: 16 and under and SENIOR: 17 and above; except when there are less than 3 entries in a section, Junior entries could be judged with Seniors.
- 7. ALL ENTRIES IN ALL CATEGORIES ARE DUE WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 4, 2023.

- 9. Each entry will be awarded a ribbon signifying a blue, red, white or participation ribbons. Champion ribbons will be awarded in each section. All judges' decisions will be final.

- 11. We reserve the right to combine, add or separate sections, according to the number of entries received.




