Educator Update

Dear Homemakers,

We find ourselves halfway through the year; it's the perfect time to revisit and rejuvenate our health and wellness goals. The weather has been a little confusing lately, as we are hanging on to the heat; here are three simple yet impactful steps to help you achieve better well-being this September.

1. Hydrate, Hydrate, Hydrate!

The summer heat can be draining, but keeping hydrated is crucial for your physical and mental well-being. Water helps regulate your body temperature, improves skin health, and even aids in weight loss. Fluffy Pumpkin Cheesecake Dip

Servings 12, Calories 181kcal

Ingredients

- 8 ounces cream cheese softened
- ½ cup brown sugar more or less to taste
- 15 ounces pumpkin puree
- 1 tablespoon pumpkin pie spice
- 1 cup heavy whipping cream

Instructions

- 1. In a medium bowl, use a hand mixer to blend the cream cheese and brown sugar until smooth and creamy.
- 2. Add the pumpkin puree and spice to the bowl, then blend again until well combined.
- 3. In a separate cold bowl, whip the heavy cream to stiff peaks.
- 4. Gently fold the whipped cream into the pumpkin dip until fully combined. Refrigerate until ready to serve, then sprinkle with ground cinnamon. Serve with choice of dippers, or use in a no-bake recipe.







Definition: All recipes must feature apples as the main ingredient.

Featured ingredients could be:

- Nuts: peanut, pecan, walnuts, etc.
- Honey & plant-based sweeteners: honey, maple syrup.
- Grains: oatmeal, cereals, etc.
- Vegetables: zucchini, carrots, etc.
- Coconut, Caramels, Chocolate Chips

The featured ingredient apple should be the dominant flavor of the baked good.

- 1. This contest is open to Hancock County residents or any member of Hancock County Extension Homemakers.
- 2. The product must be made by the individual entering the exhibit.
- 3. All entries must be accompanied by the recipe, which must be legibly printed or typed. We cannot accept recipes that are printed directly from websites. The featured ingredient should be stated on the recipe and in the baked part of the product. Fillings baked with the product will be considered as part of the baked product. All recipes will become the property of the Hancock County Extension Homemakers.
- 4. Only one entry per class per person.
- 5. The classes for entry are:
 - Six cookies or dessert bars
 - One cake or 6 cupcakes
 - One pie
 - Quick bread: one loaf, or 6 muffins, scones, etc.
 - Yeast Breads: one loaf, one tea ring etc. or 6 sweet rolls.
 - Other baked product Cheesecakes are allowed but they must be refrigerated and brought to the contest in a cooler or insulated container.
- 6. Judges will consider:
 - a. appearance of the product, including uniform color, even shape, and pleasant eye appeal
 - b. flavor: featured ingredient should be dominant
 - c. internal texture characteristic of the product type.
- 7. Any baked products with cream cheese, sour cream, or whipped cream in an unbaked filling, frosting, or glaze must be refrigerated following preparation and brought to the contest in a cooler/insulated container. Products may not use unpasteurized dairy products or uncooked eggs or egg whites (eggs that are pasteurized or brought to a temperature of 1600 may be used.)
- 8. All entries may be exhibited on a disposable plate or cardboard. A regular baking pan or serving dish may be used. However, the return of the container is not the responsibility of the Hancock County Extension Homemakers. Containers should be taken at the close of the contest session or their return cannot be guaranteed.
- 9. All entries will be released at the close of judging.

- 10. Blue, red or white placing will be awarded according to the quality of the entry. No prize money will be given for these placing ribbons.
- 11. Prize money will be awarded as follows: each category champion will receive \$25 and qualify for the Grand Champion award. The Grand Champion Award is \$50. The Grand champion will present their new baked entry winner to the Mayor at the Mayor's Breakfast on October 7, 2023.
- 12. Entries will be accepted on Saturday, September 30, 2023 from 9:00 am to 10:00 am at the Hancock County Extension Office, 972 E. Park Avenue, Greenfield, Indiana. You may stay for the open judging.
- 13. Open judging will begin at 10:15 am. Placings will be announced as the classes are judged.

The Baker's Best Contest will be held on September 30, 2023, the Saturday BEFORE Riley Festival, in the Hancock County Extension Office Meeting Room. (same location as usual, but new address, North West corner of Apple and Park Avenue) Photos of the bakers and their products will be exhibited in the Home Arts Display in the Courthouse Annex during Riley Festival.
