What's a 4-11 Club?

A 4-H Club provides positive youth development opportunities for young people to experience belonging, mastery, independence, and generosity. Clubs meet a minimum of 6 times per year. Below are the different types of clubs 4-H offers:

Community Clubs- Members are typically from the same area, who come together to learn new things, work on projects they're interested in, and help their community.

Project Clubs- These clubs focus on a specific topic or skill, such as robotics, shooting sports, livestock, etc. They meet regularly to learn more about their projects, work on activities, and master their skills in that area.

SPARK Clubs- These are special interest groups designated to "spark" an interest in different subjects. They include six hours of instructional time which may occur in one day or over a length of time. Examples of past Spark Clubs we've had include Tae-Kwon-Do, Sewing, Hiking, Dance, or Music!

Who Can Join 4-11?

Harrison County 4-H is open to **ALL** youth in grades K - 12 who reside in Harrison County. Youth who live in other counties may join if they have interest in a program not offered in their home county upon the approval of the 4-H Educator.



Many of our 4-11 Clubs are youth-led, with members taking leadership roles in planning, organizing, and running their own meetings and events.



🚜 4-|| Enrollment: PROJECTS!

What are 4-II Projects?

Members have the opportunity to learn more about a subject matter that they choose to study through completing hands-on activities. We refer to these as projects. In order to enroll in a project, members must sign up for them at the time of enrolling in 4-H. Some projects have a manual which guides the youth through the learning process as well as a set of guidelines that help them meet the project requirements. There are project superintendents who are knowledgeable on a particular subject who will often times provide

workshops to allow the youth to learn about that topic in a social environment. Each project has a beginner, intermediate, and advanced level-this allows youth to build on their knowledge each year and continue to challenge their skills. Projects are meant to be worked on over time, providing an educational opportunity for youth outside of the classroom setting. Often times, youth will exhibit and display their project at a local county fair in order to show the community what they have learned.

Enrolling as a RETURNING Youth Member

- 1. Go to 4honline.com, enter your email and password, and click Sign In.
- 2. On the Member List Tab click Enroll Now under 4-H.
- 3. Select the member's Grade and click Next.
- 4. Select Confirm that you would like to enroll the youth as a Club Member.
- 5. Click Select Clubs button.
- 6. Filter by County by searching for Harrison County.
- 7. Click Add next to the Club Name you would like to join. If you're a member of more than one club, be sure the Primary club is marked correctly. If not, click Change to Primary button to mark a different club as your primary club.
- 8. Click Next at the bottom of the screen once you've entered your clubs.
- 9. Click Select Projects and select the Club which you want your project to be associated with.
- 10. Click the Add button next to the project you are wanting to add.
- 11. Repeat these steps for all of the projects this 4-H member is participating in for the program year.
- 12. Click Next once all of the member's projects have been added.
- 13. Click Show Questions and complete the enrollment questions. Some of them will be already filled in for you based on what you've entered when you initially enrolled.
- 14. Complete the Health Form fields and Consents, then click Next when you're done.
- 15. Review the fees for the member. NOTE: Harrison County 4-H Council will be covering all 4-H State Program Fees for ALL Harrison County 4-H members! DO NOT put in credit card information. Instead, choose "Pay by Check".
- 16. Review the enrollment information. Once you've verified that the clubs and projects are listed correctly, click Submit.

Enrolling as a NEW Youth Member

- 1.Go to 4honline.com and click on Don't Have an Account if you have never enrolled.
- 2. Select Indiana from the drop down menu, then choose Harrison county.
- 3. Complete your family's information and click on Create Account.
- 4. Enter your family's address information, and click
- 5. If you create a new account and an existing account is found, click the Confirm button and continue to Logging in with an Existing 4HOnline Account.
- 6. Enter the member's information and click Next.
- 7. Complete the About You form with the requested information, then click Next.
- 8. Select your method of participation, and click Finish.
- 9. Click Select Clubs button.
- 10. Filter by County by searching for Harrison County.
- 11. Click Add next to the Club Name you would like to join. If you're a member of more than one club, be sure the Primary club is marked correctly. If not, click Change to Primary button to mark a different club as your primary club.
- 12.4.Click Next at the bottom of the screen once you've entered your clubs.
- 13. Click Select Projects and select the Club which you want your project to be associated with.
- 14. Click the Add button next to the project you are wanting to add.
- 15. Repeat these steps until all of your projects this 4-H member is participating in for the program year.
- 16. Click Next once all of the member's projects have been added.


Career Development Events

What are CDE Events and the Area Groups?

Indiana 4-H members have the opportunity to participate in Career Development Events (CDEs). CDE's are hands-on contests that help youth build skills in agriculture, science, communication, and decision-making. These events include livestock, dairy, horse, poultry, soils, forestry, meats, crops, wildlife, and more. Through CDEs, youth learn real-world skills like evaluating animals, identifying plants, or making consumer decisions, all while working as part of a team.

Indiana is divided into Area Groups, also known as Extension regions. Each Area Group brings together 4-H members from several counties to hold Area-level contests. Some of these events often serve as qualifiers for the State CDEs hosted by Purdue University and partners. From there, top teams may even advance to national competitions.

Participating in a CDE is more than just a contest- it's an opportunity to grow leadership, practice problem-solving, and connect with other youth who share similar interests. Whether you're interested in animals, plants, or natural resources, there's a CDE for you!



CDE Event Registrations-Important Update!

There is an important update regarding registration for Career Development Events (CDEs). If your child is participating in any 4–H CDE, either as an individual or on a team, they must register through 4–H Online under the Harrison County CDE Team event. This single event will cover all CDEs your child participates in, including practices. You can find it at

https://harrisoncde.4honline.com or under the "Events" tab in your family's 4-H Online profile. You will still need to register separately for individual area or state competitions, but the Harrison County CDE Team event will track all members representing the county. For example, if a member participates in both Forestry CDE and Livestock Skillathon practices, they should select both events when registering under the Harrison County CDE Team. Then, if they compete at an area event, they will register for that specific competition separately.

Lastly, if you are planning to compete individually or as a team at a CDE event outside of the county, I must know in advanced as I must report outside county activity to Purdue's youth protection database. Senior Year Scholarship

Available to 4-H members in their senior year of high school

Club Scholarship

Available to 4-H members entering Purdue University majoring in the College of Agriculture or select majors in the College of Health and Human Sciences

Purdue Horticulture & Landscape Architecture Scholarship

Available to a 4-H member majoring in horticulture or landscape architecture at Purdue University and studied plant science in 4-H.

Accomplishment Scholarship

Available to 4-H members in grades 10-12 of high school and the year immediately following high school graduation. The purpose of the 4-H Accomplishment Scholarship is to recognize youth who have excelled in life skills development through their 4-H activities and involvement.

Categories: Animal Science—Meat and Milk Production; Animal Science—Companion and Small Animal Production; Citizenship; Communications; Engineering and Technological Science; Healthy Living, Food and Nutrition Science; Leadership Development; and Plant and Environmental Science. Three additional categories are reserved for applicants demonstrating life skills development in more than one of the previously listed categories. Those are Premier Achievement, Premier Citizenship, and Premier Leadership.

Eligibility: Applicants must be in grade 10, 11, 12, or their first year immediately following 4-H enrollment eligibility at the time applications are due. While an applicant does not have to be a current 4-H member, they must demonstrate multiple years of involvement in Indiana's 4-H Youth Development Program.

Youth who have previously been awarded a \$1,000 accomplishment scholarship are only eligible to compete in the Premier Achievement, Premier Citizenship, and Premier Leadership categories. Youth who have previously been awarded a \$2,000 scholarship are no longer eligible to compete in any category.

Awards: A minimum of thirty \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded to youth based on their demonstration of life skills development in these eight categories: Animal Science—Meat and Milk Production; Animal Science—Companion and Small Animal Production; Citizenship; Communications; Engineering and Technological Science; Healthy Living, Food, and Nutrition Science; Leadership Development; and Plant and Environmental Science.

A minimum of one \$2,000 scholarship will be awarded in each of these categories: Premier Achievement; Premier Citizenship; and Premier Leadership.
