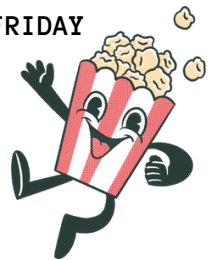

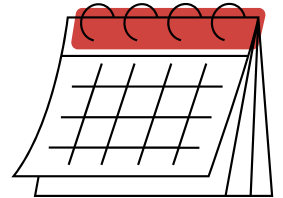

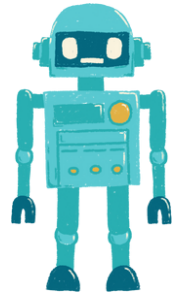

VOLUNTEER ENROLLMENT



4 Steps of the 4-H Volunteer Process



1. Fill out an Application

Grab your application at the Extension Office or

https://extension.purdue.edu/county/harrison/4-H_HomePage.html.

You will submit an application and information for three references. Once paperwork is turned in, we can complete a limited background check.



2. Create 4-H Online Account

Once you have completed the application, you will create a profile on www.V2.4honline.com

*Use 4-H Online to recommit as a volunteer annually.



3. Complete Youth Training

Once your 4-H Online profile is created, you will then complete the training videos and quizzes located in the training section.

*Must renew trainings annually.



4. Meet with Extension Educator

After you have submitted your application to the Extension Office, call the Extension Office (812-738-4236) to schedule an interview with a Purdue educator where you will discuss Adult Behavioral Expectations of volunteers.

PROCESS COMPLETE!



Congratulations! You have completed all of the required steps needed to become an approved 4-H Volunteer. Your dedication to become a volunteer is greatly appreciated.

Your first task is to connect with a volunteer opportunity whether that be as a committee member, general volunteer, a SPARK club volunteer, or a 4-H Council Member. Your overall goal is to improve and support the lives in Harrison County youth to **"Make the Best Better"**.

4-H ENROLLMENT



4 Steps of the 4-H Enrollment Process



1. Create 4-H Online Account

First step is to create a profile on www.V2.4honline.com

*Returning members will log-in and use 4-H Online to enroll annually.



2. Start attending 4-H Meetings & Join a Club

In 4-H Online, to enroll, you get to choose a 4-H Club. You can now start attending club meetings! You can contact any club leader to find out meeting dates, times, and locations! You can also join more than one club.



3. Get involved/Explore Your Project Interest Areas

There are many ways to be involved in 4-H. From attending club meetings, going to project workshops, becoming a Junior Leader and attending Career Development Events, the possibilities are endless. This will help you determine which projects to exhibit at the 4-H Fair. Keep a look out for opportunities to get involved in 4-H!



4. Enter your projects on FairEntry and Exhibit at 4-H Fair

Use the knowledge and skills that you've gained in 4-H to make your culminating projects for the Harrison County 4-H Fair. You will enter your projects into FairEntry online following guidelines in the handbook and project manuals.

4-H ENROLLMENT

What is Mini 4-H?

Mini 4-H is a noncompetitive 4-H program for youth in grades K-2.

Mini 4-H is designed to introduce you and your child to the 4-H program and is an excellent way for children to learn by doing and to exhibit projects at the fair. Mini 4-H members also have the opportunity to attend club meetings, workshops, and a summer day camp just for Mini 4-H'ers.

The noncompetitive learning environment for Mini 4-H includes:

1. Planned learning activities in which children are invited to be active and explore materials and ideas without the pressure of completing a specific product or exhibit.
2. Low adult/leader to child ratio that allows time for adults/leaders to provide individual positive encouragement and assistance.
3. Simple, interesting activities that are fun.
4. Encouragement of children to participate in a group activity by sharing and or displaying their activity projects.
5. Rewards are identical ribbons of the same color for everyone.

There is no limit to the number of projects youth can sign up for, however, try not to overwhelm a child with too many projects.

BICYCLE: Learn bicycle safety, all about road signs and the parts of your bicycle.



CRAFTS: Do you like to paint, draw, play with clay and use your hands to create crafty things? This is the project for you!



COLLECTIONS: Learn about collecting. Tell us what you like to collect and why. Bring your collection to the Fair!



CREATIVE WRITING: Do you like to tell stories about your adventures? Learn how to add more excitement to your stories!



CUPCAKE: Make frosting and create pretty little cake creations that look good enough to eat!



DINOSAURS: Do you know how big a dinosaur was? How about what they ate? Learn about your favorite dinosaur by taking this project.



ENTOMOLOGY: Learn about ants, butterflies, bees and other creepy crawlies.



FARM ANIMALS: Cows, pigs, horses, chickens; all your favorite farm animals are featured in this project!



FOODS: Make your own trail mix, cook no-bake cookies and bake with biscuits! Learn how to make great treats your family will love.



FORESTRY: Learn about different trees and what makes them special.



GARDENING: Growing a vegetable garden does not have to be boring. You can plant hot and spicy peppers or cool cucumbers! Grow something you've never eaten before.



GENEALOGY: Learn about your family through old stories, pictures, and records. Become an Ancestor Detector!



HORSE & PONY: What kind of horse do you have? Learn about different breeds of horses, some safety rules and to care for your horse.



HORSELESS HORSE & PONY: For horse lovers who don't have horses. You too can learn about caring for horses, horse breeds and other fun facts.



MODELS: Models are small versions of the things around us. Use snap together parts, Legos, toothpicks or many other things to build miniature cars, buildings, bridges or anything you can think of.



MY PET & ME: Have fun with Fido, Fifi, or whatever you named your pet. Watch and learn what your pet can do.



PHOTOGRAPHY: Learn the Do's and Don'ts of taking pictures and how to get that perfect shot. Learn about close-ups, landscapes, portraits, and more!



PLANTS & FLOWERS: Learn about what plants and flowers need to grow both outside and in the house. Help make our planet pretty!



SEWING: Want to learn how to sew? Take the first steps with this project!



SPACE: Be an Astronaut in training! Learn about the Sun, Stars and Space flight.



TREES: Trees come in many shapes and sizes, just like people. Learn how trees grow, how old a tree is and how to tell the name of a tree just from its leaves.



WHALES & DOLPHINS: How do whales & dolphins breath? What is sonar? What is the biggest whale? You'll learn all this and more with this project.



WILDLIFE: Observe birds, chipmunks, squirrels and the other creatures that live in the woods.



WOODCRAFT: Have you been wanting to build with wood. Projects in this manual include popsicle stick art, building bookends and finally making a place to keep your tools.

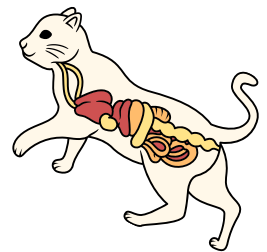


What's Inside My Cat?

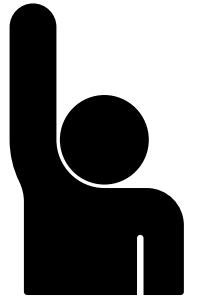

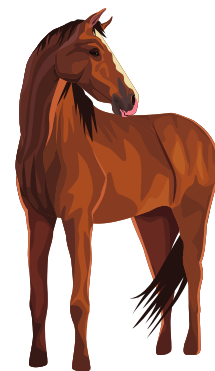
Area Horse Camp for Beginners

SUCCESSFUL EVENTS & PROGRAMS

Electric Camp

Eighteen area youth in grades 3-5 discovered the science of electricity by participating in the first Harrison County 4-H Electric Camp on November 7th, 2023 at the Windell Ag Building. The day was filled with hands-on projects in which they learned about careers, circuits, and the difference between AC and DC.

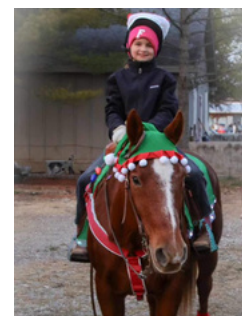
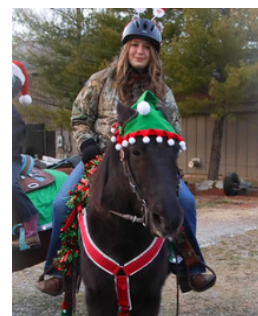

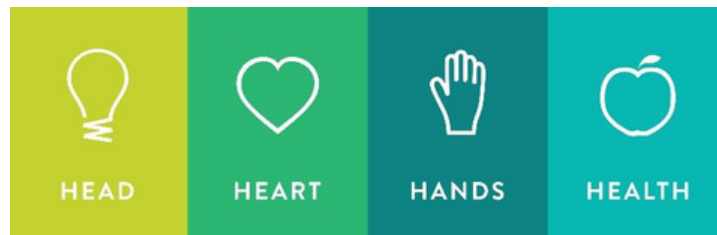
